PROCLAMATION

Of Regulations for the depasturing of Stock within the Tuapeka Depasturing District.

By His Honor James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS Regulations have from time to time been made for the depasturing of stock within the Tuapeka Depasturing District, as provided for by the fourteenth section of "The Goldfields Act, 1866:" And whereas it is expedient to make further regulations for the depasturing of stock within the said district:

Now, therefore, I, James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province, do hereby, by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to the Executive Government of the said Province in this behalf by His Excellency the Governor-in-Council, under the authority of "The Gold Fields Act Amendment Act, 1867," and of every or any other power in any wise in this behalf enabling me, proclaim and declare that the Regulations following shall be Regulations for the depasturing of stock within the said Tuapeka District, in addition to those already in force.

DEPASTURING REGULATIONS.

Otago Gold Field—Tuapeka District.

1. No sheep shall be depastured within the District, unless a portion of the district be set aside for that purpose.
2. No bull over the age of six months, or entire horse over the age of twelve months, shall be depastured within the district without the consent in writing of a majority of the Wardens for that purpose first had and obtained.
3. It shall not be lawful to disturb unnecessarily any stock legally depasturing within the district.
4. It shall not be lawful to remove cattle above ten (10) in number, nor to drive above the same number from or through the district, unless the person or persons so doing shall have given to the Chairman of the Board of Wardens twenty-four hours previous notice of his or their intention so to do.
5. Any person or persons removing cattle from the District shall drive the cattle which he or they shall collect to the nearest stockyard, and there separate his or their cattle from the other cattle, and drive the latter back to the place from whence they were taken.
6. It shall be lawful for the Board of Wardens to authorise the mustering of stock illegally depasturing within the District, and the owner or owners of such

stock shall be held liable for the expenses incurred in mustering.

7. It shall be lawful for the Board of Wardens to authorise the impounding of stock illegally depasturing within the District.

8. No pigs or goats shall be allowed to be at large within the District.

PROCLAMATION

Of Regulation relating to applications for Agricultural Leases.

By His Honor James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by the thirty-ninth Section of "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time to make regulations prescribing the mode in which applications may be made for leases of land for agricultural purposes.

And whereas His Excellency the Governor did by a Proclamation issued under his hand and the seal of the Colony of New Zealand, bearing date the ninth day of July, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, delegate unto the Executive Government of the Province of Otago, his powers under the said thirty-ninth section of "The Gold Fields Act, 1866."

And whereas a Regulation has been made to the effect that every Application for an Agricultural Lease of Crown Lands must be for one or more sections as surveyed, and not for a portion or portions of a section or sections.

And whereas it is expedient to amend the said Regulation so that Applications for Agricultural Leases may be made for a portion or portions of a section or sections.

Now therefore, I, James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province, by virtue and in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," and of every or any other power in anywise in this behalf enabling me, do

hereby **revoke** Regulation numbered one (1) of the "Regulations relating to Agricultural Leases in the Otago Gold Field." And I do hereby proclaim, declare, and make the Regulation following in lieu thereof.

1. Application for Surveyed Land.

Every Application for an Agricultural Lease of Crown lands shall be in the form of the first Schedule hereto, or to the like effect. Every application for any such lease shall be lodged at such Warden's office as shall be appointed for that purpose, and copies of every such application must be posted and maintained by the applicant for fourteen days on boards standing not less than three feet above the surface of the ground, and erected one at each corner of the land applied for, and every such application shall be advertised twice by and at the expense of the applicant in such newspaper as the Warden may direct, and copies of the newspapers containing such advertisement shall be produced to the Warden at the time of hearing.

Under "The Protection of Animals Act."

WHEREAS, by the second section of "The Protection of Animals Act Amendment Act, 1868," it is enacted that no native game shall be hunted, shot, taken, or killed in any part of the Colony, except during such months as the Governor shall from time to time by Proclamation appoint, in reference to the respective descriptions of native game within the districts mentioned in any such Proclamation: And whereas His Excellency the Governor did, on the ninth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, delegate me, James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, all the powers vested by "The Protection of Animals Act, 1867," in the Governor, or the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, I, James Macandrew, as such Superintendent as aforesaid, acting under and by virtue of the powers vested in me by the said "Protection of Animals Act Amendment Act, 1868," do hereby proclaim and declare that I have appointed the months of April, May, June, and July to be the months within which native game shall be hunted, shot, taken, or killed within the Province of Otago (including the District of Southland), commencing on the first day of April next, and ending on the thirty-first day of July next.

