PROCLAMATION.

Cancellation of Lease to Depasture Stock on certain Crown Lands in the Province of Otago.

By His Honor James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago in Council.

WHEREAS by the sixteenth section of the "Gold Fields Act 1866," it is enacted that when any Gold Mine or Gold Field shall be discovered and proclaimed upon any Crown Lands, which at the date of the passing of the said Act shall have been held under license or lease for depasturing purposes, it should be lawful for the Governor at his discretion to cancel the license or lease, under which such land shall have been held in occupation, as regards the whole or any part of the lands so held under such license or lease, or with the concurrence of the licensee, or lessee, to suspend such lease or license as regards the whole or any part of such lands. And whereas Thomas Dick, Esquire, then Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to and vested in him in that behalf, did, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of the said Province, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, constitute and appoint all the territory therein described, including amongst other lands, the lands hereinafter described, to be a Gold Field under the provisions of the "Gold Fields Act 1866," to be called "Otago Gold Field." And whereas by the "Gold Fields Act Amendment Act 1867," it is enacted that within any Province in which by any Act or Ordinance, it is provided that the Superintendent shall, in the administration of the Government thereof, act by and with the advice and consent of an Executive Council, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand, and under the public seal of the Colony, from time to time as occasion may require, to delegate to the Executive Government for the time being of such Province, subject or not to any restrictions or limitations as he may think fit, all or any of such powers vested in the Governor, or the Governor in Council, by the "Gold Fields Act 1866," as under or by virtue of the one hundred and ninth section of the said Act may be delegated by the Governor in Council, and in like

manner to revoke any such delegation: And Whereas by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, intituled the "Executive Council Ordinance 1861," it is provided that the Superintendent of the said Province shall, in the administration of the Government thereof, act by and with the advice and consent of an Executive Council: And whereas the Governor hath, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, and in pursuance of the power and authority for that purpose vested in him by the "Gold Fields Act 1866," and subject to its provisions delegated unto the Executive Government for the time being of the Province of Otago all such powers vested in the Governor, or the Governor in Council, by the said last-mentioned Act, as under or by virtue of the 109th section of the said last-mentioned Act may be delegated by the Governor in Council, to have, hold, and exercise the said powers within the said Province of Otago. And whereas the said lands hereinafter described are Crown Lands, subject to be dealt with under the provisions of the said sixteenth section of the "Gold Fields Act 1866," and the said lands are now, or lately were, held in occupation under a lease for depasturing purposes, issued under the "Otago Waste Lands Act 1866." And whereas the Executive Government of the Province of Otago have determined to cancel the said lease as to so much and such part of the lands held under the same as are comprised within the area hereinafter described:

Now, therefore, I, James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province, and by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to the Executive Government of the said Province in this behalf by His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand in Council under the authority of the "Gold Fields Act Amendment Act 1867," and of any and every other power in any wise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby cancel the said lease, in so far as the lands comprised within the area hereinafter described are affected by the said lease, but no further or otherwise, (that is to say)—

SCHEDULE.

All that parcel of land in the Province of Otago, in the

Colony of New Zealand, containing by estimation fourteen thousand five hundred (14,500) acres, more or less situate in the Cromwell and Wakefield Districts, being parts of runs numbered respectively two hundred and forty-five (245) and three hundred and forty (340) on the map of the said districts; bounded by a line commencing at the junction of the Lowburn with the Clutha River, and proceeding southward along the Clutha river to the town of Cromwell twenty-one thousand five hundred (21,500) links, thence in a north-westerly direction along the town boundary ten thousand two hundred (10,200) links, thence in a south-westerly direction along the boundary of the said township three thousand seven hundred and thirty-four (3734) links to section numbered 10, block I, Cromwell District; thence along the north-eastern boundary of the said section nine hundred (900) links; thence along the north-western boundary of the said section three thousand two hundred (3,200) links; thence along the south western boundaries of the said section numbered 10, and the town of Cromwell five thousand five hundred (5500) links, to the Kawarau river; thence in a south-westerly direction along the Kawarau river twenty-two thousand six hundred (22,600) links; thence in a north-westerly direction along the Kawarau river thirty-six thousand (36,000) links, to the junction of a creek; thence in a northerly direction along that creek to a point in a straight line with Trigonometrical Station G, and the junction of Stratford's gully with the Lowburn, fourteen thousand four hundred (14,400) links; thence along the said straight line to the aforesaid junction of Stratford's gully with the Lowburn, twenty-nine thousand five hundred (29,500) links; thence in a south-easterly direction along the Lowburn twenty thousand six hundred (20,600) links to the starting point.

