By His Honor James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

**W**HEREAS by the 47th section of the Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Otago Waste Lands Act, 1872," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent, with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council, to set apart in any part of the Province districts or blocks of land within which licenses to occupy land and leases thereof on deferred payments may be granted either exclusively or within which the land shall be open for license or lease on deferred payment, or for sale on immediate payment.

And whereas the Provincial Council of the Province of Otago has recommended the Superintendent of the said Province to set apart the lands hereinafter specified for alienation on deferred payments:

Now, therefore, I, James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by and with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council as aforesaid, do hereby, by virtue and in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by "The Otago Waste Lands Act, 1872," and of every or any power in this behalf enabling me, proclaim, declare, and set apart all those sections numbered respectively 6, 7, 10, 11, 12, 13, 16, and 17, Block I., Tiger Hill District; section 23, Block II., Tiger Hill District; and sections 2, 7, 9, 12, 13, 15, 17, 18, 20, 28, 29, 32, 33, 36, 38, Block III., Lander District, on the map of the said Districts, and the said lands will be open on the 7th day of February, 1876, for application for license and lease, on deferred payment.

### REGULATIONS OF OTAGO NORMAL SCHOOL.

I. Candidates for training shall be arranged under the following classes:—

- (A) Pupil teachers who have attained their 18th year in the case of males, and their 17th year in the case of females, and who have satisfactorily completed their term of apprenticeship, or whose transference to the Normal School has been approved by the Board.
- (B) Untrained assistant teachers, and teachers who have been employed in the Board's Schools, and have been recommended by the inspectors of schools for a course of training.
- (C) Other persons not under the ages specified in class A, nor over 35 years of age, who have furnished the Board with satisfactory certificates of good moral character and sound health, and who are free from any bodily infirmity likely to impair their usefulness as teachers. The Board does not bind itself to admit all candidates of this class who may pass the entrance examination, but only such numbers as may from time to time be specified.

II. Candidates of Classes A and C shall pass an entrance examination prior to their being admitted as students in training? The entrance examination shall be that prescribed for pupil teachers of the first class in the Board's Regulations of September 15, 1874.

III. Provision shall be made in the Normal School for the instruction of students in training; but to all students who shall pass the matriculation examination of the Otago University, permission shall be given to attend certain classes in that institution, under such regulations as may hereafter be made.

IV. Students of classes A and C shall be examined at the end of the first and second years for provisional certificates of III and II classes respectively, in accordance with Regulations (September 15, 1874). If unsuccessful in passing either of these examinations, they may, on the recommendation of the examiners, remain in training for another year; but by a second failure they shall forfeit all claim to further aid from the Board.

V. Students of classes A and C, who succeed in passing the prescribed examinations, and whose conduct continues to give satisfaction, shall remain in training not more than two years. Students of class B shall remain in training for the term prescribed, when recommended for training by the inspectors of schools.

VI. Students in training shall be paid monthly, or quarterly, at the rate of £ per annum in the case of males, and at the rate of £ per annum in the case of females. In no case shall any of the above payments be made unless certificates of attendance and good conduct, signed by the Rector of the Normal School, are produced.

VII. Every student shall, prior to admission to training, sign a declaration or bond containing the following provisions:—That he intends bonâ fide to adopt and follow the profession of teaching; that he shall attend regularly throughout the course of training until he shall have obtained the lowest grade certificate, or shall have received permission from the Board to discontinue attendance, or until he shall have received notice of the withdrawal of maintenance allowance; that he shall on the successful completion of his course of study and training, teach in schools under the Board for a period of not less than two years; and that in the

event of his failing to comply with any of the foregoing conditions he shall refund to the Board all moneys expended on his behalf during his training. The Board may at any time require security for the refunding of such moneys.

## THE PRACTISING SCHOOL.

The Practising School shall be placed, as far as practicable, upon terms of perfect equality with the Dunedin District Schools as regards the rates of School fees, the amount and quality of the instruction given, the school hours, holidays, &c.

*"Extract from Section XIV. of the Education Ordinance, 1864."*

"On the second Monday in the month of January in each year, a public meeting of the owners and occupiers of land and householders in every Educational district, being male persons above twenty-one years of age, shall be held at a time and place to be fixed by the Secretary of the Board, and notified by public advertisement at least one month previously, and in such other manner as the Board shall direct, and at such meeting a Chairman shall be chosen and the School Committee for the preceding year shall give a full report of their proceedings, and thereupon the electors present shall proceed to elect, either by show of hands or by ballot, as shall be determined upon by the said meeting, a new School Committee for the ensuing year of not less than five, nor more than nine persons possessing the qualifications prescribed by clause 13, and may re-elect all, or any of the persons going out of office, to be members of such new Committee, and every Committee so to be appointed shall hold office until the appointment of their successors."

*Alteration of Place of Embarkation and Landing of Prisoners to and from the Hulk "Sarah and Esther."*

(L.S.) NORMANBY GOVERNOR.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the ninth section of "The Prisons Act, 1873," it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor may from time to time, by Proclamation published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, appoint any hulk, ship, or floating prison to be used as and to be a public prison for the reception and safe keeping of prisoners convicted and sentenced for any offences

by any Court in New Zealand; and may from time to time define, by Proclamation published as aforesaid, the limits and boundaries around such hulk within which no person shall come, and the place of embarking and landing prisoners to and from such hulk; and that any such Proclamation as aforesaid may from time to time be altered or revoked by the Governor:

And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the seventeenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, the hulk called the "Sarah and Esther," then moored off Tahita Point, in the Otago Harbour, was appointed to be a public prison within the meaning of the said Act, and the space of twelve yards around such hulk was defined to be the limits and boundaries within which no person shall come, and Deborah Bay was defined to be the place of embarking and landing prisoners to and from such hulk:

And whereas owing to an alteration in the position of the said hulk, it is expedient to alter the said Proclamation:

Now therefore, I, George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Act, do hereby define Otago Peninsula to be the place of embarking and landing prisoners to and from such hulk.

Given under the hand of His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, at the Government House, at Wellington, this sixteenth day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five.
