## PROCLAMATION

### *Of the Municipality of Maori Hill.*

By His Honor James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Otago, intituled "An Ordinance to amend the Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1865," and by the "Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1875," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent of Otago, with the advice of his Executive Council, on the petition of not less than fifty persons, comprising a majority of the householders resident in any township, or any two or more townships, distant not more than two miles from a common centre within the Province, to extend the provisions of the "Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1865," to such township or townships, by such name or incorporation as he shall deem fit, and notwithstanding that such township, or in the case of two townships, either or both of them is or are included in a Road District, with such modification as to the names and numbers of the members of such proposed Corporation, and the office-bearers thereof, and any other municipal matters and regulations as shall seem to such Superintendent and his Executive Council suitable for the area and population of such Municipality; and, in accordance with such petition or otherwise, shall define the boundaries of the Municipality so created, and declare the number of Wards into which such Municipality may be divided, and define the boundaries of such Wards respectively, and declare which of the provisions of the said Ordinance shall be applicable to and within the limits of such Municipality: And whereas a petition of not less than fifty persons, comprising a majority of the householders resident in the townships of Murrayville, Williamstown, and McClelland's sub-division, in the said Province of Otago, has been presented to me, James Macandrew, as Superintendent of the said Province, praying that the provisions of the "Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1865," may be extended to the said townships: Now, therefore I, James Macandrew, Superintendent of the said Province, with the advice of my Executive Council, and in exercise and pursuance of the powers and authority vested in me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that from and after the day of the date hereof, the provisions of the said "Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1865," specified in the first schedule hereto, shall extend to the said townships of Murrayville, Williamstown, and McClelland's sub-division, under the name of the Corporation of

the town of Maori Hill, and shall be applicable to and within the Municipality hereby created. And I do, with the like advice of my said Executive Council, proclaim and declare that such of the said provisions as are contained in the sections of the said last-mentioned Ordinance, specified in the first column of the second schedule hereto, shall extend to the said township, and be applicable to the Municipality hereby created, with and subject to the respective modifications contained herein, and in the second column of the said second schedule hereto. And I hereby, with the advice of my said Executive Council, proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the Municipality hereby created shall be those specified in the third schedule hereto. And I do hereby, with the advice of my said Executive Council, declare that the said Municipality hereby created shall consist of one Ward with six Councillors, and that the boundaries of the said Ward shall be those respectively defined in the third schedule hereto.

#### FIRST SCHEDULE.

The sections of the "Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1865," containing the provisions of the said Ordinance, extended to and applicable within the Incorporated Town of Maori Hill, that is to say, sections numbered 6 to 11, both inclusive; sections numbered 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26; sections numbered 29 to 97, both inclusive; sections numbered 99 to 113, both inclusive; and sections numbered 116 to 122 respectively; and also the sections in the various amending Ordinances substituted for sections 18, 27, and 78, repealed.

#### SECOND SCHEDULE.

Sections of the "Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1865, applicable to the Incorporated Town of Maori Hill, with respective modifications set opposite the numbers of the Sections.

Section Five ... ..	The style shall be "The Corporation of the Town of Maori Hill," instead of "The Corporation of the City of Dunedin."

## THIRD SCHEDULE.

Boundaries of the Incorporated Town of Maori Hill as delineated on the record maps of the said town, deposited in the Lands Registry Office, in Dunedin, in the said Province.

It that parcel of land in the Province of Otago, in the Colony of New Zealand, containing by admeasurement twenty-five (25) acres two (2) roods and seven (7) poles more or less, situate in the Upper Kaikorai District, and comprising the private Townships of Murrayville, Williamstown, and McLennan's Sub-division, being parts of sections numbered 13, 14, and 155R, block I, and 8, 9, 155R, block II, on the map of the said district. Bounded towards the north-west by a line extending along the centre of the Maori Hill Road eight hundred and forty-three (843) links; towards the south-west by part of the said Maori Hill Road thirty (30) links, and by part of section numbered 9 four hundred and twenty-one (421) links; again towards the north-west by part of section numbered 7 eight hundred and fifty (850) links; thence in a south-easterly direction by the outside boundary line of Well-street and the Maori Hill Road one thousand and forty (1,040) links, two hundred (200) links, two hundred and thirty (230) links, and two hundred and forty (240) links; thence in a south-westerly direction by a line, being the north-west boundary of the Dunedin Town Belt, nine hundred and forty-seven (947) links; thence in a north-westerly direction by a line two hundred and eighty-seven (287) links, two hundred and sixty-seven (267) links, and eighty-five (85) links; thence again in a south-westerly direction by a line eight hundred and twenty-one (821) links, and again in a north-westerly direction by a line, being the north-eastern boundary of section numbered 12, one thousand and forty-five (1,045) links, and by part of the Maori Hill Road thirty-one (31) links to starting point, be all the aforesaid linkages more or less.

