The following extracts from the "Otago Roads Ordinance 1871" respecting nominations of candidates are published for general information:—

"Section 98. \* \* \* every candidate shall be proposed by an elector duly qualified to vote at the election and seconded by another elector so qualified and if there be no more candidates proposed and seconded than the number of members then to be elected the returning officer shall declare such candidates to be duly elected.

"Section 99. In the event of there being more candidates proposed and seconded than the number to be elected the returning officer shall call for a show of hands separately in favor of each candidate and after such show shall declare the persons in whose favor the show of hands shall appear to have been and if thereupon a poll be not demanded by one of the candidates or by not less than two electors the returning officer shall declare such persons to be duly elected."

**BONUS FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A WOOL-PACK AND SACK MANUFACTORY IN OTAGO.**

THE Provincial Government being desirous of encouraging the manufacture of Wool-packs and Sacks, is prepared to receive offers from parties willing to embark in the enterprise, and is further prepared to pay a bonus of £1000 as under:—

- On the erection of buildings and machinery to the value of at least £2000—£500.
- On the production of Sacks or Wool packs to a value of not less than £500—£250.
- On the production of a further quantity of Sacks or Wool-packs to the value of not less than £1000—£250.

The cloth in each case to be produced by machinery permanently established in the Province, and to be manufactured either wholly or to a large extent from Phormium Tenax, or other indigenous plants, or from other material grown in the Province.

#### Wakari Educational District

comprises all that area in the Province of Otago, bounded towards the north by the northern boundary of Block V, Dunedin and East Taieri Survey District; towards the east by the Water of Leith; towards the south-east by Section 7, Block VIII, Sections 1 and 14, Block II, Sections 13 and 14, Block III, and Sections 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, and 17, Block IV, all in the Upper Kaikorai Survey District; towards the south by the Kaikorai Stream, by Section 159 Wakari Survey District, and by a road line intersecting land under Application 1316, and forming the northern boundary of Section 26 and 27, Block VI, Dunedin and East Taieri District; towards the south-west by Section 7, Block VIII, sections 1, 2, and 3, Block II, and Section 17, Block IV, all in the Upper Kaikorai Survey District aforesaid; towards the north-west by a road line forming the north-western boundary of Sections 28 and 29, Block VI, Dunedin and East Taieri Survey District and its continuation to the Quarry Reserve; and thence towards the north and west by Block IV, Dunedin and East Taieri Survey District.
