## PROCLAMATION

*Extending the Limits of the Otago Gold Fields.*

By His Honor James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago in Council.

**W**HEREAS it is desirable to alter and extend the limits of the "Otago Gold Field" so as to include therein the area of land hereinafter described, Now therefore I James Macandrew Superintendent of the Province of Otago by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to the Executive Government of the said Province in this behalf by His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand in Council under the authority of "the Goldfields' Act Amendment Act 1867" and of any and every other power in anywise enabling me in this behalf do hereby proclaim and declare that all that area of land hereinafter described shall henceforth be included within and form part of the "Otago Gold Field" that is to say: All that area in the Province of Otago containing by estimation sixty thousand (60,000) acres more or less bounded by a line proceeding from the source of the Mataura river along the Eyre mountains to the source of the Eyre River then along the course of the Eyre river to its junction with the Mataura river then following up the Mataura river to the starting point.

Given under my hand and issued under the public seal of the Province of Otago in the presence of W. A. Tolmie and Hugh M'Dermid Esquires, two of the members of the Executive Council of the said Province being also members of the Provincial Council thereof this twenty-second day of November one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two.

*Extract from Section XIV of the Education Ordinance, 1864.*