Given under my hand, and issued under the Public Seal of the Province of Otago, in presence of Donald Reid and Robert Stout, Esquires, Members of the Executive Council of the said Province, being also Members of the Provincial Council thereof, this sixth day of November one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

The following Rules and Regulations have been submitted to the Superintendent and Executive Council, in terms of the Cemeteries Reserves Ordinance 1864, and are published for general information
 Dunedin, November 10th, 1874.

1. All charges must be paid in advance when orders are given.
2. Any person or persons making a vault, placing a tombstone or erecting a monument in the Cemetery, by and with the permission of the managers for the time being, and upon payment of required charges, shall maintain and keep up such vault, tombstone, or monument according to the terms of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons heirs near relations, and friends, for ever.
3. Application for such permission must be made to the Secretary or to one of the Managers, and a certificate of such permission, in the form in Schedule B, or to the like effect, may be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the charges in Schedule A.
4. The cost and charges of the burial of any person in such Cemetery will be remitted on proof being given to the satisfaction of the Managers that such person was a pauper at the time of his death, and that there are no funds applicable, and no person is liable for the payment of costs and charges.
5. Orders for interment must be given to the sexton at least six working hours prior to the hour fixed for the funeral, otherwise an extra charge will be made, in terms of Schedule A. No free interment will be allowed without the above notice of six hours.
6. The Managers will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but parties requiring brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of a surveyor appointed by the Managers: and in case if interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent in writing of the party intitled thereto must be left with the order.
7. The information required by Schedule C must be stated at the time of giving the order.
8. The time fixed for the funeral must be the time when the procession is to be at the Cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.
9. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for funerals will be from 8 o'clock a.m. to 5 p.m., from the 1st day of September to the 30th day of April; and from 8 o'clock a.m. to 4 o'clock p.m. in the other four months of the year, except on Sundays, when the usual and only

funerals will be from 2 to 5 o'clock p.m. throughout the year. No funeral will be allowed to take place between the hours of 7 o'clock p.m. and 7 o'clock a.m.

10. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones must be kept in repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owners.

11. Every coffin in a vault, or brick grave must be bricked-in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate or iron; and every coffin in a private grave must have on the lid a metal plate, with the name of the deceased stamped or painted thereon.

12. A drawing of every stone tomb, pedestal, and plan of every fence, monument, or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription must be submitted to the Managers and approved of by them.

13. No servant or any other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the Managers shall receive any gratuity, under penalty of dismissal.

14. The ground will be open daily to the public from sunrise to sunset.

15. A plan of the Cemetery, showing the situation of the graves, shall be kept by the Secretary and may be inspected on payment of the charge mentioned in Schedule A; and registers of all grants shall be kept by the Secretary.

16. The Sexton shall have power to expel from the Cemetery, or to take into custody (as the case may require) any person who shall behave indecorously, or commit any trespass or injury to the trees, flowers, or erections, or otherwise infringe the Ordinance relating to the Cemetery, or the Regulations for the protection of the same; and such person shall be proceeded against according to the provisions of the "Cemeteries Reserve Management Ordinance, 1864."

17. No funeral will be allowed to take place in the Cemetery without a certificate from a Deputy Registrar of Deaths, or the Coroner holding the inquest or inquiry, or a Magistrate; and such certificate must be delivered to the Sexton at the Cemetery before the funeral enters the gate.
