PROCLAMATION.

Setting apart Crown Lands in the Otago Gold Field for the purpose of Granting Agricultural Leases.

By His Honor James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, in Council.

WHEREAS by the thirty-third section of the "Gold Fields Act 1866," it is enacted amongst other things that it shall be lawful for the Governor to cause Crown Lands situated within a Gold Field to be selected and set apart for the purpose of granting Agricultural Leases thereon and therefor: And whereas Thomas Dick, Esquire, then the Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to and vested in him in that behalf, did, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette of the said Province, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, constitute and appoint all the territory therein described, including amongst other lands the lands hereinafter described to be a Gold Field under the provisions of the "Gold Fields Acts 1866," to be called "Otago Gold Field:" And whereas by the "Gold Fields Act Amendment Act 1867," it is enacted that within any Province in which by any Act or Ordinance it is provided that the Superintendent shall, in the administration of the Government thereof, act by and with the advice and consent of an Executive Council, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand, and under the public seal of the Colony, from time to time as occasion may require, to delegate to the Executive Government for the time being of such Province, subject or not to any restrictions or limitations as he may think fit, all or any of such powers vested in the Governor, or the Governor in Council, by the "Gold Fields Act 1866," as under, or by virtue of the one hundred and ninth section of the said Act may be delegated by the Governor in Council, and in like manner to revoke any such delegation: And whereas by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago intituled the "Executive Council Ordinance 1861," it is provided that the Superintendent of the said Province shall, in the administration of the Government thereof, act by and with the advice and consent of an Executive Council: And whereas the Governor hath, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, and in pursuance of the power and authority for that purpose

vested in him by the "Gold Fields Act, 1866," and subject to its provisions, delegated unto the Executive Government for the time being of the Province of Otago, all such powers vested in the Governor, or the Governor in Council, by the said last-mentioned Act, as under or by virtue of the one hundred and ninth section of the said last-mentioned Act, may be delegated by the Governor in Council, to have, hold, and exercise the said powers within the said Province of Otago: And whereas the said lands hereinafter described as Crown Lands, subject to be dealt with under the provisions of the said thirty-third section of the "Gold Fields Act, 1866," and it is deemed expedient to set the same apart for the purpose of granting agricultural leases thereon and therefor:

Now therefore I, James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province, and by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to the Executive Government of the said Province in this behalf by His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand in Council, under the authority of the "Gold Fields Act Amendment Act, 1867," and of any and every other power in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the lands comprised within the area hereinafter described have been and are hereby selected and set apart by the Executive Government of the Province of Otago for the purpose of granting agricultural leases thereon and therefor (that is to say),

All that area in the Province of Otago, Colony of New Zealand containing by admeasurement three thousand and two (3002) acres more or less being put of Run numbered 178 on the map of the south-eastern Pastoral District of the said province and now sections numbered respectively 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, and 17, Block XV. Crookston District together with all the roads intersecting the said Block bounded towards the north-west by a road line four thousand eight hundred and forty-two (4,842) links towards the south-east by a road line and part of section numbered 2 one thousand two hundred and fifty (1,250) links towards the north-east by section numbered 22 four thousand (4,000) links towards the north-west by section numbered 22 one thousand two hundred and fifty (1,250) links towards the north-east and south-east by Crown Lands twenty-eight thousand six hundred (28,600) links towards the south by Crown Lands five thousand four hundred and forty (5,440) links towards the north-west south-east and south-west by the main road from the Beaumont to the Teviot thirty-three thousand four hundred (33,400) links.

Setting apart Crown Lands in the Otago Gold Field for the purpose of granting Agricultural Leases.

WHEREAS by the thirty-third section of the "Gold Fields Act 1866," it is enacted amongst other things that it shall be lawful for the Governor to cause Crown Lands situate within a Gold Field to be selected and set apart for the purpose of granting Agricultural Leases thereon and therefor: And whereas the said lands hereinafter described are Crown Lands, subject to be dealt with under the provisions of the said thirty-third section of the "Gold Fields Act 1866," and it is deemed expedient to set the same apart for the purpose of granting agricultural leases thereon and therefor:

Now therefore I, James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province, and by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to the Executive Government of the said Province in this behalf by His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand in Council, under the authority of the "Gold Fields Act Amendment Act, 1867," and of any and every other power in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the lands comprised within the area hereinafter described have been and are hereby selected and set apart by the Executive Government of the Province of Otago for the purpose of granting agricultural leases thereon and therefor (that is to say)—

