PROCLAMATION.

By the HON. JOHN PARKIN TAYLOR,
Esq., Superintendent of the
Province of Southland.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power in me vested in this behalf I do hereby constitute and appoint to be a Gold Field under the provisions of the Gold Fields Act 1862 under the name of the Orepuki and Longwood Gold Field, all that territory comprised within the area bounded on the North by an east and west line in transit with the top of Ferndunlaw-Hill from the Waiau to a tributary of Purra-purra-kino River,

rising to the eastward of the aforesaid Hill; on the East by said tributary and the Purra-purra-kino River, to Block XVII Jacob's River Hundred, then by Block XVII and Block I of aforesaid Hundred to the ocean; on the South and South West by low-water mark of the ocean in Foveaux Strait's, and on the West by the Waiau River: excepting always out of the area herein before described the following native Reserves and Runs.

The native Reserve at Kolac's Bay, bounded on the north east by a line (starting from a marked peg on the

beach) bearing 308.12 on the true meridian, a distance of 72 chains 40 links; on the north west by a line, bearing 218.21 on the true meridian to high water mark, and on the south west and east by the high water mark of the ocean in Foveaux Straits.

The native reserve at Wakapatu Bay, bounded on the north east by a line (starting from a marked peg on the Beach) bearing 279.30 on the magnetic meridian a distance of about 76 chains, on the north west by a line bearing 210. on the magnetic meridian to the ocean, and on the south west and south east by the high water mark of the ocean in Foveaux Straits.

The native reserve at Pahia point bounded on the north east by a line starting from a pole on the Beach on the north east Bay bearing 125. on the magnetic meridian to the high water mark in Otui Bay and on the north west and south west by the high water mark of the ocean in Foveaux Straits.

Run No. 393. Bounded on the north-east and East by the edge of the Long-wood bush, on the north-west by the Waiau river, and on the south-west and south by the high water mark of the ocean in Foveaux straits and the township reserve of Orepuki.

Run No. 395. Bounded on the north east and south, by the edge of the Long-wood bush, and on the west by the high-water mark of the ocean in Foveaux straits and the native reserve on Pahia point; and I declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation and take effect on the day of the date hereof.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington,
this twenty-fifth day of September,
1866.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN
COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Gold Fields Act, 1862," it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, from time to time, to appoint Wardens as Judges of Wardens' Courts for any gold field, or for any part thereof, for the administration of justice therein, with power to act alone or with Assessors or Juries, and in such manner, and to exercise all or any of the powers thereafter mentioned, as the Governor shall think fit to direct;

Now therefore, his Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, doth hereby appoint the person undermentioned, that is to say—

HENRY ROGERS Esq., J. P.,

to be a Warden and Judge of all Wardens' Courts now constituted or hereafter to be constituted within the Pahies and Longwood Gold Fields District, of the Province of Southland, with power to him to act alone or with Assessors or Juries, and to exercise all or any of the powers subsisting and mentioned in the twentieth, twenty-first, twenty-second, twenty-third, twenty-fourth, twenty-fifth, twenty-sixth, twenty-seventh, twenty-eighth, twenty-ninth, thirtieth, thirty-fourth, and fifty-seventh sections of "The Gold Fields Act, 1862," and all other powers, duties, and authorities by "The Gold Fields Act Amendment Act 1863," or "The Gold Fields Acts Amendment Act, 1865," vested in or imposed on Judges of Wardens' Courts.
