PROCLAMATION.

By His Honor James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

I, JAMES MACANDREW, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, do, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in the Superintendent of the Province of Otago in this behalf by the "Roads Diversion Ordinance 1872," and of the powers vested in me as Superintendent of the Province of Otago, hereby proclaim and declare that all those roads and all those portions of roads in the Province of Otago, mentioned and referred to in the said "Roads Diversion Ordinance 1872," and particularly described in the Schedule hereto, shall, from and after the day of the date hereof, cease to be public roads or thoroughfares, and shall no longer form part of the public roads in the several Road Districts in the Province of Otago, mentioned in the Schedule to the said Ordinance annexed.

1. Akatore Road District.

(1.) All that area in the Province of Otago containing by admeasurement 3a 2r 18p more or less being a road line situate in the Akatore Survey District bounded towards the north-east by sections numbered 30 31 and 32 block III seven thousand one hundred and sixty (7160) links more or less and towards the south-west and west by other part of said sections 30 31 and 32 seven thousand three hundred (7300) links more or less.

2. Beaconsfield Road District.

(1.) RETURN OF NUMBER OF SHEEP IN THE PROVINCE.

Sheep Inspector's Department, Dunedin, 31st March, 1873.

SIR,—I have the honor to forward for the information of the Government, Return of Sheep in the Province of Otago, for the year ended 30th September, 1872.

The accompanying list shows a total of three million three hundred and nine thousand two hundred and eighty-seven (3,309,287) sheep, above six months old. Two million four hundred and twenty-three thousand two hundred and twenty-one (2,423,221) are returned as depasturing upon Runs; seven hundred and ninety-eight thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight (798,898) on freehold; thirty-six thousand and eighteen (36,018) on Hundreds; and fifty-one thousand one hundred and fifty (51,150) on Gold Fields.

All the sheep in the Province, with the exception of those depastured on one station in the Waitahuna District, have been free from disease for the last two years, and as there were some fears entertained regarding their condition at the time when the Return was first prepared, I deemed it advisable to hold over its publication until from personal inspection I had satisfied myself that they were either free from disease or otherwise. I attended while the sheep were being washed and shorn in January, and was unable to detect the slightest appearance of disease. I again carefully examined them in the month of March last, being nine months after the final dressing, and never saw the flock looking better. I am happy to say that, owing to the prompt action taken by the proprietor of the station when the disease was first discovered, in the month of June (last winter), in checking it before it spread through the flock, there being only some 30 or 40 touched out of about 35,000. I am now in a position to report that the whole of the sheep in the Province are free from disease.

With a view to prevent the re-introduction of disease from without, I would strongly recommend that dips be erected at the Bluff or Invercaagill, Port Chalmers, and somewhere near Oamaru, and that all sheep not being intended for the butcher be dipped under proper supervision before they are allowed to travel into the interior.

Hawksbury Hundred.

The Hawksbury Hundred is capable of depasturing 1500 sheep, or 200 head of great cattle.

Each license holder shall have the right of running an equal proportion of stock that the Hundred is capable of carrying.

Waikouaiti Hundred.

1st. The number of cattle which the Hundred is capable of depasturing, is computed at 651 great cattle, or 3255 sheep, exclusive of the number which may be depastured free.

2nd. Each license holder may depasture one head of great cattle, or five sheep, for every ten acres of enclosed land, and one head of great cattle, or five sheep, for every ten acres of unenclosed land owned or occupied by him within the Hundred, exclusive of those which he is entitled to depasture free.

3rd. The portion of land set apart for depasturing small cattle, shall be that part of the Hundred bounded on the north by a line due west from Trig Station T to the Waikouaiti River, on the west by the Waikouaiti River, on the east by the mountain track, and on the south by the southern boundary of the hundred.

4th. Great cattle may be depastured on the remainder of the Hundred.

Bye-Law.

Any person illegally driving or harassing cattle depasturing within the Hundred, shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding five pounds.

WEST TAIBEI HUNDRED.

Estimated to carry 454 great cattle or 2270 small cattle.

Sheep may be depastured on that portion of the Hundred lying on the south side of Waipori river and the stream known as "the Mill creek." Great cattle may be depastured on the remainder of the Hundred.

WAIHOLA HUNDRED.

1st. The Waihola Hundred is capable of depasturing 850 head of great cattle or 4250 sheep.

2nd. Each license-holder may depasture ten great cattle or 50 sheep for every hundred acres occupied or owned within the Hundred, exclusive of those he may depasture free under the 106th section of the Act.

Bye-Law.

1st. Any person disturbing or harassing cattle, great or small, depastured within the Hundred shall be liable to a penalty of £5, to be recovered in a summary way; provided always that any person holding a license to depasture cattle within the Hundred, or any person duly authorised by him, may drive cattle so depastured for the purpose of collecting such of them as may belong to him and for the legitimate use of the right to pasture within the Hundred; but in case it should be necessary for such purpose to drive any cattle belonging to any other person a greater distance than one mile, the person so driving such cattle must take them to the nearest stockyard, and there separate his own cattle from those of other persons, and return the latter to the place from whence they were driven.