WHEREAS by "The Licensing Act, 1873," it is amongst other things, enacted that the Governor shall, as soon as conveniently may be after the passing of the said Act, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, define such territorial divisions as he may think proper to be Licensing Districts for the purposes of the said Act, and from time to time may alter and re-define the boundaries of the same: And whereas it is also further enacted by the said act, that in the Proclamation declaring the said several districts, the Governor shall in each case declare the number of persons of whom the Licensing Court of such district shall consist, such number not being more than seven nor less than three:

Now therefore, I, Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance of the provisions of the hereinbefore cited Act, do hereby proclaim, constitute, and appoint that the several territorial divisions, the boundaries whereof are defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto, shall be Licensing Districts for the purposes of the said Act; also that each such district shall be known by the name by which it is designated in the said Schedule: And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the Licensing Court of each one of the districts hereby proclaimed, constituted, and appointed, shall consist of four Commissioners, inclusive of the Resident Magistrate, who shall at any time hereinafter be appointed by me, the Governor aforesaid, to carry into effect the provisions of the said Act within such district.

Given under the hand of His Excellency the Right Honorable Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, at Wellington, this twenty-third day of February, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four.

166. PAKAKAIO DISTRICT.

168. KAKANUI DISTRICT.

Bounded on the East and North-east by the Oamaru Town and the Oamaru Stream; on the North by the Papakaio District; on the West by the western boundary of the Kakanui Hundred; on the south by the southern boundary of the said Hundred to where it meets the Kuroo Stream, thence by that stream and the Kakanui River to the sea; and on the South-east by the sea.

* For places beyond the limits of any of the Districts herein defined, applications are to be made to the nearest Resident Magistrate or Licensing Court respectively.

169. MAEREWHENUA.

Bounded on the East by the Papakaio and Kakanui Districts, from the Waitaki River to the south-western corner of the Kakanui Hundred; thence on the South-east by a right line drawn to the summit of the Kakanui Peak; thence on the South-west and South by the Naseby District to Mount Ida; thence on the West by the west branch of the Otamakan River, and by that river to the Waitaki; and on the North by the Waitaki.

170. AHURIRI DISTRICT.

172. QUEENSTOWN DISTRICT.

Bounded on the East by the Cardrona District, the Arrow District, and the Clyde District; on the South-east by an imaginary line from Lorn Peak, on the Hector Mountains, running south-west to the Mataura River, at a point midway between Howell's Fords, on the road to Kingston; on the South-west by the boundary of the Otago Gold Fields. Excepting the Town of Queenstown District, herein next defined.

173. TOWN OF QUEENSTOWN DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North-west by Crown lands 3130 links, by Cemetery Reserve 2110 links, also by Crown lands 1930 links; towards the North-east by Crown lands 4920 links; towards the South-east by Crown lands, 1700 links; towards the South by Lake Wakatipu, 1500 links, be the same more or less; and towards the South-west by Crown lands, 1100 links.

174. ARROW DISTRICT.

Bounded on the East by the Cromwell District; on the South by the Clyde District on the North-west by an imaginary line from Ben Nevis on the Hector Mountains to the junction of the Shotover River with the Kawarau River, thence along the Shotover to the bridge at Foster's Ferry, thence due north to the Coronet Peak on the Harris Mountains, and thence to Mount Hyde and the boundary of the Cardrona District; and on the North-east by the Cardrona District.

175. CROMWELL DISTRICT.

Bounded on the South by the Clyde District; on the West by the Carrack Range to Kawarau River, thence by the Kirtle Burn to Queensberry Hill; on the North-west by an imaginary line from said hill to the head waters of Luggat Creek, thence by said Creek to Clutha River in a north-easterly direction to Trig Hill, thence in the same direction to the Lindis Burn, thence by the Lindis Pass, thence by the Longslip Creek to the boundary of the Otago Gold Fields; on the East by a line along the boundary of the Otago Gold Fields to Mount St. Bathans, thence along the Dunstan Range to the head waters of the Lauder Creek, and thence by the Blacks District, excepting the Town of Cromwell District herein next defined.

176. TOWN OF CROMWELL DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North by a line commencing on the west bank of the Clutha River and proceeding in a westerly direction, with a magnetic bearing of 260 degrees 25min. to the north-east corner of the Cemetery Reserve, 4100 links; thence along a line in the same direction, 7100 links; thence by a line at a right angle in a southerly direction, 6940 links; thence by a line at a right angle in an easterly direction to the Kawarau River, 4900 links; thence along the Kawarau and Clutha Rivers to the starting point, as delineated on the record map of the said town deposited in the Survey Office at Dunedin.

