New Zealand Gazette, may from time to time establish and define such and so many districts as he shall think fit to be districts under the said Act, and to each such district there shall, in the Proclamation defining it, be attached such name as the Governor shall think fit, and by which name it shall thereafter be called, and that every such district may from time to time in like manner be altered or constituted anew in such manner as the Governor may think fit :
