PROCLAMATION.

Setting apart Crown Lands in the Otago Gold Field for the purpose of granting Agricultural Leases.

By His Honor James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago in Council.

WHEREAS by the 33rd section of the "Gold Fields Act, 1866," it is enacted amongst other things that it shall be lawful for the Governor to cause Crown Lands situate within a Gold Field to be selected and set apart for the purpose of granting Agricultural Leases thereon and therefor: And whereas Thomas Dick, Esq., then the Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to and vested in him in that behalf, did, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of the said Province, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, constitute and appoint all the territory therein described, including amongst other lands, the lands hereinafter described, to be a Gold Field under the provisions of the "Gold Fields Act 1866," to be called "Otago Gold Field:" And whereas by the "Gold Fields Act Amendment Act 1867," it is enacted that within any Province in which by any Act or Ordinance, it is provided that the Superintendent shall, in the administration of the Government thereof, act by and with the advice and consent of an Executive Council, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand, and under the public seal of the Colony, from time to time as occasion may require, to delegate to the Executive Government for the time being of such Province, subject or not to any restrictions or limitations as he may think fit, all or any of such powers vested in the Governor, or the Governor in Council, by the "Gold Fields Act 1866," as under or by virtue of the one hundred and ninth section of the said Act may be delegated by the Governor in Council, and in like manner to revoke any such delegation: And Whereas by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, intituled the "Executive Council Ordinance 1861," it is provided that the Superintendent of the said Province shall, in the administration of the Government thereof, act by and

with the advice and consent of an Executive Council: And whereas the Governor hath, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, and in pursuance of the power and authority for that purpose vested in him by the "Gold Fields Act 1866," and subject to its provisions delegated unto the Executive Government for the time being of the Province of Otago all such powers vested in the Governor, or the Governor in Council, by the said last-mentioned Act, as under or by virtue of the 109th section of the said last-mentioned Act may be delegated by the Governor in Council, to have, hold, and exercise the said powers within the said Province of Otago. And whereas the said lands hereinafter described are Crown Lands, subject to be dealt with under the provisions of the said 33rd section of the "Gold Fields Act, 1866," and it is deemed expedient to set the same apart for the purpose of granting agricultural leases thereon and therefor.

Now, therefore, I, James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province, and by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to the Executive Government of the said Province in this behalf by His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand in Council under the authority of the "Gold Fields Act Amendment Act 1867," and of any and every other power in any wise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the lands comprised within the area hereinafter described have been and are hereby selected and set apart by the Executive Government of the Province of Otago for the purpose of granting agricultural leases thereon and therefor (that is to say)—

SCHEDULE.

All that area of land in the Province of Otago, in the Colony of New Zealand, containing by admeasurement two thousand five hundred (2500) acres, more or less, situate in Benger District, being part of Run numbered two hundred (200), comprising portion of Block numbered ten (X.) on the map of the said district: bounded by a line commencing at the south-western corner of Section numbered 20, and proceeding over trigonometrical station X. and along the south-western

boundary of the said Block X. twenty thousand six hundred and twelve (20,612) links, to the boundary of the Run; thence in a north-easterly direction along the boundary of the said Run, forming the north-western boundary of the said Block X., fourteen thousand five hundred and seventy-seven (14,577) links, to the north-eastern boundary of the said Block X.; thence along the said north-eastern boundary across sub-trigonometrical station A, fourteen thousand nine hundred and eighty-seven (14,987) links, to the north-western boundary of Section 10; thence along the north-western boundary of the said Section 10, five thousand five hundred and eleven (5,511) links, to north-west corner of said section 10; thence along the south-eastern boundaries of Sections 10 and 11, thirty-six hundred and twenty-nine (3629) links; thence in a south-westerly direction along the north-eastern boundary of Section 19, seventeen hundred and seventy-six (1776) links, to a road line; thence along the road line, fifteen hundred and fifty-nine (1559) links, to intersection with the south-eastern boundary of said Block X.; thence along the south-eastern boundary six thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight (6928) links, to the starting point, excepting out of the above description pre-emptive right marked C.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Provincial Government Buildings, Dunedin, the sixteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four. Present—His Honor James Macandrew, the Superintendent, Donald Reid and Robert Stout, Esquires, Members of the Executive Council of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by the second Section of the "Salmon and Trout Act 1867," the Governor of New Zealand is authorised to make Regulations for preserving and propagating salmon and trout, and regulating fishing for salmon and trout, and for other purposes in the said section particularly mentioned: And whereas by the twelfth section of the said Act the Governor is empowered by order in Council, under his hand and the public Seal of the Colony, from time to time to delegate to the Superintendent, or the Provincial Executive of any Province, all or any of the powers vested in the Governor or the Governor in Council by the said Act, subject or not to any limitations or restrictions as he might think fit: And whereas the Governor hath, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, and in pursuance and in exercise of the powers and authorities for that purpose vested in him by the said Act, delegated to the Executive Government of the Province of Otago all the powers vested in the Governor or the Governor in Council by the said Act exercisable within the Province of Otago: And whereas it is deemed expedient by the Executive Government of the Province of Otago to make regulations under the said Act for the purposes hereinafter particularly specified.

Now, therefore, His Honor James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province of Otago, doth by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to the Executive Council of the Province of Otago, and of every and any other power in anywise enabling the Provincial Executive in this behalf, hereby make the Regulations following: (that is to say)—

1. The ensuing months of December, 1874, January and February, 1875, shall be an open season for brown trout fishing by rod in the following streams, namely:—Waitati river, Shag river, Kakanui river, Island stream, Waikouaiti river, Water of Leith, and Fulton's creek, West Taieri; but no person shall be allowed to fish for brown trout by rod as aforesaid without first obtaining a

license so to do under the hand of the Provincial Treasurer of the Province of Otago, and for every such license there shall be paid by the party applying for the same the sum of £1.

2. No person shall be allowed to use any net for the purpose of fishing at or near the mouths of streams or rivers on the northern seaboard, from Otago Harbor to the Waitaki, during the months of November and December, 1874, and January, February, March, April, and May, 1875.
