### PROCLAMATION

*Setting apart certain Lands for occupation on deferred payments.*

By His Honor James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by the fifth section of the Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Southland Waste Lands Act Amendment Act," 1873, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent, with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council, to set aside lands for sale on deferred payments, such lands to be sold and dealt with in terms of and subject to the conditions and provisions embodied in sections forty-seven to sixty-four inclusive of "The Otago Waste Lands Act, 1872." And, whereas, the Provincial Council of the Province of Otago has recommended the Superintendent of the said Province to set apart the lands hereinafter specified for alienation on deferred payments.

Now, therefore, I, James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by and with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council, as aforesaid, do hereby by virtue, and in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by "The Southland Waste Lands Act Amendment Act," 1873, or of every and any power in this behalf enabling me, proclaim, declare, and set apart all those districts, or blocks of land, specified in the schedule hereto, as dis-

tracts or blocks within which land may be sold on deferred payments on and after the 29th day of July, 1874.

#### CORPORATION OF CROMWELL.

**BYE-LAW** No. 3, of the Council of the Town of Cromwell, made under Part 13 of the "Municipal Corporations Act, 1867."

Bye-law to suppress the use of ordinary privies, and to provide for the use of earth closets, within the Town of Cromwell.

Any person guilty of the following offences, omissions, or neglects within the Town of Cromwell shall, on being convicted of any such offence, omission, or neglect, be liable to pay any penalty not exceeding Five Pound (£5); that is to say:—

1. Having on any premises, or under the control of the owner of any premises, any excavation for the deposit of excrementitious matter,
2. Having any kind of closet or privy other than those known as earth-closets.
3. Having earth-closets unprovided with a box or other movable receptacle for excrementitious matter, or having the same below the surface or floor of such closet.
4. Neglecting to keep or use in any earth closet a supply of dry earth reasonably sufficient for disinfecting or deodorising purposes.
5. Neglecting to clean out, or to provide for the cleaning out, of any earth-closet at least once every fourteen days.

#### FREE NOMINATED IMMIGRATION.

(Extract from Order in Council, 15th October, 1873.)

REGULATIONS FOR THE CONDUCT OF IMMIGRATION TO NEW ZEALAND, ON THE NOMINATION OF IMMIGRANTS BY PERSONS RESIDENT THEREIN.

1. Any person resident in the Colony, desirous of nominating relatives or friends in Europe for passages to New Zealand, may do so by applying to an Immigration Officer, in the form at foot, copies of which can be obtained at all Immigration and Post Offices.

The persons nominated, if approved by the Immigration Officer and the officers of the Home Agency, will receive free passages to the Colony.

2. Every adult emigrant will be required, before embarkation, to pay, unless specially remitted by the Agent-General, 20s. (and children in proportion), for bedding, blankets, and mess utensils.

3. The cost of conveyance to the port (unless the Agent General agrees to pay it), and to the residence of their friends after their arrival in the Colony, must be defrayed by the emigrants themselves.

4. All the ships employed in this service will be denur the provisions of the Passenger Act,

5. It is to be distinctly understood, that notwithstanding the applications are forwarded to the Agent-General by the Immigration Officers, the Agent-General in London may refuse passages where the intending emigrants are in ill-health, or in any way unfitted, according to his judgment, to emigrate.

6. The Regulations, issued upon 21st April, 1873, for the payment of bonuses to the nominators upon the arrival of the nominated immigrants, are hereby rescinded; and no certificates for the payment of such bonuses will be given after the date hereof.

To the IMMIGRATION OFFICER,

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I have the honor to state that, in my opinion, the persons named below would not be unwilling to emigrate to New Zealand, and would be desirable colonists.
