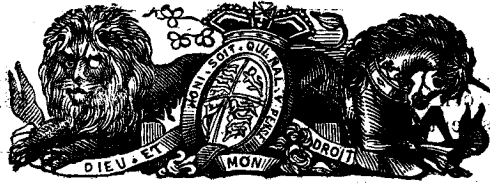

WHEREAS Thomas Dick Esquire then Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to and vested in him in that behalf did by Proclamation in the Government Gazette of the said Province bearing date the twenty-ninth day of January one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven constitute and appoint all the territory therein described to be a Gold Field under the provisions of the "Gold Fields Act 1866" to be called "Otago Gold Field." And whereas the limits of the said Gold Field have from time to time been altered : And whereas by "The Gold Fields Act Amendment Act 1867" it is enacted that within any Province in which by any Act or Ordinance it is provided that the Superintendent shall in the administration of the Government thereof act by and with the advice and consent of an Executive Council it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council under his hand and under the Public Seal of the Colony from time to time as occasion may require to delegate to the Executive Government for the time being of such Province subject or not to any restrictions or limitations as he shall think fit all or any of such powers vested in the Governor or the Governor in Council by the "Gold Fields Act 1866" as under or by virtue of the one hundred and ninth section of the said Act may be delegated by the Governor in Council and in like manner to revoke any such delegation And whereas by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago intitled the "Executive Council Ordinance 1861" it is provided that the Superintendent of the said Province shall in the administration of the government thereof act by and with the advice and consent of an Executive Council And whereas the Governor hath with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand and in pursuance of the power and authority for that purpose vested in him by the "Gold Fields Act 1866" and subject to its provisions delegated unto the Executive Government for the time being of the Province of Otago all such powers vested in the Governor or the Governor in Council by the said last-mentioned Act as under or by virtue of the one hundred and ninth section of the said last-mentioned Act may be delegated by the Governor in Council to have hold and exercise the said powers within the said Province of Otago And whereas by Section XI of the "Gold Fields Act 1866" it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council subject to the provisions of the said Act from time to time to make Regulations for any Gold Field and to alter amend or revoke the same : And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the eleventh day of January one thousand eight hundred and seventy and published in the Provincial Government Gazette of the Province of Otago aforesaid (Number 646) of the fourteenth day of January one thousand eight hundred and seventy certain regulations were made under said Sec. XI of the said Act for the said Otago Gold Field : And whereas it is expedient to revoke Section 22 of Regulation 12 of the said Regulations so made by the

said Order in Council of the said eleventh day of January one thousand eight hundred and seventy :

Now therefore His Honor James Macandrew Superintendent of the Province of Otago by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province and by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to the Executive Government of the said Province of Otago in this behalf doth hereby order that the said Regulation being Section No. 22 of Regulation 12 of the said Regulations so made by the said Order in Council of the said eleventh day of January one thousand eight hundred and seventy shall from and after the day of the date hereof be revoked.

WHEREAS Thomas Dick Esquire then Superintendent of the Province of Otago by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to and vested in him in that behalf did by Proclamation in the Government Gazette of the said Province bearing date the twenty-ninth day of January one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven constitute and appoint all the territory therein described to be a Gold Field, under the provisions of the "Gold Fields Act 1866" to be called the "Otago Gold Field." in Council to have hold and exercise the said powers within the said Province of Otago: And whereas by thirty-ninth section of the "Gold Fields Act 1866" it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time to make regulations prescribing the mode in which applications may be made for leases of land for agricultural purposes the quantity of land not exceeding fifty acres which shall and may be granted in a lease in any particular block the amount of deposit to be paid by any applicant therefor and by any objector thereto the terms and conditions upon which such leases may be held occupied assigned transferred forfeited and cancelled the amount of rent payable therefor and the times and places of payment the conditions upon and the manner in which entry to search for gold or for any metal or mineral upon any land so leased may be authorised and the terms and conditions upon which holders of miners' rights may be permitted to mine upon land the lease for which shall have been determined on account of its auriferous character and such regulations from time to time to amend alter and revoke: And whereas James Macandrew Esquire Superintendent of the Province of Otago by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said Province did by Proclamation dated the eleventh day of January one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight and published in the Otago Provincial Government *Gazette* (No. 646) on the fourteenth day of January one thousand eight hundred and seventy make certain regulations for the purposes specified in the said thirty-ninth section of the said Act: And whereas it is expedient to revoke Regulation No. 23 of the Regulations so made as aforesaid:

Now therefore His Honor James Macandrew Superintendent of the Province of Otago by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province and by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to the Executive Government of the said Province in this behalf by His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand in Council under the authority of the "Gold Fields Act Amendment Act 1867" and of any and every other power in anywise enabling him in this behalf doth hereby order that the said Regulation No. 23 of the said Regulations of the said eleventh day of January one thousand eight hundred and seventy shall from and after the day of the date hereof be revoked.

WHEREAS Thomas Dick Esquire then Superintendent of the Province of Otago by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to and vested in him in that behalf did by proclamation in the Government *Gazette* of the said Province bearing date the 29th day of January 1867 constitute and appoint all the territory therein described to be a Gold Field under the provisions of the "Gold Fields Act 1866" to be called the "Otago Gold Field:"

And whereas the limits of the said Gold Field so proclaimed as aforesaid have from time to time been altered: And whereas by the forty-second section of the "Gold Fields Act 1866" it is provided that the Governor may by proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette* or in the *Gazette* of the Province in which any Gold Field is situate proclaim and declare the exceptions to be made from leases and licenses granted under the said Act and also the covenants clauses provisos conditions and agreements applicable to such leases and licenses respectively as he may in like manner from time to time rescind alter or vary the same: And whereas by the "Gold Fields Act Amendment Act 1867" it is enacted that within any Province in which by any Act or Ordinance it is provided that the Superintendent shall in the administration of the government thereof act by and with the advice and consent of an Executive Council it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council under his hand and under the Public Seal of the Colony from time to time as occasion may require to delegate to the Executive Government for the time being of such Province subject or not to any restrictions or limitations as he shall think fit all or any of such powers vested in the Governor or the Governor in Council by the "Gold Fields Act 1866" as under or by virtue of the one hundred and ninth section of the said Act may be delegated by the Governor in Council and in like manner to revoke any such delegation And whereas by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago intituled the "Executive Council Ordinance 1861" it is provided that the Superintendent of the said Province shall in the administration of the Government thereof act by and with the advice and consent of an Executive Council And whereas the Governor hath with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand and in pursuance of the power and authority for that purpose vested in him by the "Gold Fields Act 1866" and subject to its provisions delegated unto the Executive Government for the time being of the Province of Otago all such powers vested in the Governor or the Governor in Council by the said last-mentioned Act as under or by virtue of the one hundred and ninth section of the said last-mentioned Act may be delegated by the Governor in Council to have hold and exercise the said powers within the said Province of Otago And whereas by an Order in Council dated the eleventh day of January 1870 and published in the Provincial Government *Gazette* of the Province of Otago aforesaid (No. 646) of the fourteenth day of January 1870 the Executive Government of the Province of Otago did proclaim and declare that from and after the date thereof the exceptions thereafter appearing should be made from all Agricultural and Gold Mining Leases granted under the said Act and the covenants clauses provisos conditions and agreements applicable to Agricultural and Gold Mining Leases respectively: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the said Order in Council of the said eleventh day of January 1870 and to make other provisions in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Honor James Macandrew Superintendent of the Province of Otago by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province doth hereby by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to the Executive Government of the said Province in this behalf by His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand in Council under the authority of "The Gold Fields Act Amendment Act 1867" and of any and every other power in anywise enabling the said Executive Government in this behalf hereby revoke the said Order in Council of the said eleventh day of January 1870 and doth hereby proclaim and declare that from and after the day of the date hereof the exceptions next hereinafter appearing shall be made from all Agricul-

Leases granted under the said Act and the covenants clauses provides conditions and agreements next hereinafter appearing shall be applicable to all such leases (that is to say).

(ii.) *Right of Ingress and Egress*

Her Majesty the Queen reserves to the Governor of New Zealand and his delegate and to his and their officers and servants the right of ingress egress and regress to from and across the land hereby demised and the mines thereon or thereunder and of granting to any person or persons or to the public such right of ingress egress and regress and of granting to any holder of a miner's right the privilege of entering on such land for the purpose of cutting water races and tail races and of leading head water or tail water through the same. Provided always that all such operations shall be sanctioned by the Warden and due compensation given to the said lessee or lessees his or their heirs executors administrators and assigns.

