## PROCLAMATION.

*Extending parts of "The Municipal Corporations Act 1867," to the Municipality of Port Chalmers.*

By His Honor James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled the Municipal Corporations Act 1867, it is enacted that in shall be lawful for the Superintendent of any Province, by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette of such Province to declare that any complete parts of the several parts of the said Act, numbered from two to twenty-two inclusive, as he should consider applicable should extend and be applied to any city, town or place in such Province, incorporated at the time of the passing of the said Act, under any Act or Ordinance of the Legislature of such Province, and in such proclamation to fix a time at which such parts or any of them should extend to any such city, town or place: And whereas it is expedient that the several parts of the said first-mentioned Act which are hereinafter mentioned and enumerated, should be extended and applied to the town of Port Chalmers, in the Province of Otago, a town or place incorporated before the passing of the said Act.

Now therefore I, James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province, and in exercise and pursuance of the power vested in me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that from and after the twelfth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, the complete parts of the several parts of "The Municipal Corporations Act 1867," numbered respectively,

PART XIII,

intituled "Government of Boroughs and Bye-laws";

PART XVI.

intituled "Loans and special rates";

PART XX.

intituled "Water Supply";

PART XXI.

intituled "Markets";

and

PART XXII.

intituled "Miscellaneous"

shall extend and be applied to the said town of Port Chalmers.

## OTAGO ROADS ORDINANCE, 1871.

*Alteration of Polling Places.*

WHEREAS by notice and appointment dated the eighteenth day of June, 1872, published in the Otago Provincial Gazette, the polling places for the respective districts and subdivisions of district therein mentioned, under and by virtue of the "Otago Roads Ordinance, 1871," were duly fixed and appointed until the same shall be altered or varied: And whereas it is expedient that the polling places in the districts and subdivisions of districts after-mentioned should be altered:

Now therefore I, James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, do hereby revoke the



And whereas the said Governor hath by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, delegated to James Macandrew, Esq., the Superintendent of the Province of Otago, within the said Province, so long as he shall remain Superintendent of the Province, the several powers vested in the Governor or the Governor in Council by the second, fourth, fifth, seventh, ninth and tenth sections of "The Diseased Cattle Act 1861" aforesaid, and all the powers which by the fifth section of "The Diseased Cattle Act Amendment Act 1865," the Governor in Council is authorised so to delegate:

Now therefore I, James Macandrew, by virtue of such powers in me vested, do hereby proclaim and declare that, after the date of the publication hereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*, the Colonies of Victoria, New South Wales, and South Australia, Queensland, Western Australia, and Tasmania, and all the other Provinces in the Colony of New Zealand, the county of Westland in the said Colony, and the Chatham Islands, shall be deemed Infected Districts within the meaning of the said Acts; and I do further proclaim and declare the following Regulations for the destruction of Diseased Cattle, and for the preventing and regulating the removal or transportation of cattle from the said several Infected Districts into the Province of Otago:—

I.—If any person shall import, drive, or remove, or cause to be imported, driven, or removed, or assist in driving or removing any cattle from any of the said infected districts into the Province of Otago, except into a Quarantine Ground, and after having obtained a Quarantine certificate from an Inspector of Cattle, such person shall be liable to a penalty of fifty pounds for every head of cattle so imported, driven, or removed.

II.—It shall be lawful for any Inspector of Cattle or Police Constable to destroy or cause to be destroyed any diseased cattle which shall pass into this Province from any of the said districts contrary to these Regulations.

III.—If any person shall wilfully impede or obstruct any Inspector or any Police Constable acting under the authority of these Regulations, every person so offending shall be liable to a penalty of fifty pounds.

IV.—These Regulations shall take effect from and after the day following the date of publication in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

#### BONUS FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A WOOL-PACK AND SACK MANUFACTORY IN OTAGO.

THE Provincial Government being desirous of encouraging the manufacture of Wool-packs and Sacks, is prepared to receive offers from parties willing to embark in the enterprise, and is further prepared to pay a bonus of £1000 as under:—

On the erection of buildings and machinery to the value of at least £2000—£500.