Bounded on the West and North-west by the Blacks and St. Bathans Districts; on the North by an imaginary line from Mount Ida due east to Kyeburn Hill; on the East by an imaginary line from Kyeburn Hill running south across the Macrewhenua Pass to Kakanui Mountains, and hence south-east along the watershed of those mountains to the Kakani Peak; on the South-east by an imaginary line from Kakanui Pass south-westerly to the Taieri River; thence to the hill known as Flat Cap, and thence to the South Rough Ridge Hill, on the boundary of the Blacks District.

180. OTEPOPO DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North-east and North by the Kakanui District, on the North-west by the Macrewhenua District; on the South-west by the North-eastern boundary of the Macraes District from the Kakanui Peak to Mount Fortune; thence on the South by a right line to the southernmost source of the Waianakarua River, by the southern branch of the said river to the sea; and on the East by the sea to north of the Kakanui River.

181. HAMPDEN DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North and North-west by the Otepopo District; on the South-west by the watershed of the Horse Range from Mount Fortune to the Kartigi Beach; and on the South-east and East by the sea to the mouth of the Waianakarua River.

182. PALMERSTON DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North-east by the Hampden District; on the West by the Macraes District from Mount Fortune to the Silver Peak Hill; on the South-east by a line drawn from the summit of the north-west point of the Silver Peak Hills to Mount Trotter, thence by Trotter Creek to Mount Royal, thence by Stony Creek to the sea; and on the East by the sea to the Kartigi Beach.

183. HAWKSURRY DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North-west by the Palmerston District from Stoney Creek to the Silver Peak Hills; thence by the south-eastern boundary of the Macraes District to the junction of the Sutton Stream and the Taieri River; towards the South-west by the Taieri River; towards the South by the North Taieri and Blueskin Districts to the sea; and towards the East by the sea from the Waihema Creek to the Stony Creek. Excepting the Town of West Hawksbury District herein next defined.

184. TOWN OF WEST HAWKSURRY DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North by the Main North Road, 4100 links; towards the East by the Government Township of Hawksbury, 8000 links; towards the South by land sold to John Jones, 2000 links; and towards the West by the other part of Section 15, Block VI., Hawksbury District aforesaid, 7500 links; be all the said linkages more or less, as the same is delineated in the map of the said Township of West Hawksbury, deposited in the office of the Registrar of Deeds at Dunedin.

185. MACRAES DISTRICT.

Bounded on the West by the Hyde District; on the North-west by the Naseby District; on the North-east by the boundary line of the Otago Gold Fields along the Kakanui Range to Mount Fortune; on the East by the said boundary line of the Otago Gold Fields to the north-

187. TEVIOT DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by the Alexandra District; on the East by a line from South Rough Ridge Hill along the boundary of the Mount Benger Gold Field to Lammerlaw, thence to the head waters of the Taller Burn; on the South by the said burn to the Clutha; on the West by the Clutha River to a point opposite Spylaw, thence by a line due west to Spylaw and along the Spylaw Burn to the junction of the Pommelhawk, thence by the Pommelhawk River to a point opposite Whitecomb, thence by a line to Whitecomb, thence by the Whitecomb Creek to the Waikia, thence by a line to the Titan Rocks, thence to the Remarkable Gap, thence to Rocky Mount, and thence to the Obelisk.

188. ALEXANDRA DISTRICT.

Bounded on the West by the Clyde District; on the North by the Clyde District and the road leading to Dunedin across the Rock and Pillar to a point where it crosses the Raggedy Range; on the North-east by an imaginary line from said point to South Rough Ridge Hill; on the South by an imaginary line from South Rough Ridge Hill due west to Cairn Hill, and thence to Obelisk.

189. CLYDE DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North by an imaginary line from Ben Nevis on the Hector Mountains due East to the Carrick Range, thence to Cairn Muir Hill, thence to the Clutha River; on the North-west by the Leaning Rock Creek, and from the head waters thereof to the Leaning Rock; on the North-east by a line from Leaning Rock to the head waters of the Chatto Creek; on the East by Chatto Creek and Manuherikia River to the Dunedin Road leading across to the Rock and Pillar; on the South by an imaginary line from said road due west to the Clutha River, and thence to McLellan's Gully, thence by a line due south to the obelisk, and thence by a line due west to the Lorn Peak on the Hector Mountains, thence along the Hector Mountains to Ben Nevis, the starting point. Excepting the Town of Clyde District, herein next defined.

