PROCLAMATION

By **JAMES A. R. MERRIMAN, Esq.**, Superintendent of the Province of Southland.

WHEREAS by a proclamation issued under my hand, and dated the 29th day of April, 1862, the boundaries of the Otarewa and Mona School districts were set forth and declared; and whereas it is expedient to abolish the same and appoint other boundaries for the said School Districts: Now therefore, I the said Superintendent, in pursuance of the power vested in me in that behalf, and in conformity with the provisions of section 6 of the "Education Ordinance, No. 2, 1862," do hereby abolish the boundaries of the said School districts—Otarewa and Mona, as the same were defined in the schedule to the proclamation aforesaid, and declare that the boundaries of the said districts respectively, shall be the boundaries set forth in the schedule herein under written.

SCHEDULE.

O T A R E W A School district, No. 2.
Bounded on the North by the Waikopa River to the Mavis Bridge; thence northwards along the road line to the

north-west corner of section 10, Block VII; thence northwards to the Mavis Bridge; thence along the road line to the north-east corner of Block VII.

East by the eastern boundary of Block VII, continued south to meet the south boundary of district.

South by a right line along the south boundary of Block I, Invercargill Hundred, continued eastward until it cuts the east boundary of district.

West by Waikopa Estuary and east boundary of district No. 1, and part of section 1, Block III.

M O N A District.

North by a right line along the western side of Block VI, Invercargill Hundred, north boundary of Block VI, of said Hundred; thence northwards by east boundary of Block XI, to the north boundary of No. 1, Block LXI, of the 2000 acre Blocks.

E A S T A N D S O U T H East by east boundaries of the said No. 1, Block LXI, and Block LXIII, of the 2000 acre blocks; thence eastward along the east boundary of Block VII, Otago Hundred, to the eastern part of section 1, Block VI., of the said Hundred; thence by the road line intersecting sections 40, 61, 62, 63, Block VI., Otago Hundred, to the east boundary of Block VIII., Inver-

Invercargill Hundred; thence by a right line along the east boundary of the said Block VIII, extended south to meet the south boundary of district.

South and West by a right line from east boundary, extended due west to south-east corner of Otarewa school district; thence northwards by east boundary of said district to north-east corner of section 24, Block VII., Invercargill Hundred; thence westwards by north boundary of Block VII. to south-west corner of section 16, Block V.; thence northwards by road line to north-west corner of section 38, Block V.

INVERCARGILL JETTY.

NOTICE.

Superintendent's Office,
Southland, 14th March, 1863.

It is hereby notified that Clauses 5 and 6 of the Jetty Regulations published in the *Southland Gazette*, 13th August, 1862, are hereby revoked, and the following mode of levying dues substituted in lieu thereof, viz:—

1. On all goods landed at the Jetty there shall be payable 2s. 6d. per ton, measurement or dead weight, this charge including the truckage fees.

2. In order to provide for the proper collection and payment of the above charges, a correct account shall be furnished by every agent of any vessel arriving at or leaving the Port of Invercargill, to the Provincial Treasurer, within three days of the arrival or departure of such vessel, of all tonnage, either of weight or measurement shipped in such vessel, together with the name of each consignee and the amount of tonnage upon which freight is payable by such consignee, and the jetty charges, shall be levied upon such list, either by weight or measurement, as the case shall be. The agent of every vessel leaving the Port of Invercargill shall be held liable and shall pay all charges as above leviable upon any goods exported in such vessel.

All monies leviable under these Regulations must be paid regularly on the Monday of each week, at the Treasury, between 11 a.m. and 3 p.m., and the Receipt of the Treasurer shall be a full discharge for such liability.

These Regulations shall come into force on Friday, the 20th day of March, next.

Constituting a certain Public Gaol in the Province of Southland.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GREY, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS power is vested in the Governor of New Zealand by Proclamation to declare any House, Building, Enclosure, or Place to be a Public Gaol:

Now, therefore, I, Sir George Grey, the Governor as aforesaid, do hereby declare and proclaim that the portion of the building recently erected upon Block XII., Campbelltown, in the Province of Southland, which is on the West side, and is subdivided into four

cells and corridor, shall be and be used as a Public Gaol.

Given under my hand at the Government House, at Auckland, and issued under the Seal of the Colony of New Zealand, this sixth day of February, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three.