(b.) *Rent in arrear to distrain Machinery Tools &c.*

If the rents dues or duties reserved in this lease shall be in arrear and unpaid for the space of twenty-one days next after any of the days hereinbefore fixed for payment thereof it shall and may be lawful for the said lessor or any person duly authorised in that behalf to enter upon the premises hereby demised and to distrain the machinery tools buildings or other property of the said lessee or lessees for the time being in under or upon any part of the premises hereby demised for or in respect of any such rent dues or duties which ought to have been paid to the lessor or any person duly authorised to receive the same.

(c.) *On breach of Covenants Lessor to re-enter and determine Lease.*

Provided lastly and it is hereby declared and agreed by and between the said parties hereto that in case the said lessee or lessees his or their executors administrators or assigns shall fail or neglect to perform and keep all and every of the covenants conditions or provisions and agreements hereinbefore contained and implied by virtue of the "Gold Fields Act 1866" or of any regulations made under the authority of the said Act referring to leases for gold mining within the Province of Otago and which are in force at the time of the execution hereof it shall and may be lawful for the said lessor or any person duly appointed in that behalf forthwith or at any time or times thereafter to enter into and upon the land and premises hereby demised and thereby determine this lease.

And His Honor the said James Macandrew as such Superintendent as aforesaid and by and with the advice and consent aforesaid and by virtue and in exercise of the powers aforesaid doth hereby also proclaim and declare that from and after the day of the date hereof the exceptions next hereinafter appearing shall be made from all Gold Mining Leases granted under the said Act. And the covenants clauses provides conditions and agreements next hereinafter appearing shall be applicable to all such leases (that is to say)

(a.) *Right of Ingress and Egress.*

Her Majesty the Queen reserves to her Government of New Zealand and all officers and servants thereof the right of ingress egress and regress to from and across the land hereby demised and the mines thereon or thereunder and of granting to any person or persons or to the public such right of ingress egress and regress and of granting to any holder of a miners' right

the privilege of enter on such land for the purpose of cutting water races or tail races and of leading head water or tail water through the same. Provided always that all such operations shall be sanctioned by the Warden and due compensation given to the said lessee or lessees his or their heirs executors administrators and assigns.

(b.) *To determine Lease if mining be discontinued for four months.*

And it is hereby declared and agreed by and between the said parties hereto that if the said lessee or lessees his or their executors administrators or assigns shall for four months discontinue the *bona fide* mining on the said land hereby demised to him or them it shall and may be lawful for the said lessor or any person duly appointed by him in that behalf to enter into and upon the land and premises hereby demised and thereby determine the estate of the lessee or lessees therein.

(c.) *Rent in arrear to distrain Machinery Tools &c.*

Provided also that if the rents dues or duties reserved in this lease shall be in arrear and unpaid for the space of twenty-one days next after any of the days hereinbefore fixed for payment thereof it shall and may be lawful for the said lessor or any person duly authorised in that behalf to enter upon the premises hereby demised and to distrain the machinery tools buildings or other property of the said lessee or lessees for the time being in under or upon any part of the premises hereby demised for or in respect of any such rent dues or duties which ought to have been paid to the lessor or any person duly authorised to receive the same.

(d.) *Plan of Section of Mines.*

Provide also that they the said lessee or lessees his or their executors administrators or assigns will and shall at all times during the continuance of this demise if required so to do by the said lessor or any person duly authorised in that behalf prepare and keep a proper plan or section of all the workings and actual condition of the mines and premises hereby demised.

(e.) *Number of Men to be Employed.*

Provided also that he or they the said lessee or lessees his or their executors administrators or assigns will and shall at all times during the continuance of this demise after the first six months employ in or about the mines and premises hereby demised a number of men being in the proportion of not less than one man to every full area of two acres of the lands hereby demised.

