At the Provincial Government Buildings, Dunedin, the eleventh day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three.

WHEREAS by Proclamation bearing date the 23rd day of June, 1868, made by the Superintendent of the Province of Otago, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province, and published in the *Otago Provincial Gazette*, No. 553, under the hand of the said Superintendent of the Province of Otago, and under the public seal of the said Province, certain Regulations were made for the depasturing of stock upon the Waste Lands of the Crown within the Otago Gold Field: And whereas by Proclamation bearing date the 6th day of October, 1868, made by the Superintendent of the Province of Otago as aforesaid, and published in the *Otago Provincial Gazette*, No. 572 as aforesaid, the said Regulations of the 23rd day of June, 1868, were altered and amended: And whereas it is expedient to further amend the said Regulations so far as they relate to the Dunstan District.

Now, therefore, His Honor James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the said Province of Otago, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province, doth by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to the Executive Government of the Province of Otago in that behalf, hereby revoke the Regulations numbered 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 of the said Regulations so made and published on the 23rd day of June 1868, and Regulation numbered 23 of the said Regulations so made and published on the 6th day of October, 1868, so far only as the same apply to the said Dunstan District and doth make the Regulations following in lieu thereof as regards the said Dunstan District (that is to say):—

DEPASTURING REGULATIONS.

Otago Gold Field—Dunstan District.

1. The Mayor and Councillors of the Municipal Corporation of Clyde, in the said Dunstan district, for the time being, shall be and are hereby appointed the Board of Wardens for the said Dunstan district as the same is described in the Schedule to the said Regulations of the

23rd day of June 1868, and shall have all the powers conferred on Boards of Wardens by the Depasturing Regulations of the 23rd day of June and 6th day of October 1868 respectively.

2. The Mayor of the Municipal Corporation of Clyde shall be the Chairman of the Board of Wardens, and shall have a casting vote in cases of equality.

3. The Sheep Inspector at Clyde for the time being shall be and is hereby appointed the person to carry out the said Depasturing Regulations in the said Dunstan district.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Southland Waste Lands Act 1865," is among other things provided that all lands not included in any of the foregoing regulations of the said Act should be open for sale as rural land at the fixed price of twenty shillings per acre; Provided always that if at any time the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the said Province should recommend the Governor to raise such price, then it should be lawful for the Governor in Council, if he should see fit, to raise such price in accordance with such recommendation: And whereas by "The Otago and Southland Union Act 1870," it was enacted that on and after the day when the said Act should come into operation the Province of Southland should cease to be a separate Province, and the said Province and the Province of Otago, as existing immediately before the coming into operation of the said Act, should together be one Province by the name of the "Province of Otago" as and in manner therein particularly mentioned; and by the said Act provision was also made that within that part of the Province constituted by the now reciting Act, which, before the coming into operation thereof, was included in the Province of Southland, all laws and Ordinances in force therein should be and continue in force until altered or repealed as therein mentioned: And whereas the said firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act is still in force within that part of the Province of Otago formerly comprised in the Province of Southland: And whereas the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago have recommended the Governor to raise the price of the land hereinafter mentioned within the limits of the late Province of Southland to sixty shillings an acre:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of all powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Colony, doth hereby order and declare that with respect to that portion of the Province of Otago which was comprised within the Province of Southland as existing immediately before the coming into operation of "The Otago and Southland Union Act 1870," the price of all lands therein subject to the hereinbefore recited provision of "The Southland Waste Lands Act 1865," shall be raised to sixty shillings per acre: And in further pursuance of the said powers and authorities, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, it is ordered that this Order shall take effect from the date thereof.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Lunatics Act 1868," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, to order and direct that all or any of the powers, functions, duties, and authorities vested in or required to be performed by the Governor, or the Governor in Council, or the Colonial Secretary, by the said Act, within any Province or other district of the Colony, shall be exercised or performed by the Superintendent of any such Province, or by any other person the Governor may think fit; and thereupon such functions, powers, duties, and authorities may by such Superintendent or other person be exercised or performed within the Province or other district of the Colony specified:

Now, therefore, His Excellency Sir James Fergusson, the Governor of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Colony, in pursuance and in exercise of the power and authority for that purpose vested in him, doth hereby order and direct that all the powers, functions, duties, and authorities vested in or required to be performed by the Governor, or the Governor in Council, or the Colonial Secretary by "The Lunatics Act 1868," within the Province of Otago, shall be exercised by the Superintendent of such Province.

