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PROCLAMATION

Appointing a certain Road in the Otepopo Road District to be a Main District Road.

WHEREAS by the "Otago Roads Ordinance 1871," it is provided that upon the application of the Road Board of any road district the Superintendent may from time to time, if it shall seem fit so to do, by proclamation appoint that any roads or parts of roads, whether within or upon the boundary of such district, shall be main roads or main district roads: And whereas the Road Board for the Otepopo road district have applied to me, James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, to appoint the road hereinafter described to be a main district road.

Now therefore I, James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf vested in me by the said "Otago Roads Ordinance 1871," do hereby appoint the following road, situate within or upon the boundary of the Otepopo road district aforesaid, to be a main district road, that is to say:—

VIII. That road leading from the Main North Road between blocks IX and XXVIII, Herbert, to the western boundary of block VII, Otepopo Survey district.

PROCLAMATION

Appointing certain roads in the Heddon Bush and Jacobs River Subdivision of the Aparima Road District to be Main District Roads.

By His Honor James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by the "Otago Roads Ordinance 1871," it is provided that upon the application of the Road Board of any road district the Superintendent may from time to time, if it shall seem fit so to do, by proclamation appoint that any roads or parts of roads, whether within or upon the boundary of such district, shall be main roads or main district roads: And whereas the Road Board for the Aparima road district have applied to me, James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, to appoint the roads hereinafter described to be main district roads.

Now therefore I, James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf vested in me by the said "Otago

Roads Ordinance 1871," do hereby appoint the following roads, situate within or upon the boundary of the Aparima Road District aforesaid, to be main district roads, that is to say:—

(1.) The road commencing at the north-west corner of section 14, block XIII, New River Hundred, and extending in a northerly direction through the Oreti Hundred, parallel to the Oreti River, to the northern boundary of the Aparima road district.

(2.) The road commencing at the ford on the Jacobs River and extending in a south-easterly direction through section 4, Oreti Hundred, south of Trig. L, and thence in an easterly direction through the Oreti plains to where it meets the main road which extends from Winton to Wrey's Bush.

(3.) The road commencing at Waimatuku Stream, opposite to the north-west corner of section 36, block XV, Jacobs River Hundred, and extending in a straight course in a northerly direction through the Oreti Hundred (about 8 chains east of Trig. Y) to the south-west corner of section 24, Oreti Hundred.

Also the following in Jacobs River subdivision, viz.:—

(4.) The road forming the northern boundary of sections 5 and 19, block III, Jacobs River Hundred.

BONUS FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A WOOL-PACK AND SACK MANUFACTORY IN OTAGO.

THE Provincial Government being desirous of encouraging the manufacture of Wool-packs and Sacks, is prepared to receive offers from parties willing to embark in the enterprise, and is further prepared to pay a bonus of £1500 as under:—

On the erection of buildings and machinery to the value of at least £2000—£750.

On the production of Sacks or Wool-packs to a value of not less than £500—£400.

On the production of a further quantity of Sacks or Wool-packs to the value of not less than £1000—£350.

The cloth in each case to be produced by machinery permanently established in the Province, and to be manufactured either wholly or to a large extent from Phormium Tenax, or other indigenous plants, or from other material grown in the Province.

Offers will be received at the Provincial Government Offices, Dunedin, until the 1st of May, 1874, and should state the estimated cost and productive power of the machinery proposed to be erected, the date on which the same will be in operation, and that the parties are prepared to be bound in the sum of £1000 to produce sacks and wool-packs to the value of £1500 within three years from the date on which their offer is accepted.

NOTICE TO IMPORTERS OF SHEEP AND OTHERS.

THE following sections from the "Sheep Ordinance Amendment Ordinance 1873" are published for general information:—

4. No sheep shall be imported into the Province of Otago by sea until such sheep shall have been inspected by an Inspector previous to their being landed and such Inspector shall have given permission to land such sheep. It shall be lawful for any Inspector to order and cause any such sheep to be well dipped or dressed by some reputed effective scab-destroying preparation prescribed by such Inspector. Such sheep to be so dipped or dressed within forty-eight hours of their being so landed at some convenient place not further than one mile from the place at which such sheep were so landed. All expenses and charges attending the dressing of such sheep so imported or landed shall be borne and paid by the owner thereof. Any person importing or landing any sheep contrary to the provisions of this Ordinance shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not less than £50 nor more than £100. And every person so offending may be proceeded against for such offence upon the information of an Inspector or any other person.

5. For every inspection of sheep made on board of any ship vessel or steamer a fee of £3 shall be charged by the Inspector making such inspection and no certificate or authority to land any sheep shall be given by such Inspector until the said fee of £3 shall have been paid to him by the owner of such sheep.

9. All moneys received by any Inspector by way of head money or inspection fees together with all fines and penalties recovered under the provisions of this Ordinance shall be accounted for and paid to the Provincial Treasurer of the Province of Otago by the person or persons receiving or recovering the same.

SCHEDULE.

Regulations for the conduct of Immigration to New Zealand, on the Nomination of Immigrants by Persons resident therein.

1. Any person resident in the Colony, desirous of nominating relatives or friends in Europe for passages to New Zealand, may do so by applying to an Immigration Officer, in the form at foot, copies of which can be obtained at all Immigration and Post Offices.

The persons nominated, if approved by the Immigration Officer and the officers of the Home Agency, will receive free passages to the Colony.

2. Every adult emigrant will be required, before embarkation, to pay, unless specially remitted by the Agent-General, 20s (and children in proportion), for bedding, blankets, and mess utensils.

3. The cost of conveyance to the port (unless the Agent-General agrees to pay it), and to the residence of

their friends after arrival in the Colony, must be defrayed by the emigrants themselves.

4. All the ships employed in this service will be under the provisions of the Passenger Act.

5. It is to be distinctly understood, that notwithstanding the applications are forwarded to the Agent-General by the Immigration Officers, the Agent-General in London may refuse passages where the intending emigrants are in ill-health, or in any way unfitted, according to his judgment, to emigrate.

6. The Regulations issued upon 21st April, 1873, for the payment of bonuses to the nominators upon the arrival of the nominated immigrants, are hereby rescinded; and no certificates for the payment of such bonuses will be given after the date hereof.

Stamp Duty to be paid by Persons entering into the employment of the General Government and Provincial Governments and Corporations.

Office of the Commissioner of Stamps,
Wellington, 8th October, 1873.

THE Commissioner of Stamps desires to point out to Heads of Departments in the General and Provincial Governments, and also in Municipal Corporations, that by section 12 of "The Stamp Duties Act Amendment Act 1871," it is provided that every person, before he shall enter on the duties of his office or employment, is required to pay the proper duty in respect thereof to the Commissioner; and no Warrant or Letter of Appointment shall be issued or granted by the Responsible Officer of the Department to which such office shall be attached, or within whose control the same may be, until he has satisfied himself of the payment of such duty.

The Commissioner having been informed of certain cases in which officers have been promoted from one branch of the Service to another without proper Letters or Warrants of Appointment, and also of cases where Letters of Appointment had been issued without previous payment of the Stamp Duty, would draw attention to the circumstance that the appointees may thereby become liable to the penalties in the Statute for unstamped documents.

Heads of Departments are also informed that while no Stamp Duty is exigible on ordinary additions or increases to salaries, in every case where promotion takes place, duty is chargeable on any augmentation to salary.