(f.) *To furnish Returns, &c.*

Provided also that he or they the said lessee or lessees his or their executors administrators or assigns shall and will at all times during the continuance of this demise furnish true and accurate half-yearly returns in the form of the Schedule marked G in the Gold Mining Leases Regulations of Otago and certify to the same on oath to the Warden or other officer duly authorised in that behalf of the average number of men on or about the mines and premises hereby demised and shall from time to time whenever so required by the Warden surveyor or such other duly authorised officer up to the period when the full sum hereby agreed to be expended in or about the said mines and premises shall have been so expended furnish a true and accurate account certified as aforesaid of the amount at such date expended as aforesaid.

(g.) Not to Work out of Limits.

Provided also that the said lessee or lessees his or their executors administrators or assigns shall not nor will during the continuance of this demise work the said mines out of or beyond the limits and boundaries hereinbefore mentioned.

(h.) On breach of Covenants Lessor to re-enter and determine Lease.

Provided lastly and it is hereby declared and agreed by and between the said parties hereto that in case the said lessee or lessees his or their executors administrators or assigns shall fail or neglect to perform and keep all and every of the covenants conditions or provisions and agreements hereinbefore contained and implied by virtue of the "Gold Fields Act 1866" or of any regulations made under the authority of the said Act or any other Act referring to leases for gold mining within the Province of Otago and which are in force at the time of the execution hereof it shall and may be lawful for the said lessor or any person duly appointed in that behalf forthwith or at any time or times thereafter to enter into and upon the land and premises hereby demised and thereby determine this lease.

PROCLAMATION

Appointing a day for the first Election of a Citizen to be Mayor of the Incorporated Town of Palmerston.

By His Honor James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by the "Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance 1865 Amendment Ordinance 1870," it is amongst other things provided that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent at any time after any Municipality shall have been proclaimed under the provisions of the Ordinance intituled "An Ordinance to amend the Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance 1865," by proclamation in the Government Gazette of the Province of Otago, to appoint a day for the first Election of a Citizen to be Mayor of such Municipality: And whereas the Township of Palmerston has been proclaimed a Municipality under the provisions of the said Ordinance; and it is expedient to appoint a day for the first Election of a Citizen to be Mayor of the said Municipality of Palmerston:

Now therefore I, James Macandrew, Superintendent of the said Province of Otago, do hereby proclaim and declare that I have appointed, and do hereby appoint Saturday, the sixteenth day of March, 1872, as and to be the day for the first Election of a Citizen to be Mayor of the Municipality of Palmerston.

Given under my hand, and issued under the Public Seal of the Province of Otago, at Dunedin, this seventh day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two.

Schoolmasters are requested to forward to me, before the 26th February, 1872, a list containing the names and ages of intending competitors belonging to their several schools.

REGULATIONS.

1. Three Scholarships, in connection with the High School, shall be open for competition on the 27th of February, 1872, to boys who shall have been in attendance at the public schools of Otago during the year 1871. Two of the said Scholarships shall be bestowed on boys from the District Schools, and one on a boy who has attended the High School. Competitors must be under fourteen years of age at the date of the competition.

2. The holders for the time being of the said Scholarships shall be called "Provincial Scholars," and shall be entitled to the privileges and advantages hereinafter specified. A Scholarship shall be tenable as long as the holder of it remains a pupil of the High School, but not longer than five years.

3. The said Scholarships respectively shall be awarded to such candidates as shall have shown the greatest proficiency at a Competitive Examination, to be held at the High School on the day above specified; and such Competitive Examination shall be by written papers, and shall embrace the following subjects:—

- I. *Arithmetic and Algebra*, as far as Simple Equations, inclusive.
- II. *English Grammar*, including the Analysis of Sentences.
- III. *Geography*.—The definitions; New Zealand and North America; the drawing from memory of an outline map of a Country to be named by the Examiners.
- IV. *British History*.—The Four Georges.
- V. *Dictation*.
- VI. A simple Narrative, selected by the Examiners, to be read aloud to the Competitors and reproduced by them.
- VII. An Original Description or Account of some familiar object or operation, the subject to be selected by the Examiners.
- VIII. *Penmanship*, as shown by the Competitors' Papers on the subjects before mentioned. Preference will be given to a plain round hand.
- IX. Marks will be given for the reading of Prose and Poetry, and for Recitation.

