**PROCLAMATION**

By JAMES A. R. MENZIES, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Southland.

WHEREAS by the seventh section of the "Cattle Trespass Ordinance, 1862," it is provided that the said Ordinance shall come into operation in any town, or part thereof, within the Province of Southland, as shall be named or defined, and upon such day as shall be named, by the Superintendent when notifying the same;

Now, therefore, I, the said Superintendent, do hereby proclaim and declare that the said Ordinance shall come into operation in that part of the Town of Invercargill which is bounded on the East by that part of Doon Street which extends between Forth Street and Spey Street; on the South by Forth Street; on the West by that part of Dee Street which extends between Forth Street and Spey Street; and on the North by Spey Street, upon the first day of May 1862.
