## PROCLAMATION

*Of His Excellency the Governor having assented to an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago.*

By His Honor William Alexander Tolmie, Esq., Deputy-Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

**W**HEREAS in the Thirtieth Session of the Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, the Bill hereinafter mentioned was passed by the said Council— (that is to say) :

A Bill shortly intituled "Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance Amendment Ordinance."

And whereas the said Bill was presented to the Superintendent of the Province of Otago for the assent of His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand thereto, and the said Superintendent did upon the said Bill being so presented to him as aforesaid, declare that he reserved the same for the signification of the Governor's pleasure thereon : And whereas the said Bill has since been laid before His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand, and he has been pleased to assent to the same.

Now therefore I, William Alexander Tolmie, Deputy-Superintendent of the Province of Otago, do hereby proclaim and declare that the said Bill before-mentioned, that is to say—the "Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance Amendment Ordinance 1872," has been laid before His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand, and that His Excellency has assented to the same.

Given under my hand, and issued under the public seal of the Province of Otago, at Dunedin, in the said Province, this twenty-sixth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two.

BONUS FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A WOOL-PACK AND SACK MANUFACTORY IN OTAGO.

THE Provincial Government being desirous of encouraging the manufacture of Wool-packs and Sacks, is prepared to receive offers from parties willing to embark in the enterprise, and is further prepared to pay a bonus of £1000 as under:—

On the erection of buildings and machinery to the value of at least £2000—£500.

On the production of Sacks or Wool packs to a value of not less than £500—£250.

On the production of a further quantity of Sacks or Wool-packs to the value of not less than £1000—£250.

The cloth in each case to be produced by machinery permanently established in the Province, and to be manufactured either wholly or to a large extent from Phormium Tenax, or other indigenous plants, or from other material grown in the Province.

**BY-LAWS OF JACOB'S RIVER HUNDRED.**

1. That no cattle of any description be depastured on the Jacob's River Hundred without a license.

2. That no sheep shall be depastured on any lands within the Hundred, under the jurisdiction of the Wardens.

3. No entire horse over twelve months old, and no bull over six months old, or bull stags shall be depasturing without special permission of the Wardens.

4. Any person disturbing or harassing stock depastured on the Hundred, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £5; provided always that a holder of a depasturing license within the Hundred, or any person duly authorised in his behalf may drive such stock for the purpose of collecting such as belong to him or her, and for the free and legitimate use of his or her right of pasturage within the Hundred; but in the event of its being necessary for such purpose to drive any stock belonging to any other person, a greater distance than half a mile, the person so driving such stock must take them to the nearest stockyard, and there separate his own from those of any other person, and return the latter to the place from which they were driven, and failing to do so shall forfeit and pay for every such offence, any sum not exceeding £5.

5. That no person shall be allowed to depasture on the Hundred, more than one head of cattle for every six (6) acres of land in his occupation, and all cattle depastured must be branded with the registered brand of the license-holder.

6. All stray cattle or sheep may be impounded, and the Wardens will not be responsible for any mistake which may arise through cattle not bearing brands according to the Cattle Branding Ordinance.

7. All license-holders shall, on or before the 13th day of September, 1872, give in a written statement to the nearest Warden, of the number of horses and cattle with their respective brands, depastured by them on said Hundred.

8. That any sheep running upon unenclosed land in said Hundred, shall be removed within twenty-one days of publication of the said by-laws; also any cattle not being the property of license-holders shall, if not removed within the same period, be impounded and dealt with according to law.

9. Provided always that nothing contained in the preceding bye-laws shall be held or construed to authorise the impounding of any sheep or cattle which are being depastured on any land, whether fenced or not, which is the property of, or which is lawfully occupied by the owner of such sheep or cattle.
