PRIZES FOR LABOR-SAVING MACHINES.

NOTICE.—The Provincial Council of Otago being desirous of stimulating invention and securing the introduction of labor-saving appliances calculated to

assist in developing the agricultural resources of the Province, has voted a sum of £150, with a view to enable a first and second prize to be offered for the most approved drainage ploughs—the first prize to be £100, the second prize £50,—the prizes to be awarded on such terms, and in such amounts, as the Government may consider advisable.

Notice is hereby given that in accordance with the vote of the Council, a competition of Draining Machines will be held during the month of August next, in a stiff clay soil, in a locality to be hereafter selected, contiguous to Dunedin.

The following particulars are published for the information of intending competitors:—The judges to be appointed shall be composed of machinists and agriculturists; and in awarding the prizes the following points will be kept in view:—

1st. To secure a machine which will remove the soil and finish a drain to the depth of at least 42 inches, and which will leave the drain ready for the pipes with the least amount of manual labor.

2nd. Or, failing the above, a machine that will remove part of the soil, and loosen the remainder to a depth of say 36 to 42 inches, so that it could be quickly removed by manual labor.

Each machine to be capable of adjustment so as to cut different widths of drains, to suit main, sub-main, and ordinary drains, say 12 inches wide at bottom for main drains, and 2½ or 3 inches for small drains.

In determining the merits of the respective machines, the Judges will consider the quality of the work done, the price of the machine, and the cost of the drain, as completed in each case, and other things being equal, the preference will be given to the machine which removes the smallest quantity of earth compatible with the full attainment of the object desired, and which can be supplied at the lowest cost.

Should the judges consider that the machines exhibited do not merit the full amount of the premium, the prizes will be awarded only to such an extent, and in such amounts as they may recommend.

SCHOLARSHIPS.

THERE are offered for competition, to Students intending to study for the Ministry of the Presbyterian Church of Otago and Southland—

The LANG Scholarship, of the annual value of £25, and the RIVERTON Scholarship, of the annual value of £15 tenable for three years—to be competed for by Students entering on their University course; and a PRESBYTERY Scholarship, tenable for two years, of the annual value of £25—to be competed for by Students of the second year.

The subjects for examination for the Lang and Riverton Scholarship are—1. Arithmetic; 2. English Grammar; 3. Euclid, Book I., and Algebra, the four elementary rules; 4. English History, 1793 to 1837; 5. Latin, De Amicitia; 6. Greek Grammar; 7. Scripture knowledge, Genesis and Acts.

BYE LAWS of the Caversham Road District, duly made in pursuance of the powers and provisions contained in "The Otago Roads Ordinance 1871," "The Otago Roads Ordinance Amendment Ordinance 1872," "The Otago Roads Ordinance 1871 Amendment Ordinance 1874," "The Highway Boards Empowering Act 1871," and "The Highway Boards Empowering Act 1872," and passed at a meeting of the Caversham Road Board held in the Caversham Road District on the fourth day of February, 1875," intituled "Bye Laws to provide for the order and good government of the Caversham Road District."

1. It shall not be lawful for any person to wheel, lead, drive or ride in any dray, cart, carriage, or barrow, or to ride on horseback upon, or to lead or drive any horses or cattle across or along any footpath formed alongside of any street line, or District Road, and any person committing an offence against this bye-law shall, on conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding five pounds.

2. It shall not be lawful for any person to draw or trail any sledge, timber, or other material, upon or along any formed street line or District Road, and any person committing an offence against this bye-law shall, on conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding five pounds.

3. Every person who throws any glass, dirt, filth, manure, ashes, or rubbish, or allows any night soil or other offensive matter to be spilt or otherwise cast upon any street line or District Road or allows to run from any house or premises any foul or sewerage water on to any street line or District Road shall, on conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding five pounds.

4. Every person who throws or lays any building or other materials or constructs or erects any scaffolding or fence upon any street line or district road, save under permission of the Road Board in writing first obtained shall on conviction forfeit a sum not exceeding twenty pounds.

5. If any person shall place any house building or fence or any part thereof upon any portion of any street-line or District road he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding ten pounds, and a further sum not exceeding five pounds, for every day while the same shall so continue.

6. If any person shall obstruct any street line or District road, whether by allowing any vehicle to remain on such street line or District road, or by placing goods thereon or otherwise, shall, on conviction forfeit a sum not exceeding ten pounds.

7. If any horses or cattle be found on any street line or District road without any person having the charge thereof, or if turned out for grazing purposes, although in charge of any person the Board shall have power to impound such, and in addition to all poundage charges, the owners of such horses or cattle shall, on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding five shillings per head, which sum shall be collected by the poundkeeper and paid over by him to the Road Board.

8. No drove cattle shall be driven on any street line or District road without having an attendant going before such drove cattle and without being kept in a compact body, and any person offending against this section shall, on conviction forfeit a sum not exceeding twenty pounds, and in the interpretation of this Bye Law the term "drove cattle" shall be taken to mean all cattle being driven in or through the Road District to or from Market or Slaughter-yard

Sheriffs' Districts Defined.

NORMANBY,

Administrator of the Government.

WHEREAS by "The Sheriffs Act, 1858," it is enacted that after the passing of the said Act it shall be lawful for the Governor, and for no other person, to appoint fit persons to be Sheriffs within the colony, who shall hold their office during pleasure; and that it shall be lawful for the Governor, and for no other person, to define the districts within which the jurisdiction of the several Sheriffs shall be exercised, and the limits of such districts from time to time to alter as occasion may require:

Now therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Administrator of the Government of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority in me vested in this behalf, do hereby define the districts described and named in the Schedule hereto, to be, on and from the twenty-first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, Sheriff's Districts, under the provisions of "The Sheriffs Act, 1858."

