PROCLAMATION

By the Hon. JOHN PARKIN TAYLOR,
Esq., Superintendent of the
Province of Southland.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power in me vested in this behalf, I do hereby constitute and appoint to be a goldfield, under the provisions of the "Goldfields Act, 1866," under the name of the Bushy Point Goldfield, all that territory along the coast line of the Province of Southland, comprised within the area bounded on the west by eastern boundary of certain claims or grants at Te Wais Point, under the "Native Claims Settlement Act"; on the east by the Mataura River; on the south by low water mark; on the north by a line running parallel to high water mark, at the distance of (40) forty chains; and I declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation and take effect on the day of the date hereof.

Given under my hand, and issued under the public seal of the Province of Southland, this Twenty-seventh day of October, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six.

PROCLAMATION.

By the Hon. JOHN PARKIN TAYLOR,
Esq., Superintendent of the
Province of Southland.

IN pursuance of the power in me vested, I do hereby proclaim and declare that the Districts described in the Schedule following, shall be a district for the purpose of slaughtering Cattle under

the provisions of the "Slaughter House Ordinance, 1847," and I further declare that the provisions of the said Ordinance shall come into operation within the said District on the first day of November, 1866.

SCHEDULE.

OREPUKI AND LONGWOOD DISTRICT.
Bounded on the North by an east and west line in transit with the top of Ferndunlaw-Hill from the Waiau to a tributary of Purra-purra-kino River, rising to the eastward of the aforesaid Hill; on the East by said tributary and the Purra-purra-kino River, to Block XVII Jacob's River Hundred, then by Block XVII and Block I of aforesaid Hundred to the ocean; on the South and South West by low-water mark of the ocean in Foveaux Straits, and on the West by the Waiau River; excepting always out of the area herein before described the following native Reserves and Runs.

The native Reserve at Kolac's Bay, bounded on the north east by a line (starting from a marked peg on the beach) bearing 308.12 on the true meridian, a distance of 72 chains 40 links; on the north west by a line bearing 218.21 on the true meridian to high water mark, and on the south west and east by the high water mark of the ocean in Foveaux Straits.

The native reserve at Wakapatu Bay, bounded on the north east by a line (starting from a marked peg on the Beach) bearing 279.30 on the magnetic meridian a distance of about 76 chains, on the north west by a line bearing 210. on the magnetic meridian to the ocean, and on the south west and south east by the high water mark of the ocean in Foveaux Straits.

The native reserve at Pahia point bounded on the north east by a line starting from a pole on the Beach on the north east Bay bearing 125. on the magnetic meridian to the high water mark in Otui Bay and on the north west and south west by the high water mark of the ocean in Foveaux Straits.

Run No. 393. Bounded on the north-east and East by the edge of the Longwood bush, on the north-west by the Waiau river, and on the south-west and south by the high water mark of the ocean in Foveaux Straits and the township reserve of Orepuki.

Run No. 395. Bounded on the north east and south, by the edge of the Longwood bush, and on the west by the high-water mark of the ocean in Foveaux Straits and the native reserve on Pahia point.

G. GREY, Governor.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, under his hand and the public seal of the Colony from time to time to delegate to the Superintendent of any Province, or such other person as the Governor may deem fit, all or any of the powers vested in the Governor, or the Governor in Council, by the Act now in recital, except the powers conferred by sections twenty-two, forty, forty-eight, sixty, ninety-six, and one hundred and seven, of the said Act, subject or not to any limitations or restrictions as he may think fit, and in like manner to alter or revoke any such powers:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Grey, the Governor as aforesaid of the said Colony, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the exercise of the power and authority for this purpose in me vested, do hereby delegate unto

JOHN PARKIN TAYLOR, Esq.,

as Superintendent of the Province of Southland, all the powers vested in me, under or by virtue of the said "Gold Fields Act, 1866," except the powers conferred by sections twenty-two, forty

forty-eight, sixty, sixty-nine, and one hundred and seven, to have, hold, and exercise, within the Province of Southland, the said powers hereby given to the said John Parkin Taylor, Esq., so long as he shall continue and remain Superintendent of the said Province, and no longer: Provided always that copies of all Rules and Regulations made under the delegation aforesaid shall be forthwith transmitted to the Colonial Secretary, in order that the same may be laid before the General Assembly, in accordance with the provisions of the one hundred and tenth clause of "The Goldfields Act, 1866."

Given under the hand of His Excellency Sir George Grey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, at the Government House, at Wellington, and issued under the seal of the said Colony this twelfth day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six.

REMARKS.—A fine dry month, very warm at commencement, and until 20th, when a thunder-storm occurred, and subsequently the weather was cold, with strong easterly winds, and sharp night frosts. The mean daily temperature decreased from 60.4 deg, on the 2nd to 37.7 deg. on the 22nd. The thermometer fell below the freezing-point on no fewer than thirteen days in the month, and vegetation was materially checked towards the close. It was unusually advanced at the commencement.
