PROCLAMATION.

Setting apart 1,582 Acres of Land in the Herriott Hundred for occupation on deferred payment.

By His Honor James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by the 47th section of the Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Otago Waste Lands Act, 1872," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent, with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council, to set apart in any part of the Province, districts or blocks of land within which licenses to occupy land and leases thereof on deferred payments may be granted either exclusively or within which the land shall be open for license or lease on deferred payment, or for sale on immediate payment.

And whereas the Provincial Council of the Province of Otago has recommended the Superintendent of the said Province to set apart the lands hereinafter specified for alienation on deferred payments :

Now therefore I, James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by and with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council as aforesaid, do hereby, by virtue and in exercise of the power conferred upon me by "The Otago Waste Lands Act, 1872," and of every or any power in this behalf enabling me, proclaim, declare, and set apart all that district called Blocks IV. and V., Greenvale District, as a District within which the land shall be open for license or lease as aforesaid, or for sale on immediate payment; and I do further by virtue of the aforesaid powers proclaim and declare that those sections numbered respectively 1, 8, 11, 13, 23, and 25, block V., and sections 16, 22, 23, 24, 26, and 30, block IV., on the map of the said District, will be open on the 13th day of April, 1875, for application for license and lease, on deferred payment as provided in the Otago Waste Lands Act, 1872.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Provincial Government Buildings, Dunedin, this 19th day of February, 1875;

Present—His Honor the Superintendent; Donald Reid George Turnbull, and Robert Stout, Esquires.

WHEREAS by Proclamation bearing date the 3rd day of June, 1868, made by the Superintendent of Otago, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province, and published in the Otago Provincial Gazette, No. 553, under the hand of the said Superintendent of the Province of Otago, and under the public seal of the said Province, certain regulations were made for the depasturing of stock upon the Waste Lands of the Crown within the Otago Gold Field: And whereas by Proclamation bearing date the 6th day of October, 1868, made by the Superintendent of the Province of Otago as aforesaid, and published in the Otago Provincial Government Gazette, No. 572, as aforesaid, the said regulations of the 23rd June, 1868, were altered and amended: And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 10th day of September, 1873, made by John Theodore Thomas Boyd, Esquire, Deputy Superintendent for the time being of the Province of Otago, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province, the said regulations were further altered and amended: And whereas it is expedient to further amend the said Regulations, in so far as they relate to the Wakatipu District:

Now, therefore, James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province doth, by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to the Executive Government of the Province of Otago in that behalf, hereby revoke the Regulations 1 and 2 made under the said Order in Council bearing date the 10th day of September, 1873, by which regulations numbered 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, of the said regulations of the 23rd day of June, 1868, were revoked, and regulations numbered 13 and 16 of the said regulations were amended so far as the same apply to the said Wakatipu District, and doth make the regulations following in lieu thereof, as regards the said Wakatipu District, (that is to say) of regulations

numbered 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, of the said regulations of the 23rd day of June, 1868, and in lieu of regulations numbered 1 and 2 of the said regulations made under the said Order in Council bearing date the 10th day of September, 1873.

Depasturing Regulations, Otago Gold Field, Wakatipu District.

1. Mr. Thomas M'Morran, Ranger in the said Wakatipu District, shall have all the powers, and exercise all the functions, held and exercised by the Board of Wardens for the said District.

2. Sections 13 and 16 of the said Regulations of the 23rd day of June, 1868, shall be read and construed as if the words "Mr. Thomas M'Morran, Ranger in the Wakatipu District of the Otago Gold Field," had been originally inserted in the place of the words "Board of Wardens."

PRIZES FOR LABOR-SAVING MACHINES.

NOTICE.—The Provincial Council of Otago being desirous of stimulating invention and securing the introduction of labor-saving appliances calculated to assist in developing the agricultural resources of the Province, has voted a sum of £150, with a view to enable a first and second prize to be offered for the most approved drainage ploughs—the first prize to be £100, the second prize £50,—the prizes to be awarded on such terms, and in such amounts, as the Government may consider advisable.