NORTH TOKOMAIRO HUNDRED.

1. The North Tokomairo Hundred is capable of depasturing 425 great cattle, or 2125 sheep.

2. Each license-holder may depasture 10 head of great cattle or 50 sheep for every hundred acres occupied or owned within the Hundred.

Bye-Law.

1st. Any person disturbing or harassing cattle, great or small, depastured within the Hundred shall be liable to a penalty of £5, to be recovered in a summary way; provided always that any person holding a license to depasture cattle within the Hundred, or any person duly authorised by him, may drive cattle so depastured for the purpose of collecting such of them as may belong to him and for the legitimate use of the right to pasture within the Hundred; but in case it should be necessary for such purpose to drive any cattle belonging to any other person a greater distance than one mile, the person so driving such cattle must take them to the nearest stockyard and there separate his own cattle from those of other persons, and return the latter to the place from whence they were driven.

WAIKOUAITI HUNDRED.

1st. The number of cattle which the Hundred is capable of depasturing is computed to be 522 great cattle.

2nd. Each license holder shall be at liberty to depasture on the unsold land within the Hundred, one head of great cattle, or five sheep, for every twenty acres of land, owned or occupied by him within the Hundred, exclusive of those allowed to be depastured free.

TUTURAU HUNDRED.

1st. The Tuturau Hundred is capable of depasturing 2430 great cattle, or 12150 sheep.

2nd. Each license holder shall be entitled to depasture two head of great cattle, or ten sheep, for every ten acres of land, owned or occupied by him within the Hundred, exclusive of those which he is entitled to depasture free.

3rd. All assessments shall be paid upon the last Saturday in June next, between the hours of one o'clock and five o'clock p.m., at the Tuturau School House.

4th. No sheep shall be depastured within the Hundred excepting on the ground now set apart, as follows:—The

mill at back of Hundred, behind Mr Thomson's purchased land, known as Galt's Hill, and that part of Mataura Flat situated between north bank of Marairua Creek and sod fence erected by Mr Galt across main road from edge of terrace to bank of Mataura River.

5th. Great cattle may be depastured on the remainder of the Hundred.

It having been brought to the notice of the Board, that a number of the returns for 1873 have been incorrectly made, and also that persons are depasturing cattle without licenses, notice is given that returns, in the form provided in the fourteenth schedule to the Otago Waste Lands Act, 1872, must be sent to the ranger, on or before the 14th May, 1873, otherwise immediate steps will be taken to enforce terms of clauses 130 and 131 of Waste Lands Act, 1872, which provide for a penalty of £50.

Bye-Laws.

1st. No cattle from any diseased district, or which shall have been driven through any diseased district, shall be placed on the Hundred until the owner or person in charge of the same shall have produced to the Ranger a certificate from a duly qualified inspector, to the effect that such cattle are free from the disease called pleuro pneumonia, and satisfactory evidence that they have been free of that disease during the preceeding six months.

2nd. No person shall disturb or harass cattle lawfully depasturing upon the Hundred, provided always that any person holding a licence to depasture cattle within the Hundred, or any person duly authorised by him, may drive such cattle for the purpose of collecting such as may belong to him, and for the legitimate use of the right of pasturage within the Hundred; but in case it should be necessary for such purpose to drive any cattle belonging to any other person a greater distance than half a mile, the person so driving such cattle must take them to the nearest available stockyard, and there separate his own cattle from those of other persons, and return the latter to the place from whence they were driven.

3rd. Every person removing cattle from the Hundred shall give twenty-four hours notice in writing of number and description of the same to the nearest Warden.

4th. All cattle which may die from any cause whatever, the owner, or person in charge thereof, shall bury the same within twenty-four hours from death, or within twenty-four hours of information of the death being given to such owner or person in charge.

5th. If any cattle be suspected of being diseased, the Ranger may appoint certain boundaries within the Hundred, within which such cattle shall be confined.

6th. Any person offending against any of the foregoing Bye-laws shall forfeit any sum not exceeding five pounds for every such offence.

MOKORETA HUNDRED.

1st. The number of cattle which may be depastured on the Mokoreta Hundred, in the year 1872, shall be two thousand one hundred and sixty great cattle, or thirteen thousand eight hundred small cattle.

2nd. Each holder of a licence to depasture cattle upon the Waste Lands within the Mokoreta Hundred shall be entitled to depasture in the year 1873 one head of great cattle or five head of small cattle for every seven acres of land which he shall own or occupy therein, exclusive of those which he is entitled to depasture free.

3rd. No sheep shall be depastured during the current year on that part of the Hundred north of the Wyndham, excepting on the ground between the Redan and the Wyndham, and on the plain between the swamp on the east and the Mataura on the west, and the Wyndham and the Mimihau on the south and north; also on that part of the Hundred south of the Wyndham, excepting on the ground between the Don and the east boundary of the Hundred.

