PROCLAMATION.

Cancellation of Lease to Depasture Stock on certain Crown Lands in the Province of Otago.

By His Honour James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, in Council.

WHEREAS by the sixteenth section of the "Gold Fields Act, 1866," it is enacted that when any Gold Mine or Gold Field shall be discovered and proclaimed upon any Crown Lands, which at the date of the passing of the said Act shall have been held under license or lease for depasturing purposes, it should be lawful for the Governor, at his discretion, to cancel the license or lease under which such land shall have been held in occupation, as regards the whole or any part of the lands so held under such license or lease, or with the concurrence of the licensee, or lessee, to suspend such lease or license as regards the whole or any part of such lands: And whereas Thomas Dick, Esquire, then Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to and vested in him in that behalf, did, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of the said Province, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, constitute and appoint all the territory therein described, including amongst other lands the lands hereinafter described to be a Gold Field under the provisions of the "Gold Fields Act, 1866," to be called "Otago Gold Field:" And whereas by the "Gold Fields Act Amendment Act, 1867," it is enacted that within any Province in which by any Act or Ordinance it is provided that the Superintendent shall, in the administration of the Government thereof, act by and with the advice and consent of an Executive Council, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand, and under the public seal of the Colony, from time to time as occasion may require, to delegate to the Executive Government for the time being, of such Province, subject or not to any restrictions or limitations as he may think fit, all or any of such powers vested in the Governor, or the Governor in Council, by the "Gold Fields Act, 1866," as under, or by virtue of the one hundred and ninth section of the said Act may be delegated by the Governor in Council, and in like manner to revoke any such delegation: And whereas by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, intituled the "Executive Council Ordinance, 1861," it is provided that the Superintendent of the said Province shall, in the administration of the Government thereof, act by and with the advice and consent of an Executive Council: And whereas the Governor hath, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, and in pur-

suance of the power and authority for that purpose vested in him by the "Gold Fields Act, 1866," and subject to its provisions, delegated unto the Executive Government for the time being of the Province of Otago, all such powers vested in the Governor, or the Governor in Council, by the said last-mentioned Act, as under or by virtue of the one hundred and ninth section of the said last-mentioned Act, may be delegated by the Governor in Council, to have, hold, and exercise the said powers within the said Province of Otago: And whereas the said lands hereinafter described are Crown Lands, subject to be dealt with under the provisions of the said sixteenth section of the "Gold Fields Act, 1866," and the said lands are now, or lately were, held in occupation by Mr Joseph Clarke under a lease for depasturing purposes, issued under the "Otago Waste Lands Act, 1866:" And whereas the Executive Government of the Province of Otago have determined to cancel the said lease as to so much and such part of the lands held under the same as are comprised within the area hereinafter described:

Now, therefore, I, James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province, and by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to the Executive Government of the said Province in this behalf by His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand in Council, under the authority of the "Gold Fields Act Amendment Act, 1867," and of any and every other power in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby cancel the said lease, in so far as the lands comprised within the area hereinafter described are affected by the said lease, but no further or otherwise (that is to say)—all that parcel of land in the Province of Otago, containing by estimation one hundred and seventeen (117) acres more or less, situated in block six (VI.) Benger District, and being part of Run numbered two hundred and fifteen (215), and extending along the Clutha River between the township of Ettrick and block numbered two (II.), Benger District, bounded as follows, that is to say:—towards the north-west, by the town of Ettrick, one hundred and seventy (170) links; towards the north-east, by the Clutha River, thirty-one thousand seven hundred (31,700) links; towards the south, by the said block numbered two (II.), five hundred and forty-nine (549) links; and towards the south-west, by a road line, thirty-one thousand five hundred and forty-five (31,545) links.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Honor James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

I. JAMES MACANDREW, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, do, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in the Superintendent of the Province of Otago in this behalf, by the "Roads Diversion Ordinance 1873," and of the powers vested in me as Superintendent of the Province of Otago, hereby proclaim and declare that all those roads and all those portions of roads in the Province of Otago, mentioned and referred to in the said "Roads Diversion Ordinance, 1873," and particularly described in the Schedule hereto, shall, from and after the day of the date hereof, cease to be public roads or thoroughfares, and shall no longer form part of the public roads in the Road District in the Province of Otago, mentioned in the Schedule to the said Ordinance annexed.

(1) All that area in the Province of Otago containing by admeasurement, Or. 1r. 23r. more or less, being a road-line situate in the North-Harbor and Blueskin District; bounded towards the north-east by section numbered 1 block X seven hundred and ninety (790) links more or less, and towards the south-west by section numbered 7 and part 6 block VIII Lower Kaikorai District, seven hundred and ninety (790) links more or less.

