## REGULATIONS.

NOTICE is hereby given that by virtue of the powers vested in His Honor the Superintendent of Otago, the following Regulation under the "Otago Waste Lands Act 1872," has been made, namely,—

Every Applicant for a License of land under the sections in the "Waste Lands Act 1872," referring to the alienation of lands for license or lease on deferred payments, shall make the following declaration on oath, that is to say,—

In the matter of an application for a license of land in the District of the Province of Otago under the Otago Waste Lands Act 1872, being section Block of the said District under the clauses in the Land Act referring to the alienation of lands by license or lease on deferred payments

I of in the Province of Otago and Colony of New Zealand, do hereby solemnly and sincerely declare on oath as follows—

1. That I have made the application above mentioned, that is to say for the license of section Block District in the Province of Otago aforesaid, under the provisions in that behalf contained in sections 47 to 64 inclusive in the "Otago Waste Lands Act 1872," in conformity with and not in violation of the provisions of the "Otago Waste Lands Act 1872."

2. That I am not the licensee either in my own name or in the name of any other person or persons, of more than two hundred acres of land under the "Otago Waste Lands Act 1872."

3. That I am not the owner of any pre-emptive right in any Run under any Pastoral Lease or otherwise.

4. That I am above the age of eighteen years.

\* 5. [That I am unmarried or have obtained a decree of judicial separation from my husband.]

6. That I am not the agent or servant of or a trustee for any person in my application above mentioned.

7. That I have not entered into any agreement with or made arrangement with any person to permit any person to acquire by purchase exchange or otherwise the allotment or section or any part thereof in respect of which my application abovementioned is made nor have I made

any agreement or arrangement as aforesaid to permit or allow the said allotment or section to be used or possessed in whole or part by any person whatsoever.

8. That I have applied for the said allotment or sections of land for my own personal use benefit and possession and *bona fide* and with no intention of violating any provisions or declarations within the "Otago Waste Lands Act 1872."

And I make this solemn declaration on oath conscientiously believing the same to be true and by virtue of the provisions of the "Otago Waste Lands Act 1872" and of the "Justices of the Peace Act 1866" and of every other statute enabling me in that behalf.

Declared on oath at this day of 1874 before me one of Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace in and for the Colony of New Zealand.

\* The part in brackets is only to be made when the Applicant is a female.

## PROCLAMATION.

*Setting apart Crown Lands in the Otago Gold Field for the purpose of granting Agricultural Leases.*

By His Honor James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago in Council.

WHEREAS by the 33rd section of the "Gold Fields Act 1866," it is enacted amongst other things that it shall be lawful for the Governor to cause Crown Lands situate within a Gold Field to be selected and set apart for the purpose of granting Agricultural Leases thereon and therefor: And whereas Thomas Dick, Esquire, the then Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to and vested in him in that behalf, did, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of the said Province, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, constitute and appoint all the territory therein described, including amongst

other lands, the lands hereinafter described, to be a Gold Field under the provisions of the "Gold Fields Act 1866," to be called "Otago Gold Field." And whereas by the "Gold Fields Act Amendment Act 1867," it is enacted that within any Province in which by any Act or Ordinance, it is provided that the Superintendent shall, in the administration of the Government thereof, act by and with the advice and consent of an Executive Council, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand, and under the public seal of the Colony, from time to time as occasion may require, to delegate to the Executive Government for the time being of such Province, subject or not to any restrictions or limitations as he may think fit, all or any of such powers vested in the Governor, or the Governor in Council, by the "Gold Fields Act 1866," as under or by virtue of the one hundred and ninth section of the said Act may be delegated by the Governor in Council, and in like manner to revoke any such delegation: And Whereas by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, intituled the "Executive Council Ordinance 1861," it is provided that the Superintendent of the said Province shall, in the administration of the Government thereof, act by and with the advice and consent of an Executive Council: And whereas the Governor hath, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, and in pursuance of the power and authority for that purpose vested in him by the "Gold Fields Act 1866," and subject to its provisions delegated unto the Executive Government for the time being of the Province of Otago all such powers vested in the Governor, or the Governor in Council, by the said last-mentioned Act, as under or by virtue of the 109th section of the said last-mentioned Act may be delegated by the Governor in Council, to have, hold, and exercise the said powers within the said Province of Otago. And whereas the said lands hereinafter described are Crown Lands, subject to be dealt with under the provisions of the said 33rd section of the "Goldfields Act 1866," and it is deemed expedient to set the same apart for the purpose of granting agricultural leases thereon and therefor.

Now, therefore, I, James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province, and by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to the Executive Government of the said Province in this behalf by His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand in Council under the authority of the "Gold Fields Act Amendment Act 1867," and of any and every other power in any wise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the lands hereinafter described have been and are hereby selected and set apart by the Executive Government of the Province of Otago for the purpose of granting agricultural leases thereon and therefor (that is to say): Sections 1, 2, 4, 11, 12, 16, 17, Block I; sections 28, 29, 30, 31, 45, 46, 47, 48, 49, Block II; sections 5, 6, 15, Block IV; sections 3, 4, 10, 13, 16, 17, 20, 24, 25, 30, 31, 32, 33, 38, 39, Block V; sections 3, 6, 7, 15, 16, 22, 23, Block VII; Tuapeka West District, and that such lands will be open for application on and after Tuesday the 3rd day of November, 1874.
