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PROCLAMATION

By His Honor JAMES MACANDREW, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by section 390 of "The Municipal Corporations Act 1867" it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent of any Province, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* of such Province, to declare that any complete parts of the several parts of the said Act, numbered from two to twenty-two inclusive, as he shall consider applicable, shall extend and be applied to any city, town, or place in such Province, incorporated at the time of the passing of the said Act under any Act or Ordinance of the Legislature of such Province, and in such Proclamation to fix a time at which such parts or any of them shall extend to any such city, town, or place. And whereas by section 8 of "The Municipal Corporations Acts Amendment Act 1871" it is enacted that with regard to any city, town, or place within the Province of Otago, incorporated under "The Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance 1865" and "The Otago Municipal Corporations Empowering Act 1865," and that whether incorporated at or after the time of the passing of "The Municipal Corporations Act 1867," the Superintendent of the Province of Otago may from time to time, and as often as may be necessary, exercise the power conferred on such Superintendent by the three hundred and nintieth section of the last-mentioned Act:

And whereas it has been made to appear to me, James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, that parts numbered respectively 13 and 22 of "The Municipal Corporations Act 1867" are applicable and should be extended to the Municipality of Palmerston, in the said Province, which is an incorporated town within the meaning of the said "Municipal Corporations Act 1867."

Now therefore I, the same James Macandrew, Superintendent of the said Province of Otago, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf vested in me by "The Municipal Corporations Act 1867" and "The Municipal Corporations Acts Amendment Act 1871," do hereby proclaim and declare that from and after the twenty-third day of October instant, those parts of the said "Municipal Corporations Act 1867," numbered thirteen (XIII) and twenty-two (XXII) respectively, shall extend and apply to and be in force in the

TOWN OF PALMERSTON,

in the said Province of Otago.

BONUS FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A WOOL-PACK AND SACK MANUFACTORY IN OTAGO.

THE Provincial Government being desirous of encouraging the manufacture of Wool-packs and Sacks, is prepared to receive offers from parties willing

to embark in the enterprise, and is further prepared to pay a bonus of £1500 as under:—

On the erection of buildings and machinery to the value of at least £2000—£750.

On the production of Sacks or Wool-packs to a value of not less than £500—£400.

On the production of a further quantity of Sacks or Wool-packs to the value of not less than £1000—£350.

The cloth in each case to be produced by machinery permanently established in the Province, and to be manufactured either wholly or to a large extent from Phormium Tenax, or other indigenous plants, or from other material grown in the Province.

Offers will be received at the Provincial Government Offices, Dunedin, until the 1st of May, 1874, and should state the estimated cost and productive power of the machinery proposed to be erected, the date on which the same will be in operation, and that the parties are prepared to be bound in the sum of £1000 to produce sacks and wool-packs to the value of £1500 within three years from the date on which their offer is accepted.

The Government does not bind itself to accept any offer.

TO SCHOOL COMMITTEES AND SCHOOL TEACHERS.

THE following Resolutions of the Education Board are published for the information of School Committees and School Teachers. By order,

1. The salary due to any teacher who may have resigned and left his appointment in any school will not be paid to him unless he produce to the Secretary of the Board a certificate from the Chairman or Clerk of the Committee of such school, to the effect that the said teacher has, up to the date of his leaving, properly made

all the entries in his School Register and account of School Fees which are requisite for the correct filling up of the Annual Returns of the school, and that such registers and account have been handed over to the said Chairman or Clerk.

2. The Clerks of School Committees are hereby enjoined to intimate to the Secretary of the Board without any delay the date on which any teacher may cease to perform his school duty, and also the date on which any teacher hereafter appointed may enter on the performance of duty; otherwise there may be difficulty in obtaining payment of salary.

PROVINCIAL SCHOLARSHIPS.—The following Regulations of the Education Board respecting Provincial Scholarships are published for general information. School teachers are requested to forward to me, before the 10th January, 1874, a list containing the names and ages of intending competitors belonging to their several schools.

REGULATIONS.

1. Two Scholarships in connection with the Boys' High School, and two in connection with the Girls' High School, shall be open for competition on the 20th of January, 1874, to boys and girls respectively who shall have attended the public schools of Otago for at least one quarter during the current year (1873). One of the boys' and one of the girls' Scholarships shall be bestowed on a boy and a girl respectively from the High Schools or the Grammar Schools. The other two Scholarships shall be conferred on a boy and a girl respectively from the ordinary District Schools. Competitors must be under sixteen years of age at the date of the competition.