On the production of Sacks or Wool packs to a value of not less than £500—£250.

On the production of a further quantity of Sacks or Wool-packs to the value of not less than £1000—£250.

The cloth in each case to be produced by machinery permanently established in the Province, and to be

manufactured either wholly or to a large extent from Phormium Tenax, or other indigenous plants, or from other material grown in the Province.

Offers will be received at the Provincial Government Offices, Dunedin, until the 10th of October, 1872, and should state the estimated cost and productive power of the machinery proposed to be erected, the date on which the same will be in operation, and that the parties are prepared to be bound in the sum of £1000 to produce sacks and woolpacks to the value of £1500 within three years from the date on which their offer is accepted.

#### BONUS FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A GLASS BOTTLE MANUFACTORY.

THE Provincial Government being desirous of encouraging the manufacture of Glass Bottles in Otago, is prepared to receive offers from parties willing to embark in the enterprise, and is further prepared to pay a bonus of £300, as under:—

On the erection of building and plant, of a value of not less than £500—£100.

On production of 100 gross of bottles—£100.

On production of a further quantity of 200 gross—£100.

On production of 20 tons of paper, of a value not less than £500—£375.

On production of a further quantity of 30 tons, of a value of not less than £750—£375.

The paper to be produced by machinery permanently established and working in the Province.

BY-LAWS.

1. That no cattle of any description shall be depastured on the Mabel Hundred without a license.
2. That no sheep shall be depastured on any lands within the Hundred under the jurisdiction of the Wardens.
3. No entire horse over 12 months old, and no bull over 6 months old, shall be depastured without special permission of the Wardens.
4. Any person disturbing or distressing cattle on the Crown Lands within the Hundred will be liable to a penalty of Five Pounds sterling.
5. That no person shall be allowed to depasture on the Hundred more than one head of cattle for every five acres of land in his occupation, and that all cattle depastured must be branded with the registered brand of the license holder.
6. All stray cattle or sheep may be impounded, and the Wardens will not be responsible for any mistakes which may arise from cattle not bearing brands according to the Cattle Branding Ordinance.
7. All license holders shall on or before the 1st day of July, 1872, give in a written statement to the nearest Warden of the number of cattle and horses depastured by them on the said Hundred.

The above By-laws, passed by the Wardens of Mabel Hundred, were sanctioned by the Waste Land Board, Invercargill, on the 25th day of June, 1872.

# CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF DUNEDIN.

## BYE-LAW No. X.

A Bye-law of the Council of the City of Dunedin, made under Section 186 of the "Municipal Corporations Act 1867."

A Bye-law to prevent obstruction to traffic within the City of Dunedin.

In pursuance of the powers and provisions contained in Section 186 of Part XIII of the "Municipal Corporations Act 1867," the Council of the City of Dunedin ordain as follows: That is to say:—

Any person guilty of the following offence within the said City shall, on being convicted of such offence, be liable to pay any penalty not exceeding (£5) Five Pounds.

"Any Owner or Driver of any Coach or other Conveyance used for the carriage of passengers by hire within the City—whether such Conveyance be used only within the 'prescribed space' as defined in Section 1, Subdivision 1, Part X, Schedule XIII of the 'Municipal Corporations Act 1867,' or whether such Conveyance be used to convey passengers from the City of Dunedin to any place outside the 'prescribed space,' as so defined—who shall allow such conveyance to remain stationary upon any street line or public place within the said City, other than at the proper Coach or Hackney Carriage Stand for such conveyance appointed in that behalf by the said Council, in order to take up passengers, or for any other purpose, without especial permission in writing from the Council of the City of Dunedin so to do.

"Provided that after any such Coach or other Conveyance shall have commenced a journey, it shall be lawful for the Driver thereof to stop the same for reasonable time, whenever it shall be necessary to take up or set down any passenger at any place except any such Coach or Hackney Carriage Stand as the said Council shall have appointed for other Coaches or Conveyances."

The foregoing Bye-law was made and passed by the Council of the City of Dunedin on the 8th day of May, 1872.