[All that area in the Province of Otago, Colony of New Zealand, containing by admeasurement two hundred (200) acres more or less, being part of Run numbered 308B on the map of the south-eastern Pastoral Districts of the said Province, and now Section numbered 3 on the map of the Upper Taieri Side District: Bounded towards the north-east and south-east by a road line eight thousand and thirty-eight (8,038) links; towards the south-east by Section numbered 4 two thousand six hundred and eighty-two (2682) links; towards the south-west by Crown lands four thousand six hundred and seventy-seven and a-half (4677½) links; towards the north-west by Crown lands and Section numbered 2 two thousand and seventy (2070) links; towards the south-west by Section numbered 2 one thousand and seventy-nine (1079) links; and towards the north-west by a road line three thousand four hundred and seventy-seven and a-half (3477½) links.

PROCLAMATION.

Cancellation of Leases to Depasture Stock on certain Crown Lands in the Province of Otago.

By His Honor James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, in Council.

WHEREAS by the sixteenth section of the "Gold Fields Act 1866," it is enacted that when any Gold Mine or Gold Field shall be discovered and proclaimed upon any Crown Lands, which at the date of the passing of the said Act shall have been held under license or lease for depasturing purposes, it should be lawful for the Governor, at his discretion, to cancel the license or lease under which such lands shall have been held in occupation, as regards the whole or any part of the lands so held under such license or lease, or with the concurrence of the licensee, or lessee, to suspend such lease or license as regards the whole or any part of such lands:

And whereas the said lands hereinafter described are Crown Lands, subject to be dealt with under the provisions of the said sixteenth section of the "Gold Fields Act 1866," and the said lands are now, or lately were, held in occupation under a lease for Depasturing purposes, issued under the "Otago Waste Lands Act 1866:" And whereas the Executive Government of the Province of Otago have determined to cancel the said lease as to so much and such part of the lands held under the same as are comprised within the area hereinafter described:

Now therefore I, James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province, and by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to the Executive Government of the said Province in this behalf by His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand in Council, under the authority of the "Gold Fields Act Amendment Act, 1867," and of any and every other power in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby cancel the said lease, in so far as the lands comprised within the area hereinafter described are affected by the said lease, but no further or otherwise (that is to say)—

All that area in the Province of Otago, Colony of New Zealand, containing by admeasurement four hundred (400) acres more or less, being part of Run numbered 308B on the map of the south-eastern Pastoral Districts of the said Province, and now Sections numbered respectively 3 and 4 on the map of the Upper Taieri Side District: Bounded towards the north-east, south-east, and north-west by a road line twelve thousand one hundred and forty-six (12,146) links; towards the east by Crown lands four thousand four hundred and sixty (4460) links; towards the south by Crown lands three thousand seven hundred and eighty-six (3786) links; towards the south-west by Crown lands eight thousand two hundred and fifty-four (8254) links; towards the north-west by Section numbered 2 and Crown lands two thousand and seventy (2070) links; towards the south-west by Section numbered 2 one thousand and seventy-nine (1079) links; and towards the north-west by a road line three thousand four hundred and seventy-seven and a half (3477½) links.

PROCLAMATION.

Making Regulations for the Depasturing of Stock upon certain Waste Lands of the Crown within the "Otago Gold Field."

By His Honor James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, in Council.

WHEREAS by section fourteen of "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, from time to time, to make, alter, and revoke Regula-