Notice is hereby given that in accordance with the vote of the Council, a competition of *Drainage Machines* will be held during the month of August next, in a stiff clay soil, in a locality to be hereafter selected, contiguous to Dunedin.

The following particulars are published for the information of intending competitors:—The judges to be appointed shall be composed of machinists and agriculturists; and in awarding the prizes the following points will be kept in view:—

1st. To secure a machine which will remove the soil and finish a drain to the depth of at least 42 inches, and which will leave the drain ready for the pipes with the least amount of manual labor.

2nd. Or, failing the above, a machine that will remove part of the soil, and loosen the remainder to a depth of say 36 to 42 inches, so that it could be quickly removed by manual labor.

Each machine to be capable of adjustment so as to cut different widths of drains, to suit main, sub-main, and ordinary drains, say 12 inches wide at bottom for main drains, and 2½ or 3 inches for small drains.

In determining the merits of the respective machines, the Judges will consider the quality of the work done, the price of the machine, and the cost of the drain, as completed in each case, and other things being equal, the preference will be given to the machine which removes the smallest quantity of earth compatible with the full attainment of the object desired, and which can be supplied at the lowest cost.

Should the judges consider that the machines exhibited do not merit the full amount of the premium, the prizes will be awarded only to such an extent, and in such amounts as they may recommend.

MOKARETA HUNDRED.

BYE-LAWS agreed to at Meeting of Wardens, 15th February, 1875:—

1. No person shall bring any cattle to the Mokareta Hundred to be depastured thereon, nor shall any person remove any cattle therefrom, without giving at least one day's notice of his intention so to do, to a Warden; but this Bye-Law shall not apply to persons driving cattle through the Hundred, unless such cattle shall have continued upon the Hundred for a longer period than twenty-four hours.

2. No person shall disturb or harass cattle lawfully depasturing upon the Hundred, provided always that any person holding a license to depasture cattle within the Hundred, or any person duly authorised by him, may drive such cattle for the purpose of collecting such as may belong to him, and for the legitimate use of his right of pasturage within the Hundred; but in case it should be necessary for such purpose to drive any cattle belonging to any other person to a greater distance than half a mile the person so driving such cattle must separate his own cattle from those of other persons, and return the latter to the place from whence they were driven.

3. The number of small cattle that shall be allowed to be depastured on the Waste Lands adjoining the township of Wyndham, shall not exceed sixty head.

4. Every person offending against any of the foregoing Bye-Laws shall forfeit any sum not exceeding five pounds for every such offence.

Officers appointed by the General and Provincial Governments and Municipal Corporations liable to pay Stamp Duties before entering on duties of Office.

Office of the Commissioner of Stamp Duties,
Wellington, 19th January, 1875.

THE Commissioner of Stamps desires to point out to Heads of Departments in the General and Provincial Governments, and also in Municipal Corporations, that by section 12 of "The Stamp Duties Act Amendment Act, 1871," it is provided that every person, before he shall enter on the duties of his office or employment, is required to pay the proper duty in respect thereof to the Commissioner; and no Warrant or Letter of Appointment shall be issued or granted by the Responsible Officer of the Department to which such office shall be attached, or within whose control the same may be, until he has satisfied himself of the payment of such duty.

The Commissioner having been informed of certain cases in which officers have been promoted from one

branch of the Service to another without proper Letters or Warrants of Appointment, and also of cases where Letters of Appointment had been issued without previous payment of the Stamp Duty, would draw attention to the circumstance that all unstamped appointments are invalid, and that the Appointees may become liable to the penalties in the Statute for unstamped documents.

Heads of Departments are also informed that all appointments whatsoever, whether liable to duty or not, should be submitted for assessment to the Commissioner, when the duty exigible will be noted on the instrument of appointment, which will thereupon be returned to the Department forwarding it. The amount so assessed will be collected as at present. If no duty be payable, the fact will be so noted.

Attention is specially directed to the circumstance that after this date the Commissioners of Audit and the various Provincial Auditors will decline to pass the salary of any officer on whose appointment duty is payable, unless the terms of this notice be complied with.