As witness the hand of His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, this sixth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five.

The Sheriff's District of Otago.

This district comprises the whole of the Province of Otago, excepting that portion contained in the Sheriff's District of Southland, hereinafter defined, together with the adjacent islands.

The Sheriff's District of Southland.

This district is bounded towards the North by a right line from the summit of Takerahaka Peak in the Eyre Mountains to the junction of the Windley Creek with the Oreti River, and thence by a right line due west to the Waiau River; towards the west by the Waiau River to the sea; thence towards the south by the sea to the mouth of the Maitauri River; and towards the east by the Maitauri River to its source, and thence by a right line to the summit of Takerahaka Peak, the commencing point. Regula Generales

SUPREME COURT OF NEW ZEALAND.

WHEREAS by "The Imprisonment for Debt Abolition Act, 1874," (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act,") it is enacted that in the said Act the term "prescribed" means, as respects the Supreme Court, prescribed by General Rules or Orders to be made in pursuance of "The Supreme Court Act, 1860," or any Acts altering or amending the same:

And whereas by "The Supreme Court Act, 1860," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Judges of the Supreme Court, amongst other things, from time to time to make such additional rules touching the practice, pleading, and procedure of the Court in all matters, both civil and criminal, as the Judges may deem advisable:

Now therefore, by virtue of the powers vested in us by the said Act and by "The Supreme Court Act, 1860," it is ordered by us, the Judges of the said Court, that the following General Rules shall come into and be in force on and after the fifteenth day of January, 1875.

COMMITTAL TO PRISON, UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF "THE IMPRISONMENT FOR DEBT ABOLITION ACT, 1874."

1. All applications to commit to prison under sections five, six, and seven of the said Act shall, in the first instance, be made by summons before a Judge, which shall specify the date and other particulars of the judgment or order for non-payment of which the application is made, together with the amount due, and be indorsed with the name and place of abode or office of business of the solicitor actually applying for the summons; and when such solicitor shall apply for the same as agent for any other solicitor, the name and place of abode of such other solicitor shall also be indorsed on the summons; and in case no solicitor shall be employed to apply for the summons, then it shall be indorsed with a memorandum expressing that the same has been applied for by the plaintiff or defendant in person, as the case may be, mentioning or describing also the place of abode of such plaintiff or defendant.

2. The service of the summons, wherever it may be practicable, shall be personal; but if it appear to the Judge that reasonable efforts have been made to effect personal service, and either that the summons has come to the knowledge of the debtor, or that he wilfully evades service, an order may be made as if personal service had been effected, upon such terms as to the Judge may seem fit.

2. Proof of the means of the debtor, or other matters specified in the subsections of section six of the said Act shall, whenever practicable, be given by affidavit; but if it appear to the Judge, either before or at the hearing, that a *visâ voce* examination, either of the debtor or of any other person, or the production of any document, is necessary or expedient, an order may be made commanding the attendance of any such person before the Judge, at a time and place to be therein mentioned, for the purpose of being examined on oath touching the matter in question, and (where the production of any document is necessary or expedient) for the production of any such document, subject to such terms and conditions as to the Judge may seem fit.

4. The order of committal (which may be in the form A in the Schedule, or to the like effect) shall, before delivery to the Sheriff, be indorsed with the particulars required by Rule 1 of these Rules.

Concurrent orders may be issued for execution in different Sheriffs districts. The Sheriff and the officer shall be entitled to the same fees in respect thereof as are now payable upon a *capias ad satisfaciendum*.

5. Upon payment of the sum or sums mentioned in the order (including the Sheriff's fees in like manner as upon a *capias ad satisfaciendum*), the debtor shall be entitled to a certificate in the form B in the Schedule, or to the like effect, signed by the solicitor, in the cause of the creditor, or signed by the creditor, and attested by a solicitor on his behalf, or a Justice of the Peace.

6. Orders to arrest under the fifteenth section of the said Act (which may be in the form C in the Schedule, or to the like effect) shall be made upon affidavit and *ex parte*; but the defendant shall be at liberty, at any time after the arrest, to apply to rescind or vary the order, or to be discharged from custody, or for such other relief as may be just; such orders shall, before delivery to the Sheriff, be indorsed with the particulars required by Rule 1 of these Rules. Concurrent orders may be issued for arrest in different Sheriff's districts. The Sheriff and officer shall be entitled to the same fees in respect thereof as are now payable upon a *capias*.

7. The security to be given by the defendant may

be a deposit in Court of the amount mentioned in the order, by a bond to the plaintiff by the defendant and two sufficient sureties (or, with leave of a Judge, more than two), or with the plaintiff's consent, any other form of security. The plaintiff may, within four days after receiving particulars of the names and addresses of the proposed sureties, and the form of the proposed bond give notice that he objects thereto, stating therein in what particulars; and in case of his so doing, the sufficiency of the security shall be determined by the Registrar, who shall have power to award the costs of such reference to either party. It shall be the plaintiff's duty to obtain an appointment for that purpose; and unless he does so within four days after giving notice of objection, the security shall be deemed sufficient.

8. The money deposited, and the security, and all proceedings thereon, shall be subject to the order and control of the Court, or a Judge.

9. Unless otherwise ordered, the costs of and consequence on an order to arrest, shall be costs in the cause.

10. Upon payment into Court of the amount mentioned in the order, a receipt shall be given by the proper officer; and upon receiving the bond or other security, a certificate to that effect shall be given, signed or attested by the plaintiff's solicitor; and the delivery of such receipt or certificate to the Sheriff shall entitle the defendant to be discharged out of custody.

11. The Sheriff or other officer named either in an order of committal or an order to arrest under the fifteenth section shall, within two days after the arrest, indorse on the order the true date of such arrest.