190. TOWN OF CLYDE DISTRICT.

Bounded by a line proceeding from the North-west corner of Section numbered 1, Block I.; leaving Rock Survey District in a south-easterly direction along the boundary of the said Block I.; leaving Rock Survey District 12848 links, thence in a south-westerly direction along the boundary line of the said Block I.; leaving Rock Survey District to the Clutha River, thence in a north-westerly direction along the bank of the Clutha River to a point bearing 227 degrees from the North-west corner of Section numbered 1, Block I.; leaving Rock Survey District aforesaid, and thence in a direct line to the starting point.

191. SWITZERS DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by the Teviot District; on the North-east by the Hindon District; on the South-east by the Outram and Waipori Districts to the Tokomairiro River; thence along the North-western boundary of the North Tokomairiro Hundred to Lovell's Creek; on the South-west by Lovell's Creek to Mount Stuart, thence by an imaginary line running north-west to the Waitahuna River; and thence in same direction to Crook Burn; on the South by the Crook Burn to its junction with the

Clutha River; on the West by the River Clutha to the junction of the Black Clough Burn therewith, thence by the Black Clough Burn to the summit on the Tapanui Range, thence by an imaginary line along the watershed of said range to Spylaw Hill, on the boundary of the Teviot District. Excepting the Town of Lawrence District herein next defined.

193. TOWN OF LAWRENCE DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North by Crown lands, 7431 links; towards the East by Crown lands, 6913 links; towards the South by Crown lands, 5945 links, also 500 links; towards the South-west by Crown lands, 4000 links, also 2000 links; and towards the North-west by Crown lands, 500 links, also 3670 links, and intersected by the Tuapeka and Weatherston Creeks, all of which said lands are contained within and known as the Township of Lawrence, and are more particularly delineated on the record map of the said township deposited at the office of the Chief Surveyor, Dunedin.

194. HINDON DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by the Hyde and Macraes Districts; on the North-east and East by the Taieri River from the junction of the Sutton Stream therewith, to the junction of the Lees Stream therewith; thence along that last named stream to its most southerly source; thence by a right line to the summit of the nearest peak of the Lammerlaw Ranges; thence along those ranges to the Lammerlaw Mountain in the boundary of the Teviot District.

195. TAIERI DISTRICT.

198. NORTH-EAST VALLEY DISTRICT.

199. TOWN OF PORT CHALMERS DISTRICT.

Bounded to the North by Sections 46, 58, 59, 63, 64, 65, and 99, Block VI., and Section 4, Block VII., Town District, and the Main South Road to Cemetery Reserve; thence by the Town Belt to the Anderson's Bay Road; thence on the East by the said road to the north angle of Section 69, Block VII., Town District; thence on the South by the said Section 69; thence on the East by Sections 69 and 82, Block VII., and that line continued to the sea beach; thence on the South by the sea beach to road line continued south from Section 32, Ocean Beach District; thence on the West by the said Sections 23, 22, and 21, and a direct line from northern angle of Section 21, Ocean Beach District, to south-west angle of Section 28, Block VI., Town District; thence by said Section 28 to the Main South Road; thence on the South by the Main South Road to Section 45 of the said Block VI.; thence on the West by the said Section 45 and 31, Lower Kaikorai, to point of commencement.

204. MORNINGTON DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North-west by part of Block V., Lower Kaikorai Survey District, and Sections 50, 49, and 48, Block VI., Town Survey District; towards the South by Sections 42, 41, 38, 37, 34, 33, 31, 30, 27, 26, 23, 22, 19, 18, 11, 10, 9, 8, 7, 6, and 5, Block VI., Town Survey District, to Section 4, Block VI., Town Survey District; thence towards the South-west by Section 5, Block VI., Town Survey District, to Main South Road; thence towards the South by the Main South Road to the Dunedin Town Belt; towards the East by the Dunedin Town Belt; and towards the North-east by the boundary line between Sections 86 and 87, Block VI., Town District, and a continuation of that line to the southern angle of Section 6, Block V., Lower Kaikorai Survey District.

205. CITY OF DUNEDIN—SOUTH WARD DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the N.N.W. and W.N.W. by suburban lands, part of Block No. 1, Upper Kaikorai District; towards the N.N.E. from the Town Belt boundary by the prolongation of the centre of Argyle Street from its intersection with Heriot Row, Constitution and Elder

Streets; towards the N.N.W., E.N.E., and N.N.E. by the centre of Elder Street, part of Pitt Street, and Frederick Street, from the aforesaid intersection at Argyle Street to and including its prolongation through the harbour reclamation to the harbour; towards the S.E. by the harbour; towards the S.S.W., S.S.E., and S.S.W. by High Ward District.

