PROCLAMATION.

Declaring certain Crown Lands in the Otago Gold Field open for sale or selection.

By His Honor James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago in Council.

WHEREAS by the 49th section of the "Gold Field Act 1866," it is enacted that if the Depasturing Lease or License, shall be cancelled over any Crown Lands within a gold field, it shall be lawful for the Governor to declare such lands or any part thereof, open for sale or selection. And whereas Thomas Dick, Esquire, then the Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue of the powers delegated to and vested in him in that behalf, did, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette of the said Province, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, constitute and appoint all the territory therein described, including amongst other lands described in the Schedule hereto, to be a Gold Field under the provisions of the Gold Fields Act 1866," to be called "Otago Gold Field:" And whereas by the "Gold Fields Act Amendment Act 1867," it is enacted that within any Province in which by any Act or Ordinance, it is provided that the Superintendent shall, in the administration of the Government thereof, act by and with the advice and consent of an Executive Council, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand, and under the public seal of the Colony, from time to time as occasion may require, to delegate to the Executive Government for the time being of such Province, subject or not to any restrictions or limitations he may think fit, all or any such powers vested in the Governor, or the Governor in the Council, by the "Gold Fields Act 1866," as under or by virtue of the one hundred and ninth section of the said Act may be delegated by the Governor in Council, and in like manner to revoke any such delegation: And Whereas by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, intituled the "Executive Council Ordinance 1861," it is provided that the Superintendent of the said Province shall, in the administration of the Government thereof, act by and with the advice and consent of an Executive Council: And whereas the Governor hath, with the advice and

consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, and in pursuance of the power and authority for that purpose vested in him by the "Gold Fields Act 1866," and subject to its provisions delegated unto the Executive Government for the time being of the Province of Otago all such powers vested in the Governor, or the Governor in Council, by the said last-mentioned Act, as under or by virtue of the 109th section of the said last-mentioned Act may be delegated by the Governor in Council, to have, hold, and exercise the said powers within the said Province of Otago. And whereas the said lands described in the Schedule hereto are Crown Lands subject to be dealt with under the provisions of the said 49th section of the "Otago Gold Fields Act, 1866," and the Depasturing Lease over the said lands, has by proclamation dated the 28th day of December, 1870, and published in the Provincial Government Gazette of date the 4th day of January, 1871, been cancelled. And whereas the Executive Government of Otago have determined to declare the said lands open for sale on selection. Now, therefore, I, James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province, and by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to the Executive Government of the said Province in this behalf by His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand in Council under the authority of the "Gold Fields Act Amendment Act 1867," and of any and every other power in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby declare that from and after the third day of November, 1874, the lands described in the schedule hereto shall be open for sale or selection in sections of such size and form as are shown on the maps of the said lands in the Land Office, Dunedin.

1. Three Scholarships in connection with the Boys' High School, and three in connection with the Girls' High School, shall be open for competition on the 21st of December, 1874, to boys and girls respectively who shall have attended the public schools of Otago for at least one quarter during the current year (1874). One of the boys' and one of the girls' Scholarships shall be bestowed on a boy and a girl respectively from the High School or the Grammar Schools. Two of the Scholarships shall be conferred on boys and two on girls attending the ordinary District Schools. Competitors must be under sixteen years of age at the date of the competition.

2. The holders for the time being of the said Scholarships shall be called "Provincial Scholars," and shall be entitled to the privileges and advantages hereinafter specified. A scholarship shall be tenable as long as the holder of it remains a pupil of the Boys' or Girls' High School, but not longer than three years. The Education Board may extend the period of tenure in the case of any Provincial Scholar who may have given highly satisfactory evidence of diligence and progress in study.

3. The said Scholarships respectively shall be awarded to such candidates as shall have shown the greatest proficiency at a Competitive Examination, to be held simultaneously at the different schools on the day above specified; such Competitive Examination shall be by written papers, and shall embrace the following subjects:—

I. *English Grammar*, including analysis of Sentences.

II. *Geography*.—The Elements of Mathematical and Physical Geography; the chief Physical Features, Political Divisions, and Principal Towns of Europe and Australasia; the drawing from memory of an outline Map of a country in Europe or a Colony in Australasia, to be named by the Examiners.

III. *Arithmetic*.—Simple and compound Rules, Practice, Simple and Compound Proportion, Vulgar and Decimal Fractions, Interest, Discount, Profit and Loss, Extraction of the Square Root, Square Measure and Duodecimals.

IV. *Algebra*.—For Common School competitors, the Four Elementary Rules; for High and Grammar School competitors, as far as Simple Equations, inclusive.

V. *Euclid*.—For Common School competitors Book I., prop. 1—15; for High and Grammar School competitors, the whole of Book I. (For Boys only.)

VI. Writing from Dictation.

VII. A short *Essay* on some familiar subject to be named by the Examiners.

VIII. *Penmanship*, as shown by the Competitors' papers under subjects VI., and VII. Preference will be given to a plain round hand.

IX. *Latin*.—(High and Grammar School Boys.) Grammar and Accidence; translation into English of a passage in Latin.

X. *French*.—(High and Grammar School Girls.) Grammar; translation into English of a passage from a French author.

XI. Marks will be given for the reading of Prose and Poetry, and for Recitation from memory. Competitors will be expected to read and recite before the local Examiners, but those who stand very high in other subjects may be required to attend afterwards at Dunedin for Reading and Recitation.

4. A Scholarship will not be awarded to the best, or any other candidate, unless he or she shall have gained, in the aggregate, at least 70 per cent. of the number of marks attainable; and the Board shall be at liberty to suspend or terminate any scholarship on account of wilful misconduct or neglect of studies on the part of the holder.

5. Each holder of a Provincial Scholarship shall receive free education at the High School and a payment of £30 per annum.

6. Free education for terms of not less than two years nor more than four years, may, at the discretion of the Board, be granted to the unsuccessful competitors for Scholarships, who shall have gained a satisfactory percentage of the whole number of marks attainable; such Free Scholars may attend the High School, a Grammar School, or an approved Main District School, at their option.

7. Certificates of Merit will be granted to those competitors who, though failing to gain Scholarships, distinguish themselves greatly.

8. REGULATIONS FOR THE CONDUCT OF IMMIGRATION TO

NEW ZEALAND, ON THE NOMINATION OF IMMIGRANTS
BY PERSONS RESIDENT THEREIN.

1. Any person resident in the Colony, desirous of nominating relatives or friends in Europe for passages to New Zealand, may do so by applying to an Immigration Officer, in the form at foot, copies of which can be obtained at all Immigration and Post Offices.

The persons nominated, if approved by the Immigration Officer and the officers of the Home Agency, will receive free passages to the Colony.

2. Every adult emigrant will be required, before embarkation, to pay, unless specially remitted by the Agent-General, 20s. (and children in proportion), for bedding, blankets, and mess utensils.

3 The cost of conveyance to the port (unless the Agent General agrees to pay it), and to the residence of their friends after their arrival in the Colony, must be defrayed by the emigrants themselves.

4. All the ships employed in this service will be under the provisions of the Passenger Act,

5. It is to be distinctly understood, that notwithstanding the applications are forwarded to the Agent-General by the Immigration Officers, the Agent-General in London may refuse passages where the intending emigrants are in ill-health, or in any way unfitted, according to his judgment, to emigrate

6. The Regulations, issued upon 21st April, 1873, for the payment of bonuses to the nominators upon the arrival of the nominated immigrants, are hereby rescinded; and no certificates for the payment of such bonuses will be given after the date hereof.
