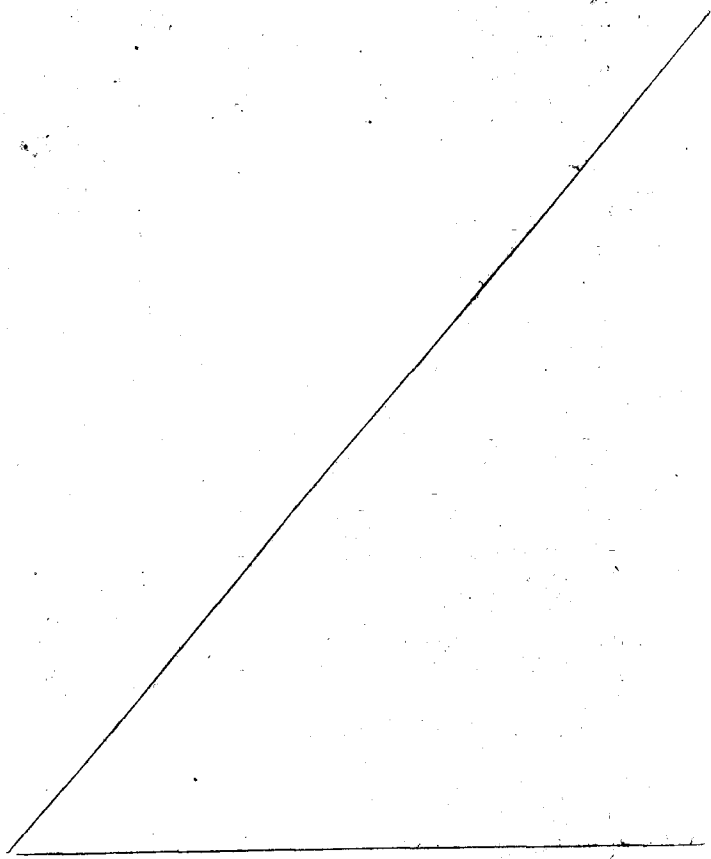

Warrant defining District under "The Coroners' Act, 1858."

By His Excellency **Sir GEORGE GREY**, Knight, Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by "The Coroners' Act, 1858," the Governor is empowered in the manner therein mentioned to appoint fit persons to be Coroners of the several Districts of the Colony of New Zealand, and from time to time to define the Districts within which such Coroners shall respectively have jurisdiction, and every such definition to revoke or amend, and the limits of such Districts to alter as occasion may require. Now, therefore, I, Sir George Grey, the Governor of the said Colony, in pursuance of the said power, and authority, do hereby define the Gaol and Hospital District of Southland to be all that piece of ground situated in the Township of Invercargill, and Province of Southland, bounded on the North by Esk-street, on the East by Dee-street, and on the South and West by Leven-street, with the buildings and others erected thereon.

Given under my hand, at the Government House, at Auckland, this twenty-sixth day of March, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two.
