#### PROCLAMATION

By His Honor JOHN PARKIN TAYLOR, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Southland, under the "Hospitals Ordinance, 1863."

WHEREAS by an Act of the Provincial Council of Southland, intituled the "Hospitals Ordinance, 1863," it is *inter alia* enacted "that the provisions of this Ordinance, or any part thereof, shall be applied to such Institutions only, to which the Superintendent with the advice and consent of His Executive Council, shall think fit to apply the same by proclamation, to be published in the *Provincial Government Gazette*. And from and after the publication thereof, this Ordinance shall be deemed, and taken to apply to the Institution specified in any such proclamation."

Now therefore I, the Superintendent of the Province of Southland, in exercise of the said recited power and authority, with the advice and consent of my Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the Provisions of the said Ordinance shall be deemed and taken to apply to the building and grounds described in the Schedule to these precincts, and known as the Southland Hospital and grounds, exclusive of the building known as the Lunatic Asylum.

Given under my hand, and issued under the public seal of the Province of Southland, at Invercargill, this twenty-third day of July, eighteen hundred and sixty-seven.

#### DESCRIPTION OF HOSPITAL RESERVE.

All that piece or parcel of land situate and being on part of the Invercargill Town Belt, to the northward, known as part of the Hospital

**W**HEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly, intituled “The Regulation of Elections Act, 1858,” it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by warrant under his hand, from time to time, to appoint polling places for each electoral district within or without the limits thereof, and to appoint any one of such places to be the principal polling place for the district, and all or any of such polling places at any time to abolish and to appoint other polling places in lieu thereof. And whereas by another Act of the General Assembly, intituled “The Provincial Elections Act, 1858,” it is enacted that, subject to certain provisions therein contained, every election of the Superintendent or of a Member of the Provincial Council of a Province shall be conducted in the manner prescribed by “The Regulation of Elections Act, 1858,” aforesaid, and all the provisions of the said last-mentioned Act shall apply to the elections of Superintendents and Members of Provincial Councils:

Now therefore I, Sir George Grey, the Governor of the said Colony, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said Acts, do hereby appoint the following places to be additional polling places for the Districts of Aparima, Longwood, and Waiānawa, for the election of Members of the Provincial Council of the Province of Southland, namely—

 For the District of WAIANEWA—The House of John Howell, Esq., Flint's Bush.
