PROCLAMATION.

Cancellation of Lease to Depasture Stock on certain Crown Lands in the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by the sixteenth section of the "Gold Fields Act 1866," it is enacted that when any Gold Mine or Gold Field shall be discovered and proclaimed upon any Crown Lands, which at the date of the passing of the said Act shall have been held under license or lease for depasturing purposes, it should be lawful for the Governor at his discretion to cancel the license or lease, under which such land shall have been held in occupation, as regards the whole or any part of the lands so held under such license or lease, or with the concurrence of the licensee, or lessee, to suspend such lease or license as regards the whole or any part of such lands. And whereas Thomas Dick, Esquire then the Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to and vested in him in that behalf, did, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of the said Province, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, constitute and appoint all the territory therein described, including amongst other lands, the lands hereinafter described, to be a Gold Field under the provisions of the "Gold Fields Act 1866," to be called "Otago Gold Field." And whereas by the "Gold Fields Act Amendment Act 1867," it is enacted that within any Province in which by any Act or Ordinance, it is provided that the Superintendent shall, in the administration of the Government thereof, act by and with the advice and consent of an Executive Council, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand, and under the public seal of the Colony, from time to time as occasion may require, to delegate to the Executive Government for the time being of such Province, subject or not to any restrictions or limitations as he may think fit, all or any of such powers vested in the Governor, or the Governor in Council, by the "Gold Fields Act 1866," as under or by virtue of the one hundred and ninth section of the said Act may be delegated by the Governor in Council, and in like manner to revoke any such delegation: And Whereas by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial

Council of the Province of Otago, intituled the "Executive Council Ordinance 1861," it is provided that the Superintendent of the said Province shall, in the administration of the Government thereof, act by and with the advice and consent of an Executive Council: And whereas the Governor hath, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, and in pursuance of the power and authority for that purpose vested in him by the "Gold Fields Act 1866," and subject to its provisions delegated unto the Executive Government for the time being of the Province of Otago all such powers vested in the Governor, or the Governor in Council, by the said last-mentioned Act, as under or by virtue of the 109th section of the said last-mentioned Act may be delegated by the Governor in Council, to have, hold, and exercise the said powers within the said Province of Otago. And whereas the said lands hereinafter described are Crown Lands, subject to be dealt with under the provisions of the said sixteenth section of the "Gold-fields Act 1866," and the said lands are now, or lately were, held in occupation under a lease for depasturing purposes, issued under the "Otago Waste Lands Act 1866:" And whereas the Executive Government of the Province of Otago have determined to cancel the said lease as to so much and such part of the lands held under the same as are comprised within the area hereinafter described:

Now, therefore, I, James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province, and by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to the Executive Government of the said Province in this behalf by His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand in Council under the authority of the "Gold Fields Act Amendment Act 1867," and of any and every other power in any wise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the lands comprised within the area hereinafter described have been and are hereby selected and set apart by the Executive Government of the Province of Otago for the purpose of granting agricultural leases thereon and therefor (that is to say)—

SCHEDULE.

All that area in Run numbered 223, Province of Otago,

Colony of New Zealand, containing by admeasurement two hundred and thirty-five (235) acres, two (2) roods, and eleven (11) poles, more or less, being sections numbered 1 and 2, block III., on the map of the Tiger Hill District, and section numbered 1, block I., on the map of the Lauder District; bounded towards the north by Crown lands, one thousand four hundred and ninety-four (1494) links, and also two thousand seven hundred and thirty-three and a half (2733½) links; towards the east by Crown lands, four thousand six hundred twenty-six (4626) links, and also one thousand four hundred (1400) links; towards the south-east by a road line three thousand eight hundred (3800) links; towards the south by Crown lands three thousand two hundred and thirty-eight (3238) links, and also four thousand two hundred and sixty-two (4262) links; towards the north-west by a road line, one thousand four hundred and eighty-eight (1488) links; and by Crown lands, nine thousand one hundred and forty-nine (9149) links.

PROCLAMATION.

Fixing certain months during which native Game may be killed in the District of Southland Province of Otago.

By His Honor James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by the eleventh section of the Protection of Animals Act, 1873, it is provided that no native game shall be hunted, shot, taken or killed in any part of the Province except during such months as may from time to time be proclaimed by the Superintendent. Now therefore I, James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, do hereby by virtue and in exercise of the power conferred upon me by the above-mentioned

section, proclaim the months of April, May, June and July in each year to be the months during which native game shall be hunted, shot, taken or killed in that part of the Province known as the district of Southland.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Provincial Government Buildings, Dunedin, this 20th day of November, 1874, present.

WHEREAS by the thirty-sixth section of the "Turnpikes Ordinance, 1866," it is provided that the Superintendent and Executive Council may cause check-bars to be placed on any district road in the said Province, and may cause tolls to be levied at such bars, and taken from such persons who may travel by such district roads for the purpose of evading tolls leviable on main roads, provided that one-half of such tolls shall be handed to the District Board in which the road or roads is or are situated: Now therefore His Honor the Superintendent, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Ordinance, and in exercise of every power and authority enabling him in that behalf, and by and with the advice and consent of his Executive Council, doth hereby order that a check-bar be placed at the junction of the road to the Township of Opoho with the Main North Road, and that tolls be levied at such bar, and taken from such persons (excepting persons resident in the said Township of Opoho or who may have business with persons resident in the said Township) who may travel by such district roads, for the purpose of evading tolls leviable on the said Main North Road, and that one-half of the tolls so levied at such check-bar be handed to the District Board of the North-East Valley Road District.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.