4th. Great cattle may be depastured on the remainder on the remainder of the Hundred.

TOETOES HUNDRED.

1st. That the common Waste Lands within the Hundred are capable of depasturing 3016 great cattle or 15,080 sheep.

2nd. That license holders shall be entitled to depasture at the rate of 25 head great cattle or 125 sheep for every 100 acres owned or occupied, exclusive of those they are entitled to depasture free.

3rd. Sheep may be depastured on that part of the Hundred bounded on the north by the boundary of the Hundred, on the west by the Mataura river, on the south by the

2. Class for English language and literature. Professor: G. S. Sale, M.A.
3. *Mathematics*.—I. Junior mathematics. II. Mathematics and natural philosophy. III. Mathematics and natural philosophy. Professor: John Shand, M.A.
4. *Mental and Moral Science*.—Classes for logic and psychology, moral philosophy, political economy. Professor: D. Macgregor, M.A., M.B.
5. *Natural Science*.—Classes for chemistry, mineralogy and geology. Professor: J. G. Black, M.A., D.Sc.

The session will last for six months continuously, during the entire course of which instruction will be given to each class by the Professor, by means of text books, lectures, and oral and written examinations.

Matriculation fee, £1; laboratory fee, £1.

The fee for each class is three guineas per session.

MATRICULATION.

The matriculation examinations for 1873 will be held at Dunedin on the 2nd and 3rd days of May.

Latin.

Cicero—"De Amicitia."

Greek.

Xenophon's Anabasis, Book I.

English.

Writing and dictation.

French or German.

Translation from French or German into English: Translation from English into French or German.

Arithmetic.

The compound rules, especially square and cubic measures; vulgar and decimal fractions; proportion; extraction of the square root.

Algebra.

Meaning of the Algebraical signs, the four elementary rules, simple equations.

Geometry.

Euclid, Book I.

Geography.

The chief physical features and principal towns of Europe, Asia, Africa, North and South America; together with more minute details of the geography of Great Britain and Ireland, Australia and New Zealand.

Candidates will be entitled to matriculate who shall

have passed in Latin, English, and Arithmetic; and in any two at least of the other subjects of examination.

DEGREES.

The degree of B.A. will be attainable by attendance upon the prescribed lectures during three sessions, and passing an examination in certain subjects, either at the end of the third, or at the beginning of the fourth session after matriculation; or at the beginning or end of any subsequent session. There will be no honor examination in connection with the B.A. degree.

The degree of M.A. will be attainable only by those who have already taken the B.A. degree. The ordinary M.A. degree will be attainable by attendance on the prescribed lectures for at least one session after the taking of the B.A. degree, and by passing a further examination similar in kind to that required of candidates for the degree of B.A.; such examination to be held at the end of one year from the B.A. degree, or at the commencement or end of any subsequent session. There will be an honor examination in connection with the M.A. degree. No one will be admitted to the degree of M.A., with honors, except such as have declared their intention of entering for honors at the time of taking the B.A. degree, or within six months afterwards. Candidates for the degree of M.A. with honors will be allowed to select one or more of the following subjects, and will be examined in such subject or subjects only:—

1. Classics.
2. Philosophy.
3. Pure and applied mathematics.
4. Natural science.

No candidate will be admitted to the degree of M.A., with honors, after the expiration of three academical years, from the date of his B.A. degree, nor after the expiration of six years from the date of his matriculation.

All candidates for the B.A. and ordinary M.A. degrees will be required to furnish certificates of their attendance at the several courses of lectures prescribed for them. Candidates for the B.A. degree may select one of the two following courses:—

LITERARY COURSE.

1st year.—Latin, Greek, Mathematics, *English.

2nd year.—Latin, Mathematics, Mental Science, Natural Science.

3rd year. { Greek { Moral Philosophy, } Natural
 { *English { Political Economy } Philosophy.

SCIENTIFIC COURSE.

1st year.—Latin, Mathematics, Natural Science.

2nd year.—Latin, Mathematics, Natural Science, Mental Science.

3rd year.—Natural Philosophy, Natural Science.

Classes marked * are taught only three days a week.

In the Scientific Course students will not be required to attend both the English classes and the Moral Philosophy class, but must take one or the other.

Though students are recommended to adhere to one or other of the above courses, if they wish to graduate at the end of three years, the Council desires it to be understood that they are at liberty to take the prescribed classes in any order, and to spread them over a longer period.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION FOR THE M.A. DEGREE.

Attendance on two additional classes—both literary or both scientific. Additional subjects in Latin and Greek: portions from authors not included in the examination for the B.A. degree. Additional subjects in mathematics: elements of differential and integral calculus. Natural philosophy: electricity and magnetism, as far as explained in the class. Astronomy as in Herschel's Outlines.

Mental and moral science and natural science; The examination more extended than for the B.A. degree.
