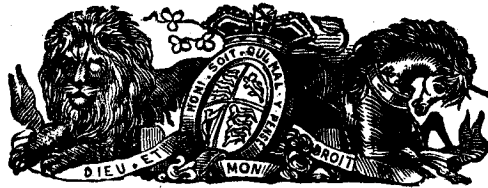

PROCLAMATION

Of the Division of Caversham Road District into Subdivisions and Wards.

WHEREAS by the eighth section of the "Otago Roads Ordinance 1871" it is enacted that at any time after the first annual election or general election as the case may be of the District Board for any Road District the Superintendent if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by one-fourth or more of the number of persons liable to be rated under the said Ordinance in respect of rateable property in such district shall by proclamation divide the district into two or more separate subdivisions, and may also divide any such subdivision into three wards in manner provided by the said Ordinance And whereas by the twelfth section of the said Ordinance it is further enacted that the members of the District Board who shall be in office in a district at the time when the same shall be divided into subdivisions shall be severally assigned by the Superintendent to the said subdivisions And whereas I James Macandrew Superintendent of the Province of Otago have received a petition signed by more than one-fourth of the persons liable to be rated under the said Ordinance in respect of rateable property in the Caversham Road District praying for the subdivision of the said district in manner hereinafter appearing :

Now therefore I James Macandrew Superintendent of the Province of Otago aforesaid in exercise of the powers conferred upon me in this behalf do hereby proclaim and divide the Caversham Road District into three subdivisions that is to say

First—

Higher Caversham Subdivision which comprises that part of Caversham Road District which is bounded towards the north by the Mornington

Road District towards the east by section 11 block VI Town Survey District and by a line proceeding in a southerly direction along the centre of the Forbury road to the Ocean beach towards the south by the Ocean and towards the west by Corstorphine Road District.

Second—

Middle Caversham Subdivision which comprises all that part of the Caversham Road District which is bounded towards the north and east by the district boundary towards the south by a line along the centre of Hillside road extending from the eastern boundary of section 8 block VII Town Survey District to the Forbury road and towards the west by Higher Caversham Subdivision before described.

Third—

Lower Caversham Subdivision which comprises the remaining part of the Caversham Road District and is bounded towards the north by Middle Caversham Subdivision towards the east by the boundary of the Road District towards the south by the Ocean and towards the west by Higher Caversham Subdivision.

And I do hereby further divide each of the hereinbefore described subdivisions into three wards that is to say

First—

Wards in Higher Caversham Subdivision.

1. North Ward comprising that part of Higher Caversham Subdivision which is situate north of a line along the centre of the Main South Road.
2. St Andrew's Ward comprising that part of Higher Caversham Subdivision which is bounded towards the north by North Ward towards the east by Middle Caversham Subdivision towards

the south-east by Lower Caversham Subdivision by part of section 42 block VII Town Survey District towards the south-west by section 13 Ocean Beach Survey District and towards the south by a line along the centre of Corstorphine road.

3. South Ward comprising the remainder of the subdivision which is situate south of St Andrew's Ward.

Second—

Wards in Middle Caversham Subdivision.

1. High Ward comprising that part of the Middle Caversham Subdivision situate north of a line along the centre of the Main South Road.
2. Low Ward comprising that part of the subdivision situate south of a line along the centre of the Main South Road and west of a line along the centre of the road line leading by Kensington to St Kilda.
3. Kensington Ward comprising the remaining part of the subdivision east of Low Ward.

Third—

Wards in Lower Caversham Subdivision.

1. First Ward comprising that part of the subdivision which is bounded towards the north by Middle Caversham Subdivision towards the east by the boundary of the road district towards the south by a line along the centre of Seafield road and towards the west by Higher Caversham Subdivision.
2. Second Ward which is bounded towards the north by First Ward towards the east by the boundary of the Road District towards the south by a line along the centre of Bay View road and towards the west by Higher Caversham Subdivision.
3. St Kilda Ward comprising the remaining part of the Lower Caversham Subdivision bounded towards the north by Second Ward towards the east and south by the boundary of the road district and towards the west by the Higher Caversham Subdivision.

