#### P R O C L A M A T I O N

By His Honor James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

**W**HEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Municipal Corporations Act 1867," it is enacted that it should be lawful for the Superintendent of any Province, by proclamation published in the "Government Gazette" of such Province to declare that any complete parts of the several parts of the said Act, numbered from two to twenty-two inclusive, as he should consider applicable, should extend and be applied to any city, town, or place in such Province, incorporated at the time of the passing of the said Act, under any Act or Ordinance of the Legislature of such Province, and in such Proclamation to fix a time at which such parts or any of them should extend to any such city, town, or place: And whereas the said Act has been amended by "The Municipal Corporations Acts Amendment Act 1871," and made to extend to places incorporated under "The Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance 1865" after the passing of the said Act: And whereas it is expedient that the several parts of the said first-mentioned Act, which are hereinafter mentioned and enumerated, should be extended and applied to the town of Invercargill in the Province of Otago, or town or place incorporated after the passing of the said Act.

Now therefore I, James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province, and in exercise and pursuance of the power vested in me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that from and after the eighth day of February next, the complete parts of the several parts of "The Municipal Corporations Act 1867," numbered respectively—

Part XIII.—Government of Boroughs and Bye-laws ;  
 Part XVIII.—Sewerage, &c. ;  
 Part XIX.—Lighting ;  
 Part XX.—Water Supply ;  
 Part XXI.—Markets ;  
 Part XXII.—Miscellaneous ;  
 shall extend and be applied to the said town of Invercargill.

BYE-LAWS OF THE "OTAGO DOCK BOARD."

WHEREAS by the Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, passed in the twenty-first Session of the said Council, number 222, the short title whereof is the "Otago Dock Trust Ordinance, 1865," it was enacted amongst other things that it should be lawful for the Otago Dock Board thereby constituted, and they were hereby authorised and empowered to make all such Bye-Laws as might appear to the Board to be necessary for fully carrying out the purposes of the said Ordinance, and that the Board might in such Bye-Laws fix and determine the amount of dues to be charged on all vessels making use of the Dock thereby authorised to be constructed: And whereas it is expedient to make provision by Bye-Laws for regulating the use of the Otago Graving Dock at Port Chalmers, and to fix and determine the amount of dues to be charged on all vessels making use of the said Dock: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the Otago Dock Board by virtue of the authority in them vested in that behalf as follows:—

1. All vessels using the Otago Graving Dock will be liable to Dock dues according to the following scale—

2. Double dues will be charged for the day of docking.

3. The Dock dues will include and cover the cost of pumping, shoring, wedges and blocking, and the cost of all labor connected with opening and closing the Dock, and all incidental labor connected with the actual operation of docking a vessel.

4. The Board will not undertake the repairs of a vessel; and all parties availing themselves of the use of the Dock, will be required to make their own arrangements for this service, and provide all the necessary labor and material for the same.

5. The Board will not hold themselves responsible for any accident occurring to a vessel, while docking, undocking, or in dock.

6. The officers, crews, and workmen of any vessel, whilst in Dock, will be required strictly to adhere to the regulations of the establishment.

7. The Captain, Master or Pilot of a vessel, after making fast to any buoy or bollard off the mouth of the Dock, for the purpose of entering, will thenceforth be required to attend to the directions of the officer of the Dockyard, superintending the docking or undocking of the vessel.

8. Applications for the use of the Dock or machinery will be registered in order of their receipt, but the Board reserves to itself the right to determine the order of priority in special cases, such as men of war, or war steamers.

9. Vessels registered, and not arriving at the Dock at the appointed time to enter, will be liable to the forfeiting of their turn on the register, and will also be held responsible for any expenditure that may have been incurred with a view to docking them.

10. Vessels will be admitted into the Dock on the

application of the owner or master, who will be held responsible for the payment of all dues and charges.

11. No vessel will be permitted to enter the Dock with gunpowder or combustible matter on board.

PROVINCIAL SCHOLARSHIPS.—The following Regulations of the Education Board respecting Provincial Scholarships are published for general information. Schoolmasters are requested to forward to me, before the 26th February, 1872, a list containing the names and ages of intending competitors belonging to their several schools.

#### REGULATIONS.

1. Three Scholarships, in connection with the High School, shall be open for competition on the 27th of February, 1872, to boys who shall have been in attendance at the public schools of Otago during the year 1871. Two of the said Scholarships shall be bestowed on boys from the District Schools, and one on a boy who has attended the High School. Competitors must be under fourteen years of age at the date of the competition.