ions for the Depasturing of Stock upon any lands within proclaimed Gold Fields, for which a lease or license for depasturing purposes has not been granted, or has been cancelled or suspended, and to regulate the number of horses or cattle which may be run upon such lands by the holders of miners' right and business licenses, or of mining, mineral, and agricultural leases, and to issue depasturing licenses, and to regulate the fees that shall be paid therefor: And whereas Thomas Dick, Esquire, then Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to and vested in him in that behalf, did, by Proclamation in the Government *Gazette* of the said Province, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, constitute and appoint all the territory therein described, including amongst other lands the lands hereinafter described to be a Gold Field under the provisions of the "Gold Fields Act 1866," to be called "Otago Gold Field": And whereas by the "Gold Fields Act Amendment Act 1867," it is enacted that within any Province in which by any Act or Ordinance it is provided that the Superintendent shall, in the administration of the Government thereof, act by and with the advice and consent of an Executive Council, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand, and under the public seal of the Colony, from time to time as occasion may require, to delegate to the Executive Government for the time being of such Province, subject or not to any restrictions or limitations as he may think fit, all or any of such powers vested in the Governor, or the Governor in Council, by the "Gold Fields Act 1866," as under, or by virtue of the one hundred and ninth section of the said Act may be delegated by the Governor in Council, and in like manner to revoke any such delegation: And whereas by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago intituled the "Executive Council Ordinance 1861," it is provided that the Superintendent of the said Province shall, in the administration of the Government thereof, act by and with the advice and consent of an Executive Council: And whereas His Excellency the Governor did, by a Proclamation issued under his hand and the seal of the Colony of New Zealand, bearing date the ninth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, delegate unto the Executive Government of the Province of Otago his powers under the said fourteenth section of the said "Gold Fields Act, 1866": And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the eighteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, and published in the Otago *Provincial Government Gazette*, No. 1017, on the nineteenth day of April, 1876, the several depasturing leases under which the lands respectively described in the first Schedule hereto were therefore held were cancelled: And whereas the said lands respectively described in the said first Schedule hereto are lands subject to be dealt with under the Provisions of the said section fourteen of the "Gold Fields Act, 1866," and it is expedient to make regulations for the Depasturing of Stock upon the said lands: Now, therefore I, James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province, and by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to the Executive Government of the said Province in this behalf by His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand in Council, and of any and every other power in any wise enabling me in this behalf do hereby make the Regulations following for the depasturing of stock upon the said lands described in the said first Schedule hereto (that is to say)—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Superintendent may from time to time by a license under his hand authorise any person or persons to occupy any or all of the four several parcels of land described in the said first Schedule hereto for the purpose of depasturing stock thereon for any period not exceeding ten years as he may think fit subject to the terms and conditions hereinafter contained.

2. Every such License shall be in the form in the second Schedule hereto, and shall be subject to the following terms and conditions which shall be implied therein (that is to say)—

a. The terms and conditions contained in sections 96 to 103 both inclusive, and sections 135 to 150 both inclusive, of "The Otago Waste Lands Act, 1872," and all other, the provisions of the said Act relating to Pastoral Leases.

b. The terms and conditions contained in sections 16 and 17 of the "Gold Fields Act, 1866," and section 5 of the "Gold Fields Act Amendment Act, 1875 (No. 2)."

3. In construing the provisions of the said sections herein incorporated, the words and expressions following shall have the meanings hereinafter assigned to them, unless such meanings be repugnant to, or inconsistent with the context (that is to say)—

The words "Superintendent," "Board," shall mean respectively the Superintendent and the Waste Lands Board, of, and for the Province of Otago.

The words "Receiver of Land Revenue" shall mean the Receiver of Land Revenue appointed for the Province of Otago.

The word "lessee" shall mean licensee under these Regulations.

The word "Hundred," and the words "great cattle" and "cattle," shall respectively have the same meanings as are assigned to the same words respectively in and by section three of "The Otago Waste Lands Act, 1872."

4. The interest of the Licensee in any License issued under these Regulations may be sold with the consent of the Superintendent, and a new license for the residue of the term of the original License may thereupon be issued to the purchaser on payment of the fee for the same.

5. Any person committing a breach of these Regulations shall be liable to the penalties provided by the Gold Fields Act, 1866.

1. All that parcel of land in the Province of Otago and Colony of New Zealand containing by estimation 13,000 acres more or less situate in the South-eastern Pastoral District being part of Run numbered 170 on the map of the said District bounded towards the North-west by Run 200 towards the East by other part of Run 170 towards the South-east by the Beaumont Burn towards the South-west by the Clutha River.

2. All that Parcel of Land in the Province of Otago Colony of New Zealand containing by estimation 3,000 acres more or less situate in the Waipori District being part of Run numbered 48 Bounded as follows:—Commencing at a point on the Lee Stream due North from Trigonometrical Station O Waipori District thence along the said Lee Stream to its junction with a creek known as the South Rock Creek thence along the said South Rock Creek to a point due South from Trigonometrical Station O Waipori District aforesaid thence in a line due North through said Trigonometrical Station O to the starting point.

