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## PROCLAMATION

*Of the Waipori Depasturing District, and Regulations for the Depasturing of Stock therein.*

By His Honor John Theodore Thomas Boyd, Esq., Deputy Superintendent of the Province of Otago, in Council.

**W**HEREAS by the fourteenth section of "The Gold Fields Act 1866," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time to make, alter, and revoke regulations for the depasturing of stock upon any lands within proclaimed gold fields for which a lease or license for depasturing purposes has not been granted, or has been cancelled or suspended, and to regulate the number of horses or cattle which may be run upon such lands by the holders of miners' rights and business licenses, or of mining, mineral, and agricultural leases, and to issue depasturing licenses, and to regulate the fees that shall be paid therefor: And whereas the Governor hath, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, and in pursuance of the power and authority for that purpose vested in him by "The Gold Fields Act 1866" and subject to its provisions, delegated unto the Executive Government for the time being of the Province of Otago all such powers vested in the Governor or the Governor in Council by the said last-mentioned Act as under or by virtue of the 109th section of the said last-mentioned Act may be delegated by the Governor in Council, to have, hold, and exercise the said powers within the said Province of Otago:

And whereas it is expedient that regulations should be made for the depasturing of stock upon that part of the waste lands of the Crown within the Otago gold field known as the Waipori District:

Now therefore I, John Theodore Thomas Boyd, Deputy Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province, do hereby, by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to the Executive Government of the said Province in this behalf by His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand in Council, under the authority of "The Gold Fields Act Amendment Act 1867," and of any and every other power in anywise enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare that from and after the day of the date hereof, the district specified in the Schedule hereto shall be and is hereby constituted and appointed a depasturing district, and the Regulations of the 23rd day of June, 1868, published in the Otago Provincial Government Gazette, No. 553, and the Regulations of the 6th day of October, 1868, published in the said Gazette, No. 572, shall be the Depasturing Regulations for the said district as if the said district had been originally included in the Schedules to the said Regulations respectively.

## THE SCHEDULE ABOVE REFERRED TO.

### *Waipori District.*

All that area in the Province of Otago, containing by admeasurement seven thousand six hundred and fifty acres, more or less, being originally portions of Runs numbered respectively 186 and 51 on the map of the south-eastern district of the said Province: bounded by a line commencing at the Lammerlaw Creek and proceeding due east through Trigonometrical Station M, Waipori Survey District, to Commonage Creek, thence by Commonage Creek and the Waipori River to the junction of Pioneer Creek with the Waipori River; thence by Pioneer Creek to its junction with Ox Burn; thence by Ox Burn and a direct line to the Dunedin road, at a point due south of the source of the Pastoral Creek; thence by Pastoral Creek and the Waipori River to the junction of the Lammerlaw Creek; thence along Lammerlaw Creek to the starting point.

**N**OTICE is hereby given, that in conformity with the "Depasturing Regulations," the first election of Wardens for the depasturing district of Waipori will be held on Thursday, the sixteenth day of October next ensuing.

The Board of Wardens for the district aforesaid shall consist of five elective members, one of whom shall hereafter be appointed chairman.

The following Regulations shall be the Regulations for the first election as aforesaid.

I. Nominations of candidates must be made in writing, addressed to the Warden at Lawrence, on or before Monday, the thirteenth day of October next, and in the following form, which must be signed in full by the proposer and seconder of every such candidate.

FORM.

To the Warden at Lawrence.

We hereby nominate (*here insert name in full*) to be a member of the first board of Wardens of the Waipori Depasturing District.

(Signatures.)

\*\* After the signatures of the proposer and seconder, the nature and particulars of the qualification under which they claim to vote must be stated.

II. If more than the requisite number of candidates are nominated, a poll shall take place on Thursday, the 16th October, from 10 a.m. till 4 p.m., and after the latter hour no further vote shall be allowed to be recorded; and the candidates in whose favor the greatest number of votes shall have been recorded at the said hour of 4 p.m., (or in the event of there not being more than the requisite number, then the candidates nominated) shall, as soon thereafter as may be, be declared by the Warden or other officer to have been duly elected for the ensuing six months.

