## NOTICE.

*Certain Lands in the Province of Otago reserved as an endowment for the Invercargill Athenæum.*

By His Honor James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS it is provided by Section sixteen, of "The Southland Waste Lands Act, 1865" that reserves for *inter alia* public purposes may, upon the recommendation of the Provincial Council, be made by the Superintendent, and that such reserves shall not be alienated from the specific purposes to which they have been severally dedicated, except under the provisions of the Public Reserves Act, 1854." And whereas the Provincial Council did on the twenty-ninth day of July 1873, recommend that the lands hereinafter described should be reserved for certain public purposes, to wit, for the endowment of the Invercargill Athenæum, and it is expedient that the said lands should be so reserved for that purpose. Now, therefore I, James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, in pursuance and exercise of every authority and power vested in me in that behalf, do hereby reserve and do hereby make, publish, and declare, that I have dedicated and reserved the following lands, that is to say:—

"All that parcel of land in the Province of Otago and district of Southland, containing 1077 acres 3 roods and 28 poles, more or less, being sections numbered respectively one (1), two (2), three (3), four (4), five (5), six (6), seven (7), eight (8), nine (9), and ten (10), block ten (X), and sections one (1), two (2), twenty-four (24), twenty-five (25), and twenty-six (26), block eleven (XI), Invercargill Hundred, as the same land is particularly described on the map of the said Hundred, as and for the said public purpose, to wit, for and as an endowment for the Invercargill Athenæum, the said Athenæum being duly incorporated by Ordinance No. 359, passed by the Provincial Council in Session XXIX, in the year 1871.

## REPORT ON THE SHEEP DEPARTMENT FOR 1873-4.

Sheep Inspector's Department,  
Dunedin, 6th May, 1874.

The Provincial Treasurer, Dunedin,

SIR,—I have the honour to forward for the information of the Government, Return of Sheep in the Province of Otago for the year ended 30th September, 1873.

The shows a total of three millions, three hundred and seventy-four thousand, four hundred and thirty-two (3,474,432) sheep above six months old, making an increase of sixty-five thousand, one hundred and forty-five (65,145) above the number returned last year.

Two millions, five hundred and thirty-two thousand, seven hundred and fifty-six (2,532,756) are depastured on runs; seven hundred and sixty-nine thousand, nine hundred and fifty-eight (769,958) on freeholds; forty-four thousand, four hundred and ninety (44,490) on gold fields; and twenty-seven thousand, two hundred and twenty-eight (27,228) on Hundreds.

I am happy to state that the whole of the sheep are still, and have been free from disease for over two years, with the exception of a small lot in paddocks in the Oamaru district. They got disease from two rams brought from England *via* Australia. As soon as the disease was discovered prompt action was taken to eradicate it, and I am glad to say we have been successful in stamping it out.

The disease was found to have been communicated to a few thousand sheep in the month of September. They were immediately shorn and repeatedly dressed, and no disease having been seen for the last five months, they have now received their final certificate.

I think that such a case can hardly occur again, now that the recommendation contained in my report of last year has been carried out by having dips erected at Oamaru, Port Chalmers and Invercargill, where all sheep are now dressed immediately after landing, under the supervision of the Inspectors. With due caution on their part, I am of opinion that it will be many years ere scab will be seen in the Province.
