PROCLAMATION.

By His Honor James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

I, JAMES MACANDREW, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, do, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in the Superintendent of the Province of Otago in this behalf, by the "Roads Diversion Ordinance, 1873," and of the powers vested in me as Superintendent of the Province of Otago, hereby proclaim and declare that all those roads and all those portions of roads in the Province of Otago, mentioned and referred to in the said "Roads Diversion Ordinance, 1873," and particularly described in the Schedule hereto, shall, from and after the day of the date hereof, cease to be public roads or thoroughfares, and shall no longer form part of the public roads in the several Road Districts in the Province of Otago, mentioned in the Schedule to the said Ordinance annexed.

1. *Balmoral Road District.*

(1.) All that area in the Province of Otago containing by admeasurement 55a 1r 4p more or less being a road line situate in the Waitahuna West survey district: bounded towards the north-west by sections numbered 78 80 81 2 of 85 1 of 85 and 2 of 25 block III and 9 13 21 13 22 and 1 block IV fifty-five thousand two hundred and eighty (55280) links more or less and towards the south-east by the Waitahuna river fifty-five thousand two hundred and eighty (55280) links more or less.

(2.) LICENSING ACT, 1873.

THE attention of those persons who wish to obtain Publicans' or Bush Licenses, or the renewals of existing licenses, is drawn to section 13 of the said Act, published below for general information; and pending the proclamation of Districts by the Governor, they should lodge their applications on or before the 3rd day of March next, at the nearest Resident Magistrate's Court, as formerly:—

“Every person who shall desire to obtain a Publican's or Bush License, or the renewal of one under this Act, shall, on or before the first Tuesday in the month of March in every year, cause to be delivered to the Clerk to the Resident Magistrate of the district a notice in writing, signed by him, in the form in Schedule E, hereunto annexed, accompanied by a certificate signed by at least ten householders of the district, in the form contained in Schedule E, hereunto appended.”