2. The holders for the time being of the said Scholarships shall be called "Provincial Scholars," and shall be entitled to the privileges and advantages hereinafter specified. A scholarship shall be tenable as long as the holder of it remains a pupil of the Boys' or Girls' High School, but not longer than three years. The Education Board may extend the period of tenure in the case of any Provincial Scholar who may have given highly satisfactory evidence of diligence and progress in study.

3. The said Scholarships respectively shall be awarded to such candidates as shall have shown the greatest proficiency at a Competitive Examination, to be held at Dunedin on the day above specified; such Competitive Examination shall be by written papers, and shall embrace the following subjects:—

- I. *English Grammar*, including Analysis of Sentences.
- II. *Geography*.—The Elements of Mathematical and Physical Geography; the chief Physical Features, Political Divisions, and Principal Towns of Europe and Australasia; the drawing from memory of an outline Map of a country in Europe or a colony in Australasia, to be named by the Examiners.
- III. *British History*.—The Tudor Period, 1485—1603; and the Reign of Queen Victoria.
- IV. *Arithmetic*.—Simple and compound Rules, Practice, Simple and Compound Proportion, Vulgar and Decimal Fractions, Interest, Discount, Profit and Loss, Extraction of the Square Root, Square Measure and Duodecimals.
- V. *Algebra*.—For Common School competitors, the Four Elementary Rules; for High and Grammar School competitors, as far as Simple Equations, inclusive.
- VI. *Euclid*.—For Common School competitors, Book I, prop. 1—15; for High and Grammar School competitors, the whole of Book I.
- VII. Writing from Dictation.
- VIII. A simple *Narrative*, selected by the Examiners, to be read aloud to the competitors and reproduced by them.
- IX. A short *Essay* on some familiar subject to be named by the Examiners.
- X. *Pennmanship*, as shown by the competitors' papers under subjects VII, VIII, and IX. Preference will be given to a plain round hand.
- XI. *Latin*.—(High and Grammar School Boys), Grammar and Accidence; translation into English of a passage in Latin.

XII. *French*.—(High and Grammar School Girls), Grammar; translation into English of a passage from a French author.

XIII. Marks will be given for the reading of Prose and Poetry, and for Recitation from memory.

4. It shall not be necessary to award a scholarship to the best, or any other candidate, unless he or she shall have gained, in the aggregate, at least 70 per cent. of the number of marks attainable; and the Board shall be at liberty to suspend or terminate any scholarship on account of wilful misconduct or neglect of studies on the part of the holder.

5. Each holder of a Provincial Scholarship shall receive free education at the High School and a payment of £30 per annum.

6. Free education for terms of not less than two years nor more than four years may, at the discretion of the Board, be granted to the unsuccessful competitors for Scholarships who shall have gained a satisfactory percentage of the whole number of marks attainable; such Free Scholars may attend the High School, a Grammar School, or an approved Main District School, at their option.

7. Certificates of Merit will be granted to those competitors who, though failing to gain Scholarships, distinguished themselves greatly.

8. Teachers must forward to the Secretary of the Education Board, before the 10th January, 1874, the names of intending competitors belonging to their respective schools, together with a certificate of the age of every scholar.

NOTICE TO IMPORTERS OF SHEEP AND OTHERS.

THE following sections from the "Sheep Ordinance Amendment Ordinance 1873" are published for general information:—

4. No sheep shall be imported into the Province of Otago by sea until such sheep shall have been inspected by an Inspector previous to their being landed and such Inspector shall have given permission to land such sheep. It shall be lawful for any Inspector to order and cause any such sheep to be well dipped or dressed by some reputed effective scab-destroying preparation prescribed by such Inspector. Such sheep to be so dipped or dressed within forty-eight hours of their being so landed at some convenient place not further than one mile from the place at which such sheep were so landed. All expenses and charges attending the dressing of such sheep so imported or landed shall be borne and paid by the owner thereof. Any person importing or landing any sheep contrary to the provisions of this Ordinance shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not less than £50 nor more than £100. And every person so offending may be proceeded against for such offence upon the information of an Inspector or any other person.

5. For every inspection of sheep made on board of any ship vessel or steamer a fee of £3 shall be charged by the Inspector making such inspection and no certificate or authority to land any sheep shall be given by such Inspector until the said fee of £3 shall have been paid to him by the owner of such sheep.

9. All moneys received by any Inspector by way of head money or inspection fees together with all fines and penalties recovered under the provisions of this Ordinance shall be accounted for and paid to the Provincial Treasurer of the Province of Otago by the person or persons receiving or recovering the same.
