PROCLAMATION

Setting apart certain Lands for occupation on deferred payments.

By His Honor James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by the fifth section of the Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Southland Waste Lands Act Amendment Act," 1873, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent, with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council, to set aside lands for sale on deferred payments, such lands to be sold and dealt with in terms of and subject to the conditions and provisions embodied in sections forty-seven to sixty-four inclusive of "The Otago Waste Lands Act, 1872." And, whereas, the Provincial Council of the Province of Otago has recommended the Superintendent of the said Province to set apart the lands hereinafter specified for alienation on deferred payments.

Now, therefore, I, James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by and with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council, as aforesaid, do hereby by virtue, and in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by "The Southland Waste Lands Act Amendment Act," 1873, or of every and any power in this behalf enabling me, proclaim, declare, and set apart all those districts, or blocks of land, specified in the schedule hereto, as districts or blocks within which land may be sold on deferred payments on and after the 29th day of July, 1874.

2584 acres, more or less, in the Oteramika Hundred, being sections 17, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, 33, 34, 35, 36, and 37, block I., sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 14, 15, 22, 23, 24, 25, and 26, block II.

PROCLAMATION

Appointing day for holding Election of Members of District Road Board.

By His Honor James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by the twenty-seventh section of the "Otago Roads Ordinance 1871" it is provided that in every district divided into subdivisions, the voters enrolled upon the Voters' roll for the time being in force for each subdivision of such district shall, on the second Thursday in June in each year, elect from the persons capable of being members of the District Board one-third of the whole number assigned to the subdivision, in the room of those who shall go out of office by rotation in the year: And whereas by the tenth section of the "Otago Roads Ordinance 1871 Amendment Ordinance 1874" it is provided that if, from any cause whatever, the persons entitled to vote at any election for any subdivision of any district shall fail or neglect to hold an election of members of the District Board of such district on the day appointed by the said Ordinance for that purpose, it shall be lawful for the Superintendent, by proclamation in the *Gazette*, to appoint a day for the holding of such election, and an election may be held on the day so appointed; and the election so held shall, for all purposes whatsoever, be deemed to have been duly held on the day appointed by the said Ordinance for holding the same: And whereas the persons entitled to vote at elections for the North Plain subdivision of the North Taieri Road District, and the Abbotshill and Abbotsford subdivisions of the Kaikorai Road Districts have failed or neglected to hold elections of members of the District Boards of such district on the day appointed by the said "Otago Roads Ordinance 1871": Now therefore I, James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, do hereby, by virtue and in exercise of the powers conferred on me by the tenth section of the "Otago Roads Ordinance 1871 Amendment Ordinance 1874," appoint the days hereinafter mentioned for the holding of the elections of members of the District Boards of the abovementioned districts.

REGULATIONS under Sub-section 6, Section 54, "Otago Waste Land Act," 1872.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY TO SEARCH FOR GOLD.

1. Any holder of a Miner's Right desiring to enter for the purpose of searching for gold upon any land held under license under the provisions of the Act, shall apply to the District Officer in the form of schedule annexed hereto, and shall serve upon the occupant or licensee of the land a duplicate copy of such notice.

2. On receipt of any application to enter to search for gold, the District Officer shall appoint a day and place for hearing the same; and such application shall be heard and determined by the District Board of Inquiry appointed under the "Otago Waste Land Act," 1872.

3. In every case in which permission shall be granted to any holder of a Miner's Right to enter upon any such land for the purpose of searching for gold, he shall deposit with the Receiver of Gold Revenue for the district such sum of money as the Board of inquiry may consider sufficient as security for the due performance of any conditions of such permission; and it shall be lawful for the Board of inquiry, in the case of failure to comply with such conditions, or any of them, to order payment of the whole, or any part of such money, to the licensee or occupiers of the land so entered upon, or to make such other order in relation to, the same as to them, or a majority of them, shall seem just, and the decision of the Board of inquiry, or a majority of them, shall be final and conclusive as regards all parties concerned.

4. The Board of inquiry, or a majority of them, shall have full power to impose any conditions which to them may seem just as to the mode and time of entry upon the said land for the purpose of searching for gold, and shall also be empowered to assess the amount of damage which may have accrued to the licensee by reason of any operations connected therewith, and to order by way of compensation for such damage, if any, the payment to the licensee of any sum not exceeding the amount deposited as aforesaid, and in the event of the non-fulfilment of any of the conditions imposed by them, the Board, or a majority of them, shall, after due notice to all parties, in the presence of them, or of such of them, as shall attend upon a day to be appointed for that purpose, have full power to cancel the permission to enter, and to order payment by way of compensation as aforesaid.

FREE NOMINATED IMMIGRATION.

(Extract from Order in Council, 15th October, 1873.)

REGULATIONS FOR THE CONDUCT OF IMMIGRATION TO NEW ZEALAND, ON THE NOMINATION OF IMMIGRANTS BY PERSONS RESIDENT THEREIN.

1. Any person resident in the Colony, desirous of nominating relatives or friends in Europe for passages to New Zealand, may do so by applying to an Immigration Officer, in the form at foot, copies of which can be obtained at all Immigration and Post Offices.

The persons nominated, if approved by the Immigration Officer and the officers of the Home Agency, will receive free passages to the Colony.

2. Every adult emigrant will be required, before embarkation, to pay, unless specially remitted by the Agent-General, 20s. (and children in proportion), for bedding, blankets, and mess utensils.

3. The cost of conveyance to the port (unless the Agent General agrees to pay it), and to the residence of their friends after their arrival in the Colony, must be defrayed by the emigrants themselves.

4. All the ships employed in this service will be denur the provisions of the Passenger Act,

5. It is to be distinctly understood, that notwithstanding the applications are forwarded to the Agent-General by the Immigration Officers, the Agent-General in London may refuse passages where the intending emigrants are in ill-health, or in any way unfitted, according to his judgment, to emigrate.

6. The Regulations, issued upon 21st April, 1873, for the payment of bonuses to the nominators upon the arrival of the nominated immigrants, are hereby rescinded; and no certificates for the payment of such bonuses will be given after the date hereof.
