### PROCLAMATION

Appointing a certain Road in the Mornington Road District to be a Main Road.

By His Honor James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

**W**HEREAS by section 171 of the "Otago Roads Ordinance, 1871," it is provided that, upon the application of the Board of any District, the Superintendent may from time to time, if it shall seem fit so to do, by proclamation, appoint that any roads or part of roads, whether within or upon the boundary of such district, shall be Main Roads, or Main District Roads: And whereas the Board of the Mornington Road District has applied to have the road described in the Schedule hereto appointed a Main Road: Now, therefore, I, James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, under and by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by the said section, and of every other power and authority enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and appoint the parcel of land described in the Schedule hereto to be a Main Road.

### SCHEDULE.

All that parcel of land in the Province of Otago, in the Colony of New Zealand, containing by admeasurement two (2) acres one (1) rood and twenty-four (24) poles, more or less, situate in the Town District, being parts of sections numbered respectively sixty-five (65), sixty-six (66), sixty-seven (67), sixty-eight (68), seventy-four (74), ninety-three (93), and ninety-four (94), block six (VI.) on the map of the said district: bounded by a line commencing at a point on the north-western boundary of the said section numbered 74 two hundred and twenty-five (225) links distant from its south-western corner, and proceeding in the same north-easterly direction fifty (50) links; thence in a south-easterly direction two thousand one hundred (2100) links, four hundred and thirty (430) links, five hundred and twenty (520) links, four hundred and forty (440) links, two hundred and seventy (270) links, three hundred and forty (340) links, four hundred and sixty (460) links, five hundred and fifty (550) links, and four hundred (400) links; thence in a south-westerly direction along the south-eastern boundary of the said section numbered 65 forty (40) links; thence in a north-

westerly direction four hundred (400) links, five hundred and forty-five (545) links, four hundred and fifty (450) links, three hundred and thirty (330) links, two hundred and sixty (260) links, four hundred and sixty (460) links, five hundred (500) links, four hundred and ten (410) links, and two thousand one hundred (2100) links, to the starting point,

### PROCLAMATION

Appointing a certain Road in the Heddon Bush Subdivision of the Aparima Road District to be a Main District Road,

By His Honor James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

**W**HEREAS by section 171 of the "Otago Roads Ordinance, 1871," it is provided that upon the application of the Board of any District the Superintendent may from time to time, if it shall seem fit so to do, by proclamation appoint that any roads or part of road, whether within or upon the boundary of such District, shall be Main Roads or Main District Roads: And whereas the Board of the Aparima Road District has applied to have the road described in the Schedule hereto appointed a Main District Road: Now therefore, I, James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, under and by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by the said section, and of every other power and authority enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and appoint the road described in the Schedule hereto, being a road in the Heddon Subdivision of the Aparima Road District, to be a Main District Road.

The road commencing at a ford on the Aparima River about one mile north-east of Trig. B, thence extending through section 4, Oreti Hundred, to the westernmost corner of section 78 of said Hundred, thence along the south-west boundary of said section 78, and through section 79 till it joins the road line laid out through section

Extending Time within which certain Lands in certain Hundreds in the Province of Otago shall be open for Sale,

By His Honor James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS the Lands hereinafter mentioned and described, being the lands within the Hundreds hereinafter named, have, by proclamation by His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand, first published on the 3rd day of September, 1874, in the *New Zealand Gazette*, been proclaimed as Hundreds: And whereas by operation of law the lands within the said Hundreds are not open for sale or lease until thirty days from and after the first publication of the proclamation constituting the Hundreds: And whereas, by the 2nd section of "The Otago Waste Lands Administration Act, 1874," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent, from time to time, by proclamation in the *Provincial Government Gazette*, to fix a date after the said period of thirty days as the date on and after which the lands comprised in such Hundred shall be open for sale or lease, and that in such case such lands should not be open for sale or lease until the date mentioned in such last-mentioned proclamation: And whereas it is not expedient that the said land comprised in the said Hundreds should be open for sale or lease until the dates hereinafter mentioned: Now, therefore, I, James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue of the powers invested in me by "The Otago Waste Lands Administration Act, 1874," and of every other power and authority vested in me enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the lands comprised in the Hundreds hereinafter named shall be open for sale or lease on the dates hereinafter mentioned, that is to say: I proclaim and declare that all the lands comprised in the following Hundreds, namely, in the Lees Stream Hundred, in the Tuapeka Hundred, in the Dart Hundred, shall be open for sale or lease on the twentieth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four. And I also proclaim and declare that all the lands comprised in the Dunback Hundred and in the Waikoikoi Hundred shall be open for sale or lease on the twentieth day of December one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four: And I also proclaim and declare that all the lands comprised in the Kaiwera Hundred, in the Pukerau Hundred, and in the Otaira Hundred, shall be open for sale or lease on the fourth day of January one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five: And I also proclaim and declare that all the lands comprised in the Waikaka Hundred shall be open for sale on the fifteenth day of January one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five: And I also proclaim and declare that all the lands comprised in the Waipaltee Hundred, in the Kuriwao Hundred, in the Herriott Hundred, in the Spottis Hundred, and in the Waikaia Hundred, shall be open for sale or lease on the first day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five: And I further proclaim and declare that the Hundreds hereinbefore named are described in the proclamations of His Excellency Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, Governor of New Zealand, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of date the third day of September, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four.

