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NOTICE

Of certain land at Arrowtown, in the Province of Otago having been set apart as an endowment for the Municipality of Arrowtown.

By His Honor George Turnbull, Esquire, Deputy-Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS the Provincial Council of Otago have under and by virtue of section 160 of the "Otago Waste Lands Act, 1872," recommended that the lands hereinafter described should be set apart as an endowment for the Municipality of Arrowtown; and it is expedient that the said lands should be so reserved for that purpose: Now therefore I, George Turnbull, Deputy-Superintendent of the Province of Otago, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me in this behalf, do hereby publish and declare that I have made and dedicated the lands hereinafter described an endowment for the Municipality of Arrowtown: (that is to say) —