*Delegation of certain of the Governor's Powers under the
 "Gold Fields Act 1866," to the Superintendent of the
 Province of Otago.*

JAMES FERGUSSON, Governor.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intitled "The Gold Fields Act 1866," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand and the Public Seal of the Colony, from time to time to delegate to the Superintendent of any Province, or such other person as the Governor may deem fit, all or any of the powers vested in the Governor or the Governor in Council by the Act now in recital, except the powers conferred by sections twenty-two, forty, forty-eight, sixty, ninety-six, and one hundred and seven of the said Act, subject or not to any limitations or restrictions as he may think fit, and in like manner to alter or revoke any such powers:

And whereas by "The Gold Fields Act Amendment Act 1867," it is enacted that within any Province in which by any Act or Ordinance it is provided that the Superintendent shall, in the administration of the Government thereof, act by and with the advice and consent of an Executive Council, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to delegate under his hand and the Public Seal of the Colony, from time to time as occasion may require, to the Executive Government for the time being of such Province, subject or not to any limitations or restrictions as he may think fit, all or any of such powers vested in the Governor or the Governor in Council by the "Gold Fields Act 1866," as under or by virtue of the one hundred and ninth section of the said Act (being the section herein first recited) may be delegated by the Governor in Council:

And whereas by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province hereinafter named, intitled the "Executive Council Ordinance 1861" it is provided that the Superintendent of the said Province shall, in the administration of the Government thereof, act by and with the advice and consent of an Executive Council:

Now therefore, I, Sir James Fergusson, the Go-

vernor of the Colony of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in exercise of the power and authority for this purpose in me vested, do hereby delegate unto the Executive Government, for the time being, of the Province of Otago, all such powers vested in the Governor or the Governor in Council by "The Gold Fields Act 1866," and "The Gold Fields Act Amendment Act 1869," as under or by virtue of the one hundred and ninth section of "The Gold Fields Act 1866," may be delegated by the Governor in Council, to have, hold, and exercise within the said Province the said powers hereby given: Provided always that copies of all rules and regulations made under the said delegation shall be forthwith transmitted to the Colonial Secretary, in order that the same may be laid before the General Assembly, in accordance with the provisions of the one hundred and tenth clause of "The Gold Fields Act 1866."

Delegation of Governor's Powers under the Diseased Cattle Acts to the Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

JAMES FERGUSSON, Governor.

WHEREAS by "The Diseased Cattle Act 1861," it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Warrant under his hand, from time to time delegate to the Superintendent of any Province within the Colony all or any of the powers vested in the Governor or the Governor in Council by the said Act, subject to such regulations as he may think fit: And whereas by the fourth section of "The Diseased Cattle Act Amendment Act 1865" it is enacted that the Governor may, by any Order in Council, from time to time annul, make void, or alter or vary and make anew, any Orders in Council, regulations, appointments, or prohibitory or other declarations, made and published by the Governor under the authority of "The Diseased Cattle Act 1861," or of "The Diseased Cattle Act Amendment Act 1865," or by the Superintendent of any Province under or in pursuance of any powers delegated under the powers of delegation contained in "The Diseased Cattle Act 1861," or "The Diseased Cattle Act Amendment Act 1865." And whereas by the fifth section of "The Diseased Cattle Act Amendment Act 1865," it is enacted that the power of annulling, making void, or allowing or varying and making anew, any such regulations, appointments, or prohibitory or other declarations vested in the Governor by "The Diseased Cattle Act Amendment Act 1865," may from time to time be delegated by the Governor in Council, by Warrant under his hand, to the Superintendent of any Province:

Now therefore, I, Sir James Fergusson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said colony, do hereby delegate to

JAMES MACANDREW, Esquire,

the Superintendent of the Province of Otago, within the said Province, so long as he shall remain Superintendent of the Province, the several powers vested in the Governor or the Governor in Council by the second, fourth, fifth, seventh, ninth, and tenth sections of "The Diseased Cattle Act 1861," aforesaid, and all the powers which by the fifth section of "The Diseased Cattle Act Amendment Act 1865," the Governor in Council is authorised so to delegate, subject to be rescinded as in the said Acts provided, and subject to the regulations contained in an Order in Council dated the twenty-first day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy.

Powers under Sections 53 and 77 of the Public Health Act 1872, to be exercised by the Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by "The Public Health Act 1872," it is, among other things, enacted that the Governor may from time to time, as he thinks fit, order that all or any of the powers, functions, duties, authorities or acts vested in, conferred on, or authorized or required to be performed by the Governor within any Province, district, port, or place in the Colony, by or under the fifty-third and seventy-seventh sections of the said Act, shall be exercised, performed, or done by the Superintendent of such Province, with the advice of the Executive Council of such Province (if any), as in the said Act mentioned: subject, however, to any limitations or restrictions as he may think fit:

Now therefore, His Excellency Sir James Fergusson, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority enabling him under the hereinbefore in part recited Act, doth hereby order that all the powers, functions, duties, authorities, or acts vested in, conferred on, or authorized or required to be done by him as such Governor as aforesaid, within the Province of Otago, under the fifty-third and seventy-seventh sections of the said Act, shall be exercised, performed, or done by

JAMES MACANDREW, Esq.,

the Superintendent of the said Province, as and in manner by the said Act required: Provided that this order shall only remain in force so long as the said James Macandrew shall be and remain such Superintendent as aforesaid, or until other provision in that behalf shall be made by the Governor under the powers aforesaid.