#### PROCLAMATION.

*Declaring the "Thistle Ordinance, 1862," to be in operation within a certain District in the Province of Otago.*

By His Honor James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance made by the Superintendent of the Province of Southland, with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council thereof, entitled the "Thistle Ordinance, 1862," it was enacted that it should be lawful for the Superintendent from time to time by Proclamation in the *Provincial Government Gazette*, to declare that the said Ordinance should come into operation within any district, and thereby to proclaim the limits of the district. And Whereas by "The Otago and Southland Union Act, 1870," it was enacted that in every Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Southland the terms "Superintendent" and "Provincial Government Gazette" should, upon the coming into operation of the said Act, be construed as and should mean respectively the Superintendent for the time being of the Province of Otago (therein called the "new Province"), and the *Government Gazette* of the said Province of Otago.

Now therefore, I, James Macandrew, Superintendent of the said Province of Otago, do hereby by virtue of all the powers enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare that the said "Thistle Ordinance, 1862," shall come into operation on and after this day within the District hereinafter described, as the limits of the said District are defined and described in the Schedule hereto.

#### SCHEDULE.

All that parcel of land in the Province of Otago bounded towards the North by the northern boundaries of the Aparima and Oreti Hundreds; towards the East by the Oreti River; towards the South by the Ocean; and towards the West by the western boundaries of the Jacob's River and Aparima Hundreds.

#### PROCLAMATION.

*Cancellation of Lease to Depasture Stock on certain Crown Lands in the Province of Otago.*

By His Honor James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, in Council.

WHEREAS by the sixteenth section of the "Gold Fields Act 1866," it is enacted that when any Gold Mine or Gold Field shall be discovered and proclaimed upon any Crown Lands, which at the date of the passing of the said Act shall have been held under license or lease for depasturing purposes, it should be lawful for the Governor, at his discretion, to cancel the license or lease under which such land shall have been held in occupation, as regards the whole or any part of the lands so held under such license or lease, or with the concurrence of the licensee, or lessee, to suspend such lease or license as regards the whole or any part of such lands: And whereas Thomas Dick, Esquire, then Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to and vested in him in that behalf, did, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of the said Province, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, constitute and appoint all the territory therein described, including amongst other lands the lands hereinafter described to be a Gold Field under the provisions of the "Gold Fields Act 1866," to be called "Otago Gold Field." And whereas, by the "Gold Fields Act Amendment Act 1867," it is enacted that within any Province in which by any Act or Ordinance it is provided that the Superintendent shall in the administration of the Government thereof, act by and with the advice and consent of an Executive Council, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council,

under his hand, and under the public seal of the Colony, from time to time as occasion may require, to delegate to the Executive Government for the time being of such Province, subject or not to any restrictions or limitations as he may think fit, all or any of such powers vested in the Governor, or the Governor in Council, by the "Gold Fields Act 1866," as under, or by virtue of the one hundred and ninth section of the said Act may be delegated by the Governor in Council, and in like manner to revoke any such delegation: And whereas by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago intituled the "Executive Council Ordinance 1861," it is provided that the Superintendent of the said Province shall in the administration of the Government thereof, act by and with the advice and consent of an Executive Council: And whereas the Governor hath, with the advice and consent of the executive Council of New Zealand, and in pursuance of the power and authority for that purpose vested in him by the "Gold Fields Act 1866," and subject to its provisions, delegated unto the Executive Government for the time being of the Province of Otago, all such powers vested in the Governor, or the Governor in Council, by the said last-mentioned Act, as under or by virtue of the one hundred and ninth section of the said last mentioned Act, may be delegated by the Governor in Council, to have, hold, and exercise the said powers within the said Province of Otago: And whereas the said lands hereinafter described are Crown Lands, subject to be dealt with under the provisions of the said sixteenth section of the "Gold Fields Act 1866," and the said lands are now, or lately were, held in occupation by Mr. Joseph Clarke under a lease for Depasturing purposes, issued under the "Otago Waste Lands Act 1866." And whereas the Executive Government of the Province of Otago have determined to cancel the said lease as to so much and such part of the lands held under the same as are comprised within the area hereinafter described.

Now therefore I, James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province, and by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to the Executive Government of the said Province in this behalf by His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand in Council, under the authority of the "Gold Fields Act Amendment Act 1867," and of any and every other power in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby cancel the said lease, in so far as the lands comprised within the area hereinafter described are affected by the said lease, but no further or otherwise (that is to say)—

All that parcel of land in the Province of Otago in the Colony of New Zealand containing by estimation four hundred and twenty (420) acres more or less situate in Benger District being section numbered forty-four (44) block one (1) on the map of the said district bounded by a line commencing on the western bank of the Clutha River and proceeding due west across Trigonometrical Station B six thousand (6000) links thence due north nine thousand seven hundred and forty-three (9743) links to the Clutha River thence in a south-easterly direction along that River twelve thousand (1200) links to the starting point be all the aforesaid linkages more or less.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CONDUCT OF IMMIGRATION TO NEW ZEALAND, ON THE NOMINATION OF IMMIGRANTS BY PERSONS RESIDENT THEREIN.

1. Any person resident in the Colony, desirous of nominating relatives or friends in Europe for passages to New Zealand, may do so by applying to an Immigration Officer, in the form at foot, copies of which can be obtained at all Immigration and Post Offices.

The persons nominated, if approved by the Immigration Officer and the officers of the Home Agency, will receive free passages to the Colony.

2. Every adult emigrant will be required, before embarkation, to pay, unless specially remitted by the Agent-General, 20s. (and children in proportion), for bedding, blankets, and mess utensils.

3. The cost of conveyance to the port (unless the Agent General agrees to pay it), and to the residence of their friends after their arrival in the Colony, must be defrayed by the emigrants themselves.

4. All the ships employed in this service will be denur the provisions of the Passenger Act,

5. It is to be distinctly understood, that notwithstanding the applications are forwarded to the Agent-General by the Immigration Officers, the Agent-General in London may refuse passages where the intending emigrants are in ill-health, or in any way unfitted, according to his judgment, to emigrate