III. No person shall be entitled to be so nominated, nor shall any person be entitled so to nominate, or to second the nomination of any candidate, unless he shall be possessed of one or other of the qualifications set forth and specified in Regulation No. 5 of the said Regulations.

IV. If any person shall improperly be elected as a member of the Board of Wardens, he not being duly and lawfully possessed of the qualification aforesaid at the time of election, it shall be in the power of the Board, upon due inquiry into all the circumstances of the case, to declare by a majority of votes that such election is null and void, and thereupon an election shall be held when and where, and as may be determined by the Board, for filling up the deficiency caused by such declaration.

V. Voters must attend in person to record their votes, and the document by virtue whereof they claim to vote must be produced to the Warden or presiding officer, who after recording the vote shall cause to be written upon some conspicuous part thereof the words "Voted, October 16th, 1873," together with his signature or initials.

VI. The poll (if taken) will be held at the Courthouse at Waipori.

VII. The names of all the candidates nominated shall be advertised in the local papers, and set forth in a Notice affixed to the front of the Court House.

WHEREAS by Proclamation bearing date the 23rd day of June, 1868, made by the Superintendent of Otago, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province, and published in the Otago Provincial Gazette, No. 1553, under the hand of the said Superintendent of the Province of Otago, and under the public seal of the said Province; certain Regulations were made for the depasturing of Stock upon the Waste Lands of the Crown within the Otago Gold Field. And whereas by Proclamation bearing date the 6th day of October, 1868, made by the Superintendent of the Province of Otago, as aforesaid, and published in the Otago Provincial Gazette, No. 572 as aforesaid, the said Regulations of the 23rd day of June, 1868, were altered and amended: And whereas it is expedient to further amend the said Regulations in so far as they relate to the Wakatipu District:

Now therefore His Honor, John Theodore Thomas Boyd, Esquire, Deputy-Superintendent of the said Province of Otago, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province, doth by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to the Executive Government of the Province of Otago in that behalf, hereby revoke the Regulations numbered 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and amend Regulations numbered 13 and 16 of the said Regulations so made and published on the 23rd day of June, 1868, so far only as the same apply to the said Wakatipu District, and doth make the Regulations following in lieu thereof as regards the said Wakatipu District, (that is to say)—

#### DEPASTURING REGULATIONS.

Otago Gold Field, Wakatipu District.

1. The Receiver of Gold Revenue at Queenstown, and the Receiver of Gold Revenue at Arrowtown, in the said Wakatipu District, shall have all the powers and exercise

all the functions hitherto held and exercised by the Board of Wardens for the said District.

2. Sections 13 and 16 of the said Regulations of the 23rd day of June, 1868, shall be read and construed as if the words "Receiver of Gold Revenue" had been originally inserted in the place of the words "Board of Wardens."

Setting apart Lands in the Tuapeka West District for  
alienation on deferred payments.

WHEREAS by the forty-seventh section of the Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intitled "The Otago Waste Lands Act 1872," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent of the Province of Otago, with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council thereof, from time to time by Proclamation, to be published in the Provincial Gazette, to set apart in any Province, districts or blocks of land, within which licenses to occupy land, and leases thereof on deferred payments may be granted. And whereas the Provincial Council of the Province of Otago has recommended the Superintendent of the said Province to set apart the lands specified in the Schedule hereto for alienation on deferred payments.

Now therefore I, John Theodore Thomas Boyd, Deputy Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by and with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council, as aforesaid, do hereby, by virtue and in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by "The Otago Waste Lands Act 1872," proclaim and declare that I have set apart and do hereby set apart from the date hereof, all those two several pieces or parcels of land, containing by estimation 2600 acres, and 2400 acres, more or less, situate in the Tuapeka West District, being parts of blocks numbered respectively II, III, and V on the map of the said district, specified in the Schedule hereto as a district, within which licenses to occupy land and leases thereof on deferred payments may be granted.

**BYE-LAWS** passed by the Wardens of the Winton Hundred:—

1. That no person be allowed to depasture more than fifteen head of cattle to every hundred acres occupied by him or her, and any person depasturing more than fifteen head of cattle shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding five pounds.

2. That any person depasturing stock on the Hundred who shall not have taken out a depasturing license, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding five pounds, and the cattle may be impounded.