X. *For High School Competitors.*—French, Latin, Euclid—Book I, and Algebra.

4. It shall not be necessary to award a Scholarship to the best, or any other candidate, unless he shall have gained, in the aggregate, at least 75 per cent. of the maximum number of marks attainable; and the Board shall be at liberty to suspend or terminate any Scholarship on account of wilful misconduct or neglect of studies on the part of the holder.

5. Each holder of a Provincial Scholarship, in addition to a free education at the High School, shall receive free board and lodging, or a payment of £30 per annum in lieu thereof.

6. Free education, for terms not less than two years, nor more than five years, may, at the discretion of the Board, be granted to the unsuccessful Competitors for Scholarships who shall have gained a satisfactory percentage of the whole number of marks attainable.

7. Competitors residing in Dunedin and suburbs, entitled to free education under the preceding regulation, must attend the High School. Competitors residing beyond reach of Dunedin may attend the nearest Grammar School, or approved Main District School, at their option.

8. Certificates of merit will be granted to those Competitors who, though failing to gain the Scholarships, distinguish themselves greatly.

9. Schoolmasters must forward to the Secretary of the Education Board, before the 26th February, 1872, the names and ages of intending competitors belonging to their several schools.

The fee for each Class is Three Guineas per session.

MATRICULATION.

The Matriculation Examinations for 1872 will be held at Dunedin on the 2nd and 3rd days of May.

The following are the subjects of examination:—

Latin:

Cicero—"De Amicitia."

Greek:

Xenophon's Anabasis, Book I.

English:

Writing from dictation.

French or German:

Translation from French or German into English; translation from English into French or German.

Arithmetic:

The compound rules, especially square and cubic measures; vulgar and decimal fractions, proportion, extraction of the square root.

Algebra:

Meaning of the Algebraical signs, the four elementary rules, simple equations.

Geometry:

Euclid, Book I.

Geography:

The chief physical features and principal towns of Europe, Asia, Africa, North and South America; together with more minute details of the geography of Great Britain and Ireland, Australia and New Zealand.

Candidates will be entitled to matriculate who shall have passed in Latin, English, and Arithmetic; and in any two at least of the other subjects of examination.

DEGREES.

The degree of B.A. will be attainable by (1) attendance upon the prescribed lectures during three sessions, and (2) passing an examination in certain subjects either at the end of the third or at the beginning of the fourth session after matriculation; or at the beginning or end of any subsequent session. There will be no honor examination in connection with the B. A. degree.

The degree of M.A. will be attainable only by those who have already taken the B.A. degree. The ordinary M.A. degree will be attainable by (1) attendance upon the prescribed lectures for at least one session after the taking of the B.A. degree, and (2) by passing a further examination similar in kind to that required of candidates for the degree of B.A., such examination to be held at the end of one year from the B.A. degree, or at the commencement or end of any subsequent session. There will also be an honor examination in connection with the M.A. degree. No one will be admitted to the degree of M.A. with honors, except such as have declared their intention of entering for honors at the time of taking the B.A. degree, or within six months afterwards. Candidates for the degree of M.A. with honors will be allowed to select one or more of the following subjects, and will be examined in such subject or subjects only:—

1. Classics and Philosophy.
2. Pure and applied Mathematics.
3. Natural Science (including Physics).

No candidate will be admitted to the degree of M.A. with honors after the expiration of three academical years from the date of his B.A. degree, nor after the expiration of six years from the date of his matriculation.

Attendance at Lectures.

All candidates for the B.A. and ordinary M.A. degrees will be required to furnish certificates of their attendance at the several courses of lectures prescribed for them. The courses of lectures will be somewhat as under:—

- (a.) For candidates in their B.A. degree in their
- 1st Year—Junior Latin, Junior Greek, Junior Mathematics, Natural Science.
 - 2nd Year—Senior Latin, Greek and English, Senior Mathematics and Natural Philosophy, Natural Science, Psychology, and Logic.
 - 3rd Year—Greek and English, Senior Mathematics and Natural Philosophy, Moral Philosophy, Natural Science and Political Economy.

- (b.) For candidates of the ordinary M.A. degree:—
- Natural Science, Senior Natural Philosophy, Moral Philosophy.

The greater part of the subjects of the lectures will be the same as the subjects of examination for the B.A. and ordinary M.A. degrees.

LABOR MARKET.