AGRICULTURAL LEASES REGULATIONS.

J. MACANDREW, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

AT the Provincial Government Buildings, Dunedin, the 20th day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four. Present—His Honor the Superintendent; George Turnbull and Horace Bastings, Esquires, Members of the Executive Council of the Province of Otago, being also Members of the Provincial Council of the said Province.

Whereas, by the thirty-ninth section of "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor, from time to time, to make Regulations prescribing (amongst other things) the mode in which applications may be made for leases of land for agricultural purposes, and such Regulations from time to time to amend, alter, and revoke: And whereas the Governor in Council has, under his hand and the public seal of the Colony, delegated unto the Executive Government of the Province of Otago his powers under the said thirty-ninth section of The Gold Fields Act, 1866: And whereas, by an order in Council bearing date the eighth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, and published in the Otago Provincial Government Gazette No. 772, on the ninth day of January one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, certain regulations were made for the purposes specified in the said thirty-ninth section of the said Act. And, whereas by a proclamation bearing date the twenty-eighth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, and published in the Otago Provincial Government Gazette, No. 896, on the fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, Regulation No. (1) of the said Regulations so made by the said Order in Council as aforesaid was revoked and another regulation was made in lieu thereof. And whereas it is expedient to revoke the said last-sustained regulation and to make the regulations hereinafter contained in lieu thereof and also of said regulation No. one (1) of the said regulations so made by the said Order in Council as aforesaid. Now therefore His Honor James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province, and by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to the Executive Government of the said Province in this behalf by the Governor in Council under the authority of the "Gold Fields Act Amendment Act 1867" and of any and every other power in any wise enabling him in this behalf doth hereby order that the said regulation so made by the said proclamation of the twenty-eighth day of February one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four as aforesaid shall from and after the day of the date hereof be revoked and with the advice and consent aforesaid and by virtue and in exercise of the powers aforesaid doth hereby make the regulation following prescribing the mode in which applications may be made for leases of land for agricultural purposes in lieu thereof

And doth declare that the regulations hereby made shall form part of and be read and construed with the regulations made by the said Order in Council of the eighth day of December one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one in lieu of regulation Number one of the said regulations.

1. *Application for Lease.*

Every application for an agricultural lease shall be in the form in the first schedule to the Regulations relating to Agricultural Leases in the Otago Gold Fields made by the order in Council of the eighth day of December one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, or to the like effect; and every such application shall be lodged at such Warden's office as shall be appointed for that purpose, and copies of every such application must be posted and maintained by the applicant for fourteen days on boards standing not less than three feet above the surface of the ground, and erected one at each corner of the land applied for; and every such application shall be advertised twice by and at the expense of the applicant in such newspaper as the Warden may direct, and copies of the newspapers containing such advertisement shall be produced to the Warden at the time of hearing.

REGULATIONS AND BYE-LAWS.

MOERAKI HUNDRED.

1. One head of great cattle to be allowed for every twenty acres owned or occupied. No small cattle to be depastured on the Hundred.
2. Residents in township of Hampden who have taken licenses to be allowed to depasture one head of great cattle for every acre or part of an acre of township land owned or occupied. No cattle being driven from one district to another will be allowed to depasture on the unenclosed lands of the township of Hampden.

3. Whenever it shall appear to the Wardens, or a majority of them, that any beast of a dangerous or vicious character, or from any other cause, they may deem it advisable to prohibit any such beast from depasturing on the Hundred; and no entire animal over the age of six months, excepting horses, and no entire horses over the age of twelve months, shall be depastured on the Hundred, without the consent, in writing of the Wardens, or a majority of them.

4. Any person or persons offending against the above Bye-laws shall be liable to a penalty of any sum not exceeding five pounds.

5. All or any of the acts authorized by these Bye-laws to be done by a Warden or Wardens, may be done by any Ranger or other person duly appointed by them, or authorized in that behalf.

WAIKOUAITI HUNDRED.

At a meeting held by the Wardens of the above Hundred, on the 18th February, 1874, it was agreed—

1. The number of cattle which the Hundred is capable of depasturing is computed at 290 great cattle, or 1495 small cattle, exclusive of the number which may be depastured free.

2. The portion of land set apart for depasturing small cattle shall be that part of the Hundred east of the Main Road. Great cattle may be depastured on the remainder of the Hundred.

3. The number of stock which may be depastured by each license-holder within the Hundred (exclusive of those entitled to depasture free) is as follows:—

Bye Laws.