## EAST WARD.

Comprises all the remaining portion of the said Township.

Appointing a day for the First Election of a Citizen to be Mayor of the Incorporated Town of Maori Hill.

WHEREAS by the "Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1865, Amendment Ordinance, 1870," it is amongst other things provided that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent at any time after any Municipality shall have been proclaimed under the provisions of the Ordinance intituled "An Ordinance to amend the Otago Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1865, by proclamation in the Government Gazette of the Province of Otago, to appoint a day for the first election of a citizen to be Mayor of such Municipality: And whereas the town of Maori Hill has been proclaimed a Municipality under the provisions of the said Ordinance, and it is expedient to appoint a day for the first election of a citizen to be Mayor of the said Municipality of Maori Hill.

Now, therefore I, James Macandrew, Superintendent of the said Province of Otago, do hereby proclaim and declare that I have appointed, and do hereby appoint Wednesday, the 17th day of May, 1876, as and to be the day for the first election of a citizen to be Mayor of the Municipality of Maori Hill.

JOHN CAMPBELL, of Williamtown, as and to be the person before whom the persons elected as Mayor, Councillors, and Auditors respectively, at the first elections under the said Ordinance for the said Incorporated Town of Maori Hill, shall make and subscribe the declaration specified in the said twenty-eighth section of the said Ordinance.

PROCLAMATION.

APPOINTING WAKATIPU SLAUGHTERHOUSE DISTRICT.

By His Honor James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance "For Regulating the Slaughtering of Cattle in certain places," passed by the Lieutenant-General and Legislative Council of New Zealand, in the eleventh year of her present Majesty, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for his Excellency the Governor, by proclamation from time to time, to constitute and define certain districts for the purpose aforesaid. And it is also enacted that within any such district, and after a day to be prescribed by any such proclamation, no person shall keep a slaughter-house, or place for slaughtering cattle intended for sale, barter, shipping, or exportation, except such house or place be duly licensed for that purpose in manner in the said Ordinance provided. And whereas by an Ordinance intituled "An Ordinance to empower the Superintendent of the Province of Otago to perform certain Acts heretofore performed by the Governor or Lieutenant-Governors of New Zealand, and by the Resident Magistrate of Otago, passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the said province, the powers vested in the Governor by the said first recited Ordinance are within the limits of the said province conferred on the Superintendent thereof.

Now, therefore I, James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, do hereby in pursuance and exercise of the power vested in me as aforesaid, proclaim and declare that I have constituted the district hereinafter named and described to be a district for

the purpose of the said first in part recited, and within which from and after the date hereof, the several provisions of the said first recited Ordinance shall come into operation and take effect, that is to say: Wakatipu Slaughter-house District—

All that area in the Province of Otago, Colony of New Zealand, bounded towards the north-east and south-east by a line from Fog Peak, across Treble Cone to Middle Peak; thence in a straight line to Mount Pisa; thence in a straight line to the junction of Kirtle Vum, with the Kawarau River; thence along the Carrick Mountains to the south-east corner of run numbered 354; towards the south by the southern boundary of the said run; towards the south-east by a line from Lorn Peak to the junction of Allen Creek with the Mataura River; towards the west and north by the boundary of the Gold Field to Fog Peak.

PROCLAMATION

*Protection of Animals Act, 1873.*

By His Honor James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of Otago.

WHEREAS by section 10 of the Protection of Animals Act, 1873, it is provided that "No game shall be hunted, shot, taken, or killed in any Province until the same shall have been proclaimed as open for that purpose by proclamation in that behalf to be made and published in the *Gazette*; and no game shall be hunted, shot, taken, or killed except within a consecutive period not exceeding three months of any year, to be fixed by the Superintendent by proclamation as aforesaid, between the first day of May and the thirty-first day of July, both inclusive, in any year, and only between the hours of sunrise and sunset: Such period when fixed in accordance with this Act shall be deemed to be the 'season' for the purposes of this Act."

Now, therefore I, James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, under and in pursuance of the powers and authority vested in me by the said section, and of every other power and authority enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim all that area lying between the Waitaki River and Catlin's River, and ten miles back from the sea coast, as open for hunting, shooting, taking, or killing cock pheasants, between the hours of sunrise and sunset, during the season of the months of June and July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six.