NOTICE to Employers of Labor and Persons who wish to obtain Employment.—A Register is kept at each of the Police Stations in the Province, in which employers of labor are requested to enter their names when wanting to engage servants, giving particulars as to the class they wish to employ, the period for which they wish to engage them, and the rate of wages they propose to pay.

The members of the Police force in charge of the Stations have been instructed to afford every possible information on the subject to men wishing to obtain employment, &c.

REGULATIONS for the Introduction of Immigrants into New Zealand on the nomination of persons resident in the Colony:—

1. Each applicant will be required to pay, at the time of making the application, the sum of £5 for each adult (except single women) and £2 10s. for each child between the ages of one and twelve years, whom it is desired to have introduced into the Colony. Infants in arms, under one year free. This rate being only for the ship passage from London (or such other port as the ship may sail from) to the Colony, the cost of reaching such port of sailing in Europe and proceeding up the country to their friends after arrival in the Colony, will have to be defrayed by the Emigrants themselves.

2. Free passages will be granted to single women between the ages of 12 and 35, provided they are able to produce proof of good character to the satisfaction of the Agent-General in London.

3. In the event of any emigrants applied for declining to emigrate, whatever money may have been deposited with the Government will be returned to the applicants so soon as the Agent-General in England shall have apprised the Government thereof; but in the event of any emigrants applied for accepting the offer of a passage in a particular ship, and so, by failing to present themselves for embarkation at the time and port appointed by the Agent-General in England for the sailing of such ship, be left behind, the passage money and passages will be forfeited.

4. Applicants in the Colony, when writing to the persons for whose passages they have applied, should distinctly inform them that no part of the passage money paid in the Colony will be returned, if they omit

to write to the Agent-General in London, telling him that they decline the passages offered to them.

6. All the ships employed in this service will be under the provisions of the "Passenger Act."

7. Notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary, the Agent-General in London will have power to refuse passages where the intending emigrants are in ill-health, or in any way unfitted, according to his judgment, to undertake the voyage.

8. Forms of Application may be obtained at any Post Office in the Colony, but passage moneys can only be paid at any Money Order Post Office in the Colony.

N.B.—The Agent-General writes from London that, before embarkation, every single woman will be required to pay 25s., and every other adult 20s. (and children in proportion), for bedding, blankets, and mess utensils.

WHEREAS by "The Immigration and Public Works Act Amendment Act, 1871," it is amongst other things enacted that the Minister for Public Works may receive applications from the owners or lessees of works for the supply of water on Gold Fields for mining and other purposes, or from other persons interested in such works about to be constructed, for advances of money to aid in the construction, extension, or improvement of such works; and by the said Act it is further enacted that the said Minister may make Regulations prescribing the mode of making and the form of such application, and for proceeding on such application, as in the said Act mentioned: And whereas it is expedient that Regulations should be made for the purposes in the said Act mentioned:

Now therefore, I, the Honorable John Davies Ormond, the Minister for Public Works, in pursuance and exercise of the authority vested in me by the said Act, do hereby make the Regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto, prescribing the mode of making and the form of application for advances of money to aid in the construction of works for the supply of water on Gold Fields, and for proceeding on such application.

Schedule of Regulations prescribing the Mode of Making Applications for Advances of Money to aid in the Construction, Extension, or Improvement of Works for the Supply of Water upon Gold Fields.

1. Persons desirous of obtaining advances of money for the purposes specified, shall make application in writing to the Warden of the District, and such application shall state—

- (1.) The names and description of the applicants, or if they be a Registered or Joint Stock Company, then the registered particulars thereof.
- (2.) The names of the Engineer and Manager of the works.
- (3.) The general description of the water race or races, dams, reservoirs, or other works proposed to be constructed, together with duly attested copies of the certificate or certificates of title to the water or ground; the quantity of water intended to be conveyed or stored; the length of the race or races; size of reservoirs or dams, with plans, sections, and specifications; the maximum rate proposed to be charged for the water; the

nature and extent of the auriferous ground proposed to be supplied with water.

- (4.) The estimated cost of the undertaking, given in detail.
- (5.) The proposed capital to be expended on works for the supply of water.
- (6.) The interests, if any, affected by the diversion or storage of the water to be dealt with.
- (7.) The amount of money proposed to be borrowed.

2. Before making application, the applicant shall pay to the Receiver of Land Revenue of the District, a deposit of 2½ per cent. upon the money proposed to be borrowed, and, on making the application, shall forward therewith a receipt for the same.

3. The advances will be granted in proportion to the amount of money actually expended on the construction of the work, and shall not in any case exceed one-third of the amount so expended. The advances, subject to the approval of the Minister, shall be made on the certificate of the District Engineer, or other duly appointed person, that such work has been executed in accordance with the plans and specifications previously submitted and approved of by him, or by the Engineer-in-Chief or assistant Engineer-in-Chief. Advances will be made monthly, and only during the actual progress or execution of the work, and the final payment will be made on its actual completion.

4. Not more than fifteen thousand pounds (£15,000) will be advanced to any one undertaking.

5. Immediately after any application shall have been finally decided upon, the deposit thereon will be repaid, except so much as may be retained under authority of the Minister for covering the cost of the investigation made under the Act.

6. No loan will be made unless the borrowers shall have complied with all the provisions and requirements of the several Acts relating to the Gold Fields, and of any other law or regulation for the time being in force within the Gold Fields with respect to the proposed works.

7. Every work in respect of which any advance is made, shall be carried out in conformity with the particulars contained in the application, and in strict accordance with plans, sections, and specifications, which shall be approved of by the District Engineer, or Engineer-in-Chief or assistant Engineer-in-Chief; and detailed estimates of the cost of the works, which shall also be approved as above, and which detailed estimates will form the basis of advances as they may be required in all cases where the work is not executed by contract; but, in cases where the work shall be executed by contract, then the schedule prices attached to such contract shall be the basis of such advance. In cases where the work may already have been executed, or partly executed, for which advances have been applied for, the value thereof shall be determined by the District Engineer, who shall give a certificate as to his estimated value of such work; and the District Engineer shall have access at all times to the works; and if the Minister shall be satisfied at any time that the provisions of this regulation are not complied with, he may cause notice to be given to the borrowers, or their Engineer or Manager, requiring them to conform to such particulars and specifications; and if they shall refuse or neglect for one calendar month after such notice to comply therewith, then the Minister may cause the assent to the application for a loan in respect of such enterprise to be cancelled, and any moneys advanced under the same to be recovered under the security to be granted: Provided that the Minister may, if he think fit, agree during the progress of any works to such modifications as he may approve.

8. The promoters of any undertaking may at any time remove the same from the operation of these Regulations, by writing under their hands, or under the hands of their registered manager, addressed to the

Minister, and on payment of the moneys that may have been advanced by the Government, with interest to date.

9. A full and correct account of the cost of construction of any undertaking to which the benefits of the Act are extended shall be kept at the office of the promoters, and shall be open at all reasonable hours to the inspection of any person deputed by the Minister, and a statement of all payments on such accounts shall be forwarded at such periods and intervals as the promoters and the Minister may agree upon. A final account, showing the cost of the works, shall on their completion be forwarded through the District Engineer to the Minister, and the final balance shall be paid on this account in the proportion above stated. Always provided that the proposed manner of carrying out the work, either by contract or otherwise, shall have been previously approved of by the Minister.

10. The promoters of any undertaking to which money may be advanced, shall, before the issue of any loan to them, give to the Minister a valid security, including a lien or mortgage to cover the amount of loan over the works and property proposed to be constructed; and all deeds necessary shall be prepared and completed at the expense of the promoters.

11. No money shall be paid towards the construction of any water race, dam, or reservoir until the promoters of the same shall have duly registered themselves under the Mining Companies Limited Liability Act or the Joint Stock Companies Act.

12. The rate of interest to be paid by the promoters of any undertaking coming under these Regulations shall be seven pounds per centum per annum, payable quarterly from the date of the advance.

13. The capital sum borrowed shall be repaid out of the profits of the undertaking in the same proportion as the amount of money advanced by the Government bears to the paid-up capital of the Company, or in such other proportion as the Minister may determine.

14. In the foregoing, the term "Minister" shall mean the Minister for Public Works or the Minister acting for him for the time being; and the terms "Engineer-in-Chief," "Assistant Engineer-in-Chief," and "District Engineer," shall mean the officers appointed under those designations by the said Minister.