3. All stock over the age of six months depastured on the Hundred shall be branded with the registered brand of the owners thereof; and unbranded stock above the age of six months found on the Hundred may be impounded to be dealt with according to law.

4. No bull over the age of nine months, or entire horse over the age of twelve months, shall be allowed to depasture on the Hundred without the permission in writing of the Wardens, or a majority of them, and any person turning out any bull or entire horse without having such permission, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding five pounds.

5. All persons depasturing stock on the Hundreds shall furnish to the Wardens, on or before a day to be fixed by them by advertisement in one of the local papers, a return showing the numbers, brands, and description of all stock above the age of six months depastured on the Hundred by each of them; and in the event of any person bringing more stock on the Hundred, shall make a like return within fourteen days from the time of bringing said stock, and whosoever shall make a false return or shall fail to make such return, shall pay any sum not exceeding five pounds, and the cattle be liable to be impounded.

6. Any person disturbing or harassing stock depasturing on the Hundred, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding five pounds; provided always that a holder of a depasturing license within the Hundred, or any person duly authorised in his or her behalf, may drive such stock for the purpose of collecting such as belong to him or her, and for the free and legitimate use of his or her right of pasturage within the Hundred; but in the event of its being necessary for such purpose to drive any stock a greater distance than half a mile, the person so driving such stock must take them to the nearest available stockyard and there separate his own from those of other persons, and return the latter to the place from whence they were driven, and failing to do so, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding five pounds.

7. Any person removing stock beyond the boundary of the Hundred other than those belonging to him, or for the removal of which he shall not have an authority, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding five pounds.

8. That no sheep be allowed to be depastured on the Hundred; and any person depasturing sheep on the Hundred shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding five pounds.

9. Any stock not being the property of or which are not branded with the registered brand of the holder of the license under which they are depastured, or which are depastured on the Hundred, in contravention of any bye-law duly passed, may be impounded, and the owner or custodian of such cattle may be proceeded against for trespass, and shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding five pounds.

All or any of the acts authorised by these bye-laws may be done by any of the Wardens or other persons duly appointed by them or authorised in their behalf.

The above bye-laws have been approved of and passed by us, this twenty-first day of February, 1873.

ticularly mentioned: And whereas for the purpose of giving effect to the firstly hereinbefore recited provision of the said Act it is expedient to make the regulations hereinafter set forth:

Now therefore, His Excellency the Right Honorable Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Colony, doth hereby make the following Regulations for the several purposes in the said in part recited Act mentioned—such Regulations to take effect within the Province of Otago aforesaid as and from the said twenty-third day of September, one thousand eight hundred and seventy three.

*Regulations under "The Forest Trees Planting Encouragement Act 1871," and "The Forest Trees Planting Encouragement Act Amendment Act 1872."*

1. The planting in respect of which a grant of land under the Act is claimed need not be in one block, but may be in several blocks on the same property.
2. The land planted must be securely fenced.
3. It must have been devoted to planting for at least two years. (Section 2 of "The Forest Trees Planting Encouragement Act Amendment Act 1872," provides that if root crops are cultivated among the forest trees planted on any lands, such lands shall not, by reason only of such crops being cultivated, be deemed to be not devoted only to purposes of planting.)
4. The trees must be in a vigorous and healthy state when the grant of land is applied for.
5. The number of trees planted must be at the rate of not less than five hundred per acre.
6. The trees must be of an average height of two feet, except in the case of gum, wattle, poplar, or willow, which must be of an average height of six feet.
7. As soon as the land is fenced and the trees planted, a report must be sent to the Secretary for Lands, who will cause inspection of the same to be made, from the date of which, if duly certified, the two years will be calculated.
8. The amount of the land order to be issued under authority of section 4 of the Amendment Act 1872, in respect of every acre of land planted, shall be four pounds.
9. The fulfilment of the conditions above prescribed shall be ascertained and shall be certified in the form annexed by an officer appointed by the Superintendent Upon the receipt of such certificate, the Superintendent may either issue his own certificate to the Waste Lands Board, or he may, if he thinks fit, cause further inquiry to be made into the facts of the case.