208. CITY OF DUNEDIN—LEITH WARD DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the W.N.W., N.N.W., and W.N.W. by suburban lands, part of Blocks Nos. 1 and 8, Upper Kaikorai District; towards the N.N.E. by suburban lands, part of Blocks IX. and X., North Harbour and Blueskin District and North-east Valley District; towards the E.S.E. by suburban lands, part of Block No. IX., North Harbour and Blueskin District, and the harbour; towards the S.E. by the harbour; towards the S.S.W., W.S.W., S.S.E., and S.S.W. by Bell Ward District.

209. ROSLYN DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the N.W. by Section 10, Block III., and 17, 16, 15, 14, 13, 12, 11, and 10, Block IV., Upper Kaikorai Survey District, and Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 Block V., Lower Kaikorai Survey District; towards the South-west by a direct line from the southern angle of Section 6, Block V., Lower Kaikorai Survey District, to the Dunedin Town Belt, at the southern angle of Sections 87, Block VI., Town District; and towards the North-east by Section 5, Block I., and Sections 3, 5, and 7, Block III., Upper Kaikorai Survey District.

210. KAIKORAI DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North and North-west by the watershed of Abbot's Creek and Kaikorai Stream and the Half-way Bush District; towards the South-east and South by the Roslyn, Mornington, and Suburban Districts; and on the South and West by the Main South Road.

Bounded towards the North-west by the Taieri River; towards the North-east by the Grey District, Sections 2 of 24, 19, and Block III., Otakia Survey District; towards the South-east by the Sea; and towards the South-west of the Taieri River.

215. OUTRAM DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North-west by Waipori Lake, the Lea Canal and Maungatua subdivision to the boundary of hundreds, and thence by the boundary of hundreds to the Lees Stream, and by that stream to its junction with the Taieri River; towards the South-east by the Taieri River; and towards the West by the Waipori River and Lake.

216. WAIPORI DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North-west by the north-western

boundaries of the West Taieri and North Tokomairiro Hundreds; towards the North-east by the north-eastern boundaries of Sections 9, Block VIII., Maungatua Survey District, and 17 irregular Block, and 7, Block VI., West Taieri Survey District; thence by the south-eastern boundaries of Sections 7, 8, 9, 10, and 11, Block VI. aforesaid; thence by Sections 5, Block VI., and 11, Block II., West Taieri Survey District; thence by Block III., Maungatua Survey District, by the Lea Canal, the Waipori and Waiholā Lakes, and the north-western boundaries of Blocks XVIII. and VIII., Waiholā Survey District, to the Main South Road, and by the Main South Road to the south-western boundary of Section 9, Block I., Waiholā Survey District; towards the South-west by the north-eastern boundaries of Sections 10, 3, and 2, said Block I.; and towards the North-west and West by Application 2130; thence by Block I., Table Hill Survey District, to the north branch of the Tokomairiro River, and by the said river to the north-western boundary of North Tokomairiro Hundred.

217. WAIHOLA DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North-west by the Waiholā Lake and the Waipori District; towards the East by the Taieri River and the sea; towards the South and South-west by the Glenledi and Tokomairiro Districts.

218. GLENLEDI DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North by the Clarendon Survey District; towards the South-east by the sea; towards the South-west by the Tokomairiro River; and towards the West and North-west by Tokomairiro District.

219. TOWN OF MILTON DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North-west by a line commencing at the western corner of Section 134, Block XVII., Tokomairiro Survey District, proceeding in a north-easterly direction along the Main South Road 1003 links, thence crossing the Main South Road at a right angle in a north-westerly direction to a point 214 links distant from the north-western side of the Main South Road, thence at a right angle in a north-easterly direction 235 links, thence at a right angle in a north-westerly direction 346 links, thence at a right angle in a north-easterly direction 1662 links, thence at a right angle in a south-easterly direction 310 links, to a point 250 links distant from the Main South Road, and thence at a right angle in a north-easterly direction across Sections 131 and 130, Block XVI., of the said district 3030 links; thence crossing the District Road in the same direction to section 102, Block XII., of the said District, 60 links; thence at a right angle along the north-eastern boundary of the said road line in a north-westerly direction, 300 links; thence at a right angle in a north-easterly direction across Section 102, said Block XII., 1500 links; thence at a right angle in a south-easterly direction, 550 links, to the Main South Road; thence in a south-westerly direction along the Main South Road, crossing the District Road, to the eastern corner of Section 130, said Block XVI., 1560 links; thence crossing the Main South Road at a right angle to the northern corner of Section 135, said Block XVII.; thence along the north-east boundary of the said Section numbered 135, 2170 links, to Section 136; thence along the north-western boundary of Section 136 to Section 137, 2600 links; thence along the north-eastern boundary of Section 137 in a south-easterly direction, 875 links, to Section 138; thence along the north-western boundary of Section 138 to a district road line along Tokomairiro River bank, 4450 links; thence in a north-western direction along the said road line, 4500 links, to the starting point.