1. No person shall disturb or harass cattle lawfully depasturing upon the Hundred, provided always that any person holding a license to depasture cattle within the Hundred, or any person duly authorised by him, may drive such cattle for the purpose of collecting such as may belong to him, and for the legitimate use of the right of pasturage within the Hundred: but in case it should be necessary for such purpose to drive any cattle belonging to any other person a greater distance than half a mile, the person so driving such cattle must take them to the nearest available stockyard, and there separate his own cattle from those of other persons, and return the latter to the place from whence they were driven.

2. Any person removing cattle from the Hundred shall give notice in writing of number and description of the same to the nearest Warden.

3. Any person offending against any of the foregoing

bye laws shall forfeit any sum not exceeding five pounds for every such offence.

WEST TAIERI HUNDRED.

3. No diseased cattle shall be depastured upon the Hundred, nor pigs or goats. Any person who shall depasture diseased cattle, pigs, or goats shall be liable to a penalty of (£5) Five pounds.

4. In the event of scab breaking out on any sheep on this Hundred, the Waste Land Board, with the Government Inspector, shall take steps to eradicate and prevent spread of disease.

6. No entire animal above six months old, except rams put to the ewes in season, and no animal of a vicious or otherwise objectionable character, shall be depastured. Any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty of £5.

7. All unbranded cattle above six months old depasturing on this Hundred shall be impounded, in manner provided by section 125 of the Otago Waste Lands Act, 1872.

8. Any cattle found depasturing on this Hundred, not being the property of or in the custody of a license-holder, or depasturing on the Hundred in contravention of these regulations, may be impounded, and the owner or custodian of such cattle shall pay the sum of (£5) five pounds for each offence.

9. Any person disturbing cattle, great or small, on this Hundred shall be liable to a penalty of £5: Provided always that any license-holder may drive cattle so depastured for the purpose of collecting such of them as may belong to him, and for the legitimate use of the right to depasture within the Hundred; but in case it should be necessary for such purpose to drive any cattle belonging to any other person a greater distance than one mile, the person so driving such cattle must take them to the nearest stockyard, and there separate his own cattle from those of other persons, and return the latter to the place whence they were driven.

10. No person shall remove cattle from beyond the boundary of any Hundred, other than those belonging to him, or for the removal of which he shall have authority from the majority of the Wardens, under a penalty of £20.

11. Any person shooting cattle on this Hundred, without the consent in writing of the Waste Land Board, previously obtained, shall be liable to a penalty of £20, to be recovered in a summary way.

TUTURAU HUNDRED.

Each license-holder shall be entitled to depasture at the rate of one and a half head of great cattle, or seven and a half head of sheep, for every hundred acres occupied by him or her.

No person shall harass or disturb stock depasturing on the Hundred; and any person driving stock for the purpose of separating them from those wanted, shall take them to the nearest stockyard (available), and then return all stock not their own to where driven from.

MOKORETA HUNDRED.

1. The number of cattle to be allowed to be depastured on the Mokoreta Hundred in 1874 shall be not more than two hundred head of great cattle, or one thousand small cattle.

2. Every license-holder shall be entitled to depasture one head of great cattle on the Waste Lands within the Hundred in 1874, for any acreage of land which he may own or occupy up to one hundred and forty acres; and one additional head of great cattle for every additional one hundred and forty acres that he may own or occupy.

TOITOTES HUNDRED.

1. That the Waste Lands within the Hundred are capable of depasturing 2410 head of great cattle.

2. That License Holders shall be entitled to depasture on payment at the rate of one head of great cattle for each ten acres owned or occupied.

3. That the boundaries of the Waste Lands within the Hundred shall be the boundaries within which either large or small cattle may be depastured at the option of License holder.

Bye Laws.

1. No cattle of any description shall be depastured on the common Waste Lands within the Hundred except by License holders and in accordance with the regulations.

2. All license holders shall on or before the 13th day of April, 1874, make to the nearest warden a return as provided for in the 130th section of the Otago Waste Lands Act, 1872,

3. Any one whether license holder or not, about to bring stock on to the Hundred or to remove stock therefrom, shall before doing so, give written notice to the nearest Warden.

4. No person shall in any way disturb, harass, or remove cattle, great or small, depastured within the hundred, further than may be necessary for the purpose of collecting and dealing with such of them as may belong to him—and that purpose being carried out, any strange stock so driven must be returned by him without delay to the locality they were brought from.

5.—The penalty for any breach of the foregoing regulations and bye-laws shall be a sum not exceeding £5, to

be recovered in a summary way in accordance with the 172nd section of the "Otago Waste Lands Act, 1872.
