### PROCLAMATION

Appointing a day for the First Election of a Citizen to be Mayor of the Incorporated Town of Roxburgh.

By His Honor John Theodore Thomas Boyd, Esquire, Deputy-Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

**WHEREAS** by the "Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1865, Amendment Ordinance 1870," it is amongst other things provided that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent, at any time after any Municipality shall have been proclaimed under the provisions of the Ordinance intituled "An Ordinance to amend the Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance 1865," by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of the Province of Otago, to appoint a day for the first election of a citizen to be Mayor of such municipality: And whereas the town of Roxburgh has been proclaimed a municipality under the provisions of the said Ordinance, and it is expedient to appoint a day for the first election of a citizen to be Mayor of the said municipality of Roxburgh:

Now, therefore, I, John Theodore Thomas Boyd, Deputy-Superintendent of the said Province of Otago, do hereby proclaim and declare that I have appointed, and do hereby appoint, Wednesday, the Ninth day of September, 1874, as and to be the day for the first election of a citizen to be Mayor of the municipality of Roxburgh.

NOTICE is hereby Given, that in conformity with the "Depasturing Regulations," the following Rules and Regulations shall be the Rules and Regulations for the Elections of Wardens for the Depasturing Districts of Tuapeka, Waitahuna, and Waipori; and the Board of Wardens for each of such Districts shall consist of five elective members, and shall hold office for one year, one of whom shall hereafter be appointed Chairman by the Superintendent, for each District.

\* \* \* After the signatures of the proposer and seconder, the nature and particulars of the qualification under which they claim to vote must be stated.

II. If more than the requisite number of candidates are nominated, a poll shall take place on such day as the Warden at Lawrence may appoint and notify by advertisement in a newspaper circulating in the locality at least twenty-four hours before the day appointed, from 10 a.m. till 4 p.m., and after the latter hour no further vote shall be allowed to be recorded; and the candidates in whose favour the greatest number of votes shall have been recorded at the said hour of 4 p.m. (or in the event of there not being more than the requisite number, then the candidates nominated) shall, as soon thereafter as may be, be declared by the Warden, or other officer appointed by

him, to have been duly elected for the ensuing year, ending the 31st day of August following.

III. No person shall be entitled to be so nominated, nor shall any person be entitled so to nominate, or to second the nomination of any candidate, unless he shall be possessed of one or other of the qualifications set forth and specified in Regulation No. 5 of the Departing Regulations of the 23rd day of June, 1868.

IV. If any person shall improperly be elected as a member of the Board of Wardens, he not being duly and lawfully possessed of the qualification aforesaid at the time of election, it shall be in the power of the Board, upon due inquiry into all the circumstances of the case, to declare by a majority of votes that such election of such person is null and void, and thereupon an election shall be held, when and where and as may be determined by the Board, for filling up the deficiency caused by such declaration.

V. Voters must attend in person to record their votes, and the document by virtue whereof they claim to vote must be produced to the Warden, or presiding officer appointed by him, who, after recording the vote, shall cause to be written upon some conspicuous part thereof the word "Voted," together with his signature or initials and the date of such vote.

VI. The poll (if taken) will be held at the Courthouse of the District.

VII. The names of all the candidates nominated shall be advertised in the local papers, and set forth in a notice affixed to the front of the Courthouse of the District.

**FREE NOMINATED IMMIGRATION.**

(Extract from Order in Council, 15th October, 1873.)

REGULATIONS FOR THE CONDUCT OF IMMIGRATION TO NEW ZEALAND, ON THE NOMINATION OF IMMIGRANTS BY PERSONS RESIDENT THEREIN.

1. Any person resident in the Colony, desirous of nominating relatives or friends in Europe for passages to New Zealand, may do so by applying to an Immigration Officer, in the form at foot, copies of which can be obtained at all Immigration and Post Offices.

The persons nominated, if approved by the Immigration Officer and the officers of the Home Agency, will receive free passages to the Colony.

2. Every adult emigrant will be required, before embarkation, to pay, unless specially remitted by the Agent-General, 20s. (and children in proportion), for bedding, blankets, and mess utensils.

3. The cost of conveyance to the port (unless the Agent General agrees to pay it), and to the residence of their friends after their arrival in the Colony, must be defrayed by the emigrants themselves.

4. All the ships employed in this service will be denur the provisions of the Passenger Act,

5. It is to be distinctly understood, that notwithstanding the applications are forwarded to the Agent-General by the Immigration Officers, the Agent-General in London may refuse passages where the intending emigrants are in ill-health, or in any way unfitted, according to his judgment, to emigrate

6. The Regulations, issued upon 21st April, 1873, for

the payment of bonuses to the nominators upon the arrival of the nominated immigrants, are hereby rescinded; and no certificates for the payment of such bonuses will be given after the date hereof.

**W**HEREAS by an Act made and enacted in the Imperial Parliament holden in the fifteenth and sixteenth years of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to grant a Representative

Constitution to the Colony of New Zealand," it is among other things enacted that whenever any Bill shall have been assented to by the Superintendent, as in the said Act provided, the Superintendent shall forthwith transmit to the Governor an authentic copy thereof, and it shall be lawful for the Governor, at any time within three months after any such Bill shall have been received by him, to declare by Proclamation his disallowance of such Bill; and that any such disallowance shall make void and annul the same from and after the day of the date of such Proclamation, or any subsequent day to be named therein:

And whereas the Act hereinafter specified has been enacted by the Superintendent of Otago, with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council thereof, and the said Act was received by the Governor, on the twenty-fifth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Act should be disallowed:

Now therefore, I, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the authority vested in me in that behalf by the said recited Act of Parliament, do hereby proclaim and declare my disallowance of the following Act, passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, namely,—

"The Otago Gold Duty Repayment Ordinance, 1874"