220. KAITANGATA DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North-east by the Tokomairiro River and Survey District; towards the South-east by the sea; towards the West by the Matau River and Kaitangata Creek to the north-west angle of Section 3, Block I., South Tuakitoto Survey District; thence on the North-west by a boundary line between Sections 3 and 4, said Block I., and said line continued to the watershed; thence by the said watershed to Two Stone Hill; thence by a straight line to Trig. Station J; thence by the eastern boundaries of Blocks V. and II., and by Sections 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, and 33, Block I., Kaitangata Survey District.

221. CRICHTON DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North by the watershed west of

Lovell's Creek, the Main South Road, and Southbridge subdivision; towards the South-east by Kaitangata District; and towards the South and West by the Kaitangata and Tuakitoto Lakes, Section 3, Block X., Tuakitoto Survey District, and Sections 7, 8, 16, 15, and 14, Block I., Hillend Survey District; and towards the West by the Main South Road to Trig. Station D, thence by the road line along the watershed through Blocks VI., III., and XI., Hillend Survey District, to the south-eastern corner of Block III., Waitahuna East Survey District.

222. MATAU DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North by Balmoral and Crichton Districts; towards the East by Tuakitoto Lake, Kaitangata Lake, and their outlet to the Matau branch of the Clutha River, thence by the Matau; and towards the West by the Koau branch of the Clutha River; towards the South-west by the Koau branch of the Matau to its junction with the Town of Balclutha.

223. TOKOMAIRIRO DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North-east by Waipori District and by Glenavon subdivision; towards the South-east by the south-eastern boundary of Block II., Akatore Survey District, Sections 14, 13, and 31, Block I., Akatore Survey District; towards the East by Sections 31, 32, 33, and 23, Block I., Akatore aforesaid, and Section 29, Block VI., said district; towards the South-west by Kaitangata and Crichton Districts; and towards the North-west by the Mount Stuart District.

224. MOUNT STUART DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North and West by the Waitahuna East Survey District, southern boundary of Table Hill Survey District to the boundary of hundreds, and thence by said boundary to the north branch of the Tokomairiro River; towards the East and South-east by the north branch of the said river and Tokomairiro District; towards the South and West by the Crichton District.

225. BALMORAL DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North-east by the boundary of hundreds; towards the East by the Crichton District; towards the South by the Main South Road and the Town of Balclutha; towards the South-west by the Clutha River.

226. TOWN OF BALCLUTHA DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North by the Clutha River, 3500 links; towards the West by Block numbered II., Hillend District, 1300 links; towards the North by other part of the said section numbered 44, 2400 links; towards the North-east by other part of the said section numbered 44, 4000 links and 4200 links, also by the Clutha River, 1200 links; towards the South-east by section numbered 43, Block I., Hillend District, and a road line, 1200 links; towards the South and South-east by the Clutha River, 10,200 links; towards the South-west by a road line 2520 links; and towards the North-west by Section numbered 9, Block XXXV., Clutha District, and a road line 5610 links.

227. SOUTH MOLYNEUX DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the north and north-west by run 129 and the Puerua Stream and the boundary line between blocks 16 and 12, Clutha Survey Districts, continued to the Clutha River; towards the East and South-east by the Clutha river and the sea; towards the West by the boundary line of Woodland Survey District and its continuation due north to Run 129.

228. CLUTHA DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North and North-west by Winton and Popotunoa Districts; towards the East by the Clutha River; towards the South by South Molyneux District and the Puerua Stream to its source; thence by a direct line to the Waiwera river; and towards the West by the Waiwera river.

229. CLINTON DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North-east by Popotunoa District; towards the East by the Clutha District; towards the South-west by the boundary of the hundreds; and towards the north-west by the boundary of the hundreds.