2. The holders for the time being of the said Scholarships shall be called "Provincial Scholars," and shall be entitled to the privileges and advantages hereinafter specified. A Scholarship shall be tenable as long as the holder of it remains a pupil of the High School, but not longer than five years.

3. The said Scholarships respectively shall be awarded to such candidates as shall have shown the greatest proficiency at a Competitive Examination, to be held at the High School on the day above specified; and such Competitive Examination shall be by written papers, and shall embrace the following subjects:—

- I. *Arithmetic and Algebra*, as far as Simple Equations, inclusive.
- II. *English Grammar*, including the Analysis of Sentences.
- III. *Geography*.—The definitions; New Zealand and North America; the drawing from memory of an outline map of a Country to be named by the Examiners.
- IV. *British History*.—The Four Georges.
- V. *Dictation*.
- VI. A simple Narrative, selected by the Examiners, to be read aloud to the Competitors and reproduced by them.
- VII. An Original Description or Account of some familiar object or operation, the subject to be selected by the Examiners.
- VIII. *Penmanship*, as shown by the Competitors' Papers on the subjects before mentioned. Preference will be given to a plain round hand.
- IX. Marks will be given for the reading of Prose and Poetry, and for Recitation.
- X. *For High School Competitors*.—French, Latin, Euclid—Book 1, and Algebra.

4. It shall not be necessary to award a Scholarship to the best, or any other candidate, unless he shall have gained, in the aggregate, at least 75 per cent. of the

maximum number of marks attainable; and the Board shall be at liberty to suspend or terminate any Scholarship on account of wilful misconduct or neglect of studies on the part of the holder.

5. Each holder of a Provincial Scholarship, in addition to a free education at the High School, shall receive free board and lodging, or a payment of £30 per annum in lieu thereof.

6. Free education, for terms not less than two years, nor more than five years, may, at the discretion of the Board, be granted to the unsuccessful Competitors for Scholarships who shall have gained a satisfactory percentage of the whole number of marks attainable.

7. Competitors residing in Dunedin and suburbs, entitled to free education under the preceding regulation, must attend the High School. Competitors residing beyond reach of Dunedin may attend the nearest Grammar School, or approved Main District School, at their option.

8. Certificates of merit will be granted to those Competitors who, though failing to gain the Scholarships, distinguish themselves greatly.

9. Schoolmasters must forward to the Secretary of the Education Board, before the 26th February, 1872, the names and ages of intending competitors belonging to their several schools.

**REGULATIONS** for the Introduction of Immigrants into New Zealand on the nomination of persons resident in the Colony:—

1. Each applicant will be required to pay, at the time of making the application, the sum of £5 for each adult (except single women) and £2 10s. for each child between the ages of one and twelve years, whom it is desired to have introduced into the Colony. Infants in arms, under one year free. This rate being only for the ship passage from London (or such other port as the ship may sail from) to the Colony, the cost of reaching such port of sailing in Europe and proceeding up the country to their friends after arrival in the Colony, will have to be defrayed by the Emigrants themselves.

2. Free passages will be granted to single women between the ages of 12 and 35, provided they are able to produce proof of good character to the satisfaction of the Agent-General in London.

3. In the event of any emigrants applied for declining to emigrate, whatever money may have been deposited with the Government will be returned to the applicants so soon as the Agent-General in England shall have apprised the Government thereof; but in the event of any emigrants applied for accepting the offer of a passage in a particular ship, and so, by failing to present themselves for embarkation at the time and port appointed by the Agent-General in England for the sailing of such ship, be left behind, the passage money and passages will be forfeited.

4. Applicants in the Colony, when writing to the persons for whose passages they have applied, should distinctly inform them that no part of the passage money paid in the Colony will be returned, if they omit to write to the Agent-General in London, telling him that they decline the passages offered to them.

6. All the ships employed in this service will be under the provisions of the "Passenger Act."

7. Notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary, the Agent-General in London will have power to refuse passages where the intending emigrants are in ill-health, or in any way unfitted, according to his judgment, to undertake the voyage.

8. Forms of Application may be obtained at any Post Office in the Colony, but passage moneys can only be paid at any Money Order Post Office in the Colony.