And I do hereby assign the members of the Caversham District Road Board to the several subdivisions as follows that is to say

to Higher Caversham Subdivision

to Middle Caversham Subdivision and

to Lower Caversham Subdivision.

Extract from Section XIV of the Education Ordinance, 1864.

On the second Monday in the month of January in each year, a public meeting of the owners and occupiers of land and householders in every Educational District, being male persons above twenty-one years of age, shall be held at a time and place to be fixed by the Secretary of the Board, and notified by public advertisement at least one month previously, and in such other manner as the Board shall direct, and at such meeting a Chairman shall be chosen and the School Committee for the preceding year shall give a full report of their proceedings, and thereupon the electors present shall proceed to elect, either by show of hands or by ballot, as shall be determined upon by the said meeting, a new School Committee for the ensuing year of not less than five nor more than nine persons possessing the qualifications prescribed by clause 13, and may re-elect all or any of the persons going out of office to be members of such new Committee, and every Committee so to be appointed shall hold office until the appointment of their successors.

REGULATIONS for the conduct of Immigration to New Zealand, on the Nomination of Immigrants by Persons resident therein:—

1. The Immigration Regulations and Forms of Application may be obtained at any Post Office or Immigration Office in the Colony; but applications and payments for passages are only to be made to Money Order Post Offices or to the Immigration Officer at the capital town of each Province or County.

2. Any person resident in the Colony, desirous of nominating relatives or friends in Europe for passages to New Zealand, may do so by paying at any Money Order Post Office or to the Immigration Officers aforesaid the sum of £4 for each adult (except single women) between 50 and 12 years of age, and £2 for each child under 12 years of age. Infants under one year, free. In certain cases, bills will be taken in lieu of cash payments, and passages will be provided for persons over fifty years of age. (See clause 6.)

Widows with families, as a rule, not eligible, and applications for passages in their behalf are only to be made to the Immigration Officer aforesaid. (See clause 6.)

3. Free passages will be granted to girls of 12 years of age and upwards accompanying their parents, and to single women between the ages of 16 and 35, provided they are able to produce proof of good character to the satisfaction of the Agent-General in London; and a gratuity of 10s. will be paid by the Agent-General to heads of families emigrating under these Regulations for every such single woman, not being a member of the family, brought out under their protection.

4. Every adult emigrant will be required, before embarkation, to pay to the Agent-General 20s. (and children in proportion), for bedding, blankets, and mess utensils.

5. In the event of any emigrant applied for declining to emigrate, whatever money or bills may have been deposited with the Government will be returned to the applicant so soon as the Agent-General shall have apprised the Government thereof; but in the event of any emigrant applied for accepting the offer of a passage in a particular ship, and then, by failing to present himself for embarkation at the time and port appointed by the Agent-General for the sailing of such ship, be left behind, the passage money will be forfeited.

6. The Immigration Officer at the capital town in each Province or County (and he only) will receive applications as under:—

(1.) From persons who may wish to give bills for the passage money of their relatives or friends, instead of paying cash, as provided for in clause 1. The amount of the bills to be taken will be 50 per cent. over the amount above fixed to be paid in cash, and the bills will become due 30 days after the arrival of the immigrants sent for, and may be paid by instalments, the terms and periods of which must be arranged with the Immigration Officer.

(2.) From persons whose friends are over 50 years of age.

(3.) From persons whose friends are widows with children.

7. The above rates being only for the passage from the port of embarkation to the Colony, the cost of conveyance to such port, and to the residence of their friends after arrival in the Colony, must be defrayed by the emigrants themselves.

8. All the ships employed in this service will be under the provisions of the Passenger Act.

9. It is to be distinctly understood that, notwithstanding applications may have been granted at Money Order Post Offices, the Immigration Officers aforesaid are empowered to object to any of the emigrants so nominated being sent out, either from unsuitability of occupation or from any other cause; and the Agent-

Special Agents will have power to refuse passages when the intending emigrants are in illhealth, or in any way unfitted, according to his judgment, to undertake the voyage.