230. POPOTUNOA DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North and East by the Pomahaka and Clutha Rivers; towards the South by the Main

South Road to Wairuna Stream; thence to the Lake Road by the Wairuna Stream; and towards the West by the Wairuna Stream.

231. CLYDEVALE DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North-east by Black Cleugh Burn and the Clutha River; on the East by the West Clutha Hundred; on the south by the Pomahaka river; and on the West by the Rankle Burn and Mount Valpy summits.

232. WENDON DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North and North-east by the Otago Gold Fields and the Clydevale, Pomahaka, and Clinton Districts; towards the south by a straight line running due west from the south-western corner of the Clinton District to the water shed of the Waikaka River; towards the South-west by the summit of the eastern watershed of the Waikaka River to the Black Umbrella Mountain.

233. CATLIN'S DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North by a straight line running due east from the watershed of the Waikaka River to the south-western corner of the Clinton District; towards the North-east by the Clinton, Clutha, and South Molyneux Districts; towards the south-east by the sea from the south-western corner of the South Molyneux District to Chasland's Mistake; and towards the South-west by a straight line to the summit of Blackhorn Hill, thence by the summit of the range leading to Bleak Hill, thence by a straight line to the summit of Cairn Hill, thence by a straight line to the source of the Kaiwera Creek and by that creek to the Main South Road, and thence by the summit of the eastern boundary of the watershed of the Waikaka rivers.

234. MATAURA DISTRICT.

Bounded on the East by the watershed of the Waikaka and Pukerau Rivers; on the South by the main road and Tuturau Hundred; on the West by the Mataura River; and on the North and North-west by Runs 193 and 175B.

235. SOUTH MATAURA DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by Mataura District; on the East by the Kaiwera and a line to Cairn Peak, and a line from thence through Chimney Peak due south to the boundary of Run 162, thence by the watershed to Blackhorn, thence by a line to Chasland's Mistake; on the South by the sea; and on the West by the Mataura.

236. ONE-TREE POINT DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by the north boundary of Blocks VII. and VIII., I. and II., and VII., Oteramika Hundred; on the East by the Mataura; on the South by the sea; and on the West by the west boundary of the Oteramika Road District.

236. LOTHIAN DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by the Mabel and Waimumu Districts; on the East by the Mataura; and on the South and West by the One-Tree Point and Myross Districts.

238. MYROSS DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by the Makarewa; on the West by the west boundary of Sections 59, 50, 49, and Bush Reserve, Block X., Sections 25, 13, and 12, Block IX., and Section 1, Block IX., Sections 34, 21, and 6, Block IV., Invercargill Hundred; on the South by the Waihopai and the north boundary of Blocks VII. and VIII., Invercargill Hundred; and on the East and North-east by the east and north-east boundaries of the Invercargill Hundred.

239. MABEL DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North-west by the Makarewa; on the North by the north boundary of Block I., Forest Hill and the Hedgehope; on the East by the east boundary of the Forest Hill and Mabel Hundreds; on the South by the road from Invercargill to Dunedin; and on the South-west by the north-east boundary of the Invercargill Hundred.

240. WAIMUMU DISTRICT.

Bounded on the West by the Forest Hill Hundred and the Mabel Hundred; on the South by the Dunedin road and the north boundary of Block XXXV., and Sections 9, 11, 12, and 14, Block III., Lothian Hundred, the north boundary of Mataura Hundred, the north boundary of

Block LVII.; on the East by the Mataura and the west boundary of Run 116; on the North by the north boundary of the Waimumu Hundred.

241. TARINGATURA DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by a line due west from the junction of the Paikerewao with the Mataura till it cuts the bush, thence by the north-east face of the bush to the north-west boundary of the late Province of Southland; on the North-west and North by the north-west and north boundary of the said late Province; on the West by the west boundary of Runs 188 and 198; on the South and again on the West by the Aparima River; on the South by the north boundary of the hundreds; and on the East by the Mataura River.

242. WAKATIPU DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North-west by the boundary of the late Province of Southland; on the North-east and East by the Mataura; and on the South by the Taringatura District.

243. TE ANAU DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by the north boundary of the late Province of Southland; on the West by the Waiau; on the South by the Waiau District; and on the East by Runs 188, 198, and 187.

244. WAIU DISTRICT.

Bounded on the West by the Waiau; on the South by Aparima Hundred and Longwood District; on the East by the Aparima River; and on the North by the Waiau River from the most northern corner of Run No. 413 to its junction with the Waicoe Creek, thence by that creek to its source, thence by a line to the most northerly source of the Wairaki River, thence by that river to the western boundary of Run No. 187, thence by that boundary to the Aparima River, and thence by that river to its junction with the Braxtonburn.

245. MOUNT PLEASANT DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by a due east and west line (true bearing) on transit with Trigonometrical Station V. on Woody Knoll; on the East by the Aparima River; on the South by part of the Jacob's River Hundred; on the West by a due north and south line (true bearing) in transit with the top of Ferndunlaw Hill.

246. OREPUKI DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by an east and west line from Ferndunlaw to the Waiau; on the West by the Waiau; on the South-west and South by the sea; and on the East by Jacob's River Hundred.

247. LONGWOOD DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by an east and west line north of the bend of the river in Section 46, Block III., Jacob's River Hundred; on the West by the west boundary of the Jacob's River Hundred; on the South by the sea; and on the North and East by the sea, Jacob's River Estuary, and the Pourapourakino River.

248. JACOB'S RIVER DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by the north boundary of the hundred; on the East by the Jacob's River; on the South and South-west by the estuary and the Longwood District; on the West by the west boundary of the Jacob's River Hundred.

249. TOWN OF RIVERTON DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North-east by Block VI., Jacob's River Survey District; towards the South-east by the Maori Reserve; and towards the West by Jacob's River Estuary.

250. SOUTH RIVERTON TOWN DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North and East by the sea and Jacob's River Estuary; on the South and East by the south-eastern boundary of Section 3, Block II., Jacob's River Hundred; on the South and West by the south-western boundary of Sections 9 and 13, Block II., and 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7, Block I., Jacob's River Hundred; and on the North-west by the north-western boundary of Section 7, Block I., Jacob's River Hundred aforesaid.

251. WAIMATUKU DISTRICT.

Bounded on the West by the Jacob's River; on the

East by the east boundary of the Jacob's River Hundred; and on the South by the sea.

252. NEW RIVER DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by north boundary of New River Hundred; on the East by the Oreti; on the West by the Waimatuku; and on the South by a due west line from the junction of the Oreti and Makarewa to the ocean beach.

253. HEDDON BUSH DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by a due east and west line (true bearing) in transit with Trigonometrical Station V., on Woody Knoll; on the East by the Oreti River; on the South by the New River Hundred; and on the North by the Aparima River.

254. WINTON DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by the north boundary of Winton and Forest Hill Hundred; on the East by the Waimumu Hundred; on the South by the Hedgehope and the north boundary of Block I., Forest Hill Hundred, continued west to meet the south boundary of Winton Hundred, thence by the said south boundary of the Winton Hundred; and on the West by the Oreti River.

255. WALLACE TOWN DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by the north boundary of the New River Hundred and a line in continuation thereof to the Makarewa; on the South-east and South by the Makarewa; and on the West by the Oreti River.

256. WAIKEWI DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by an east and west line from the junction to the sea beach and the Makarewa; on the East by the east boundary of the Waikewi Road District; on the South by the Waihopai and the New River Estuary; and on the South-west by the sea.

257. WAIHOPAI DISTRICT.

Bounded on the South by the road forming the north boundary of the Town of Invercargill; on the West by the west boundary of Section 1, Block I., Invercargill Hundred; on the South by the road from Invercargill to Dunedin; on the East by the west boundary of Block II., Invercargill Hundred; and on the North and West by the Waihopai and New River Estuary.

258. TOWN OF INVERCARGILL DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by Sections 27 and Park Reserve, Block I., Invercargill Hundred; on the East by Sections 1, 14, and 8, Block I., Invercargill Hundred; on the South by Section 1, Block III., Invercargill Hundred; and on the West by the New River Estuary.

259. APPELBY DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by the Waihopai District and the Town of Invercargill; on the West by the Town of Invercargill and New River Estuary; on the South by south boundary of Invercargill Hundred; and on the East by the east boundary of Block II., Invercargill Hundred, continued south to meet the south boundary.

260. CAMPBELLTOWN DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by Appleby District; on the North by the New River Estuary; on the West by the Foveaux Straits; on the South by the sea; and on the East by the east boundary of the Campbelltown Road District.

261. TOWNSHIP OF CAMPBELLTOWN DISTRICT.

Being all that portion of Campbelltown Hundred known as the Township of Campbelltown.

262. STEWART'S ISLAND DISTRICT.

Comprises Stewart's Island, Solanders' Island, Ruapuke Island, and other islands adjacent thereto.

263. CHATHAM ISLANDS DISTRICT.

Comprises the group known as "The Chatham Islands."