3. All that Parcel of Land in the Province of Otago Colony of New Zealand containing by estimation Fifteen Thousand (15,000) acres more or less situate in the South-eastern Pastoral District being part of Run numbered 199 on the map of the said District Bounded as follows commencing at the most Northerly peg of Section 1 Block VI Teviot District and proceeding in a line bearing 242 degrees 51 minutes 41 seconds [nine thousand three hundred and sixty (9360) links to the intersection of a line bearing 332° 51' 41" through Geodesical Station Teviot District thence by the said line through Geodesical Station bearing 332° 51' 41" one hundred and forty (140) chains thence in a line bearing 62° 51' 41" two hundred and seventy-two chains and sixty (272 60) links thence by a line bearing 152° 51' 41" seven hundred and sixty five (765) chains thence in a line bearing 242° 51' 41" one hundred and seventy nine (179) chains to the most Easterly peg of Section 1 Block V Bengier District thence along the North-east boundaries of Sections 1 Block V Bengier District and 1 Block VI Teviot District in a line bearing 332° 51' 41" six hundred and twenty-four chains and eighty-four (624 84) links to the starting point.

4. All that Parcel of Land in the Province of Otago Colony of New Zealand containing by estimation ten thousand (10,000) acres more or less situate in the South-eastern Pastoral District being part of Run numbered 369 on the map of the said Pastoral District Bounded as follows:—Commencing at a point on the Watershed of the Umbrella Mountains due West from Trigonometrical Station J Teviot District thence in a line due East through the said Trigonometrical Station J to a point due North from Trigonometrical Station M Teviot District thence in a line due South two hundred (200) chains thence in a line due east to

PROCLAMATION

Declaring certain Crown Lands within the Otago Gold Field open for sale.

By his Honor James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, in Council.

WHEREAS Thomas Dick, Esquire, then Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to and vested in him in that behalf did, by

proclamation in the Government *Gazette* of the said Province, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of January one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, constitute and appoint all the territory therein described (including amongst other lands the lands described in the Schedule hereto), to be a Gold Field, under the provisions of the "Gold Fields Act 1866," to be called "Otago Gold Field":

And whereas by Clause XLIX of the "Gold Fields Act 1866," it is provided that if a Depasturing Lease or License shall not, at the date of the passing of the said Act, have been granted, or shall have been, or shall be, cancelled, over any Crown Lands within a Gold Field, it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time by Proclamation to declare such lands, or any part thereof, open for sale or selection, in sections of such size and form as he may determine, and any lands so proclaimed may thereafter be sold at a like price, and subject to the like terms and conditions, or as near thereto as may be, as Crown Lands of the same class not within a Gold Field; and it shall not be necessary to withdraw lands from the operation of the said Act for the purposes aforesaid: And whereas the lease hitherto existing over the Crown Lands described in the schedule hereto has been duly cancelled under the provisions of the "Gold Fields Act, 1866": And whereas the Executive Government of the Province of Otago have determined to open up for sale the said Crown Lands described in the said schedule hereto, in sections of the size and form in which the same respectively have been laid off and are shown on the maps of the Chief Surveyor of the Province of Otago relative thereto:

Now therefore I, James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province, and by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to the Executive Government of the said province in this behalf by His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand in Council, under the authority of the "Gold Fields Act, 1866," and the "Gold Fields Act Amendment Act, 1867," and of any and every other power in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby declare and proclaim that the lands comprised within the area hereinafter described shall on and after the date hereof be open for sale in sections of the size and form in which such lands respectively have been laid off, and are shown on the maps in the office of the Chief Surveyor of the Province of Otago relative thereto (that is to say)—

PROCLAMATION

Altering the boundaries of the Clydesdale Road District.

By His Honor James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by section 7 of the "Otago Roads Ordinance, 1871, Amendment Ordinance, 1874," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent, upon the recommendation of the Provincial Council, from time to time by proclamation in the *Gazette* to alter the boundaries and to increase or diminish the area of any Road District, notwithstanding that such district may already have been constituted by the "Otago Roads Ordinance, 1871," or by any proclamation thereunder: And whereas by section 27 of the "Abolition of Provinces Act, 1875," it is enacted that until the day next after the last day of the first session of the next or sixth Parliament of New Zealand all powers, duties, and functions which immediately before the passing of the said Act were under and by virtue of any law vested in or to be exercised or performed by the Superintendent of any Province, on the recommendation or resolution of the Provincial Council of such Province, under any law or Ordinance for the time being in force, shall be exercised by the Superintendent, with the consent of the Governor in Council: And whereas it is expedient to alter the boundaries and to increase the area of the Clydesdale Road District: And whereas the Governor in Council has been pleased to consent to such alteration and extension:
