NOTICE.

INVERCARGILL JETTY.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in me by the "Jetties and Wharves Ordinance, 1858," I, John Parkin Taylor, Superintendent of the Province of Southland with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said province do hereby make the following regulations for the management of the Invercargill Jetty.

1st. Consignees or their agents on applying for goods at the Jetty shall produce the Bills of Lading for such goods, should however no Bills of Lading have been issued for the said goods, then the Mates' Receipt shall be produced; but should it so happen that consignees are not in possession of either Bills of Lading or Mates' Receipt then they shall particularise the several packages in writing addressed to the Wharfinger when requesting delivery.

2nd. The Master or Agent of any vessel arriving alongside the Jetty shall furnish the Wharfinger at once with a correct copy of his manifest, together with each consignees tonnage as taken on freight.

3rd. Wharfingers hours of attendance to be Custom House hours.

IN terms of the powers vested in me in that behalf I do hereby make the following regulations under Clause XIV of the Gold Field Act, 1866, for that portion of the Fahi and Longwood Gold Field, late Run No. 393.

1st. That no person shall depasture any stock in the district except he be the holder of a Depasturing License issued by the Gold Fields Warden.

2nd. A Depasturing License shall only be issued to the holder of a Miner's Right or Business License.

3rd. That all persons depasturing stock in the district, shall during the last week in March in each year send in to the Gold Fields Warden a return of the number and description of stock including all over three months old, and that any person placing stock in the district after the 31st of March in each year shall within one week send a return of the same to the Warden.

4th. That an assessment of three shillings per head on large cattle, and sixpence per head on small cattle shall be paid to the Warden on the 1st of April in each year, and in case of stock becoming liable to assessment after the 1st April, on any day within one week after their arrival and depasturing within the district. Provided that any holder of a Miner's Right or Business License shall be entitled to depasture one head of large stock free of assessment.

5th. That no greater number of stock than at the rate of one head of large cattle to ten acres shall be depastured in the district.

6th. That in case of the number of cattle in applications to depasture being in excess of the number allowed in the foregoing (5th) regulation, the Warden shall decide on the number to be depastured by each applicant.

BYE-LAWS OF WARDENS FOR THE INVERCARGILL HUNDREDS.

I. That no cattle of any description be depastured on the Invercargill Hundred without a license, provided always that cattle and horses of *bona fide* travellers on their journey when turned out, be not considered trespassers if not longer than three nights in the same neighborhood.

II. That no sheep or small cattle of any description be depastured on the Invercargill Hundred.

III. That no entire horse over twelve months old be depastured on the Invercargill Hundred, without special permission of the Warden. Any person contravening this Clause shall be fined in a sum not exceeding five pounds sterling.

IV. That no bull over twelve months old be depastured in the Invercargill Hundred without special permission of the Warden. Any person contravening this Clause shall be fined the full sum of five pounds sterling.

V. That all license holders do register the brands of their horses or cattle within two months from the date of the advertisement of the bye-laws of the Wardens, with the Warden living nearest to them.

VI. That owners of cattle on the hundred do give notice to the nearest Warden before removing any cattle from off the hundred.

VII. That all cattle brought on the hundred be reported to the nearest Warden within forty-eight hours after arriving in the hundred.

VIII. That no person shall be allowed to depasture more than twenty five head of cattle for every section of land of one hundred acres in his occupation, and proportionately for sections of larger or small size.

IX. That all stray cattle be impounded.

X. That the penalty for any breach of the foregoing bye-laws, be any sum not exceeding five pounds sterling to be recovered in a summary way according to the land regulations.

PROCLAMATION

By JOHN PARKIN TAYLOR, Esq.,
Superintendent of the Province of Southland.

WHEREAS by the 9th section of the "Education Ordinance, 1867," of the Provincial Council of the Province of Southland it is enacted that the Superintendent may upon the recom-

mendation of the Education Board proclaim new districts, and from time to time subdivide or alter the boundaries of Educational Districts.

And, whereas the Education Board has recommended me to proclaim the districts hereinafter described; now therefore, I, the said Superintendent, in pursuance of the power in me vested in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the districts named in the Schedule hereunder written, and whose boundaries are therein set forth shall be Educational Districts under the said in part recited Ordinance; and I do hereby further declare that the provisions of the said Ordinance shall come into operation in the said districts from and after the third day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight.

MONA SCHOOL DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the N. by the road forming the south boundary of block XI, of the Invercargill Hundred, then on the S.W. by part of road forming the north western boundary of the Invercargill Hundred, then on the N. by the northern boundary of block LXI., of the Mabel Hundred, on the E. by the road forming the eastern boundary of blocks LXI. and LXIII., and again on the N. by the road forming the south boundary of block XLI. of the Mabel Hundred, again on the E. by the eastern boundary of sections No. 60 and 15 of block VI., Oteramika Hundred, then on the S.E. by the north-west boundary of sections No. 23 to 30 of said block VI., and again on the E. by a public road to the south-east corner of section No. 39, block VIII., Invercargill Hundred, then on the

S. by the south boundary of sections 39 to 33, and 58 of said block, on the W. by the road forming the eastern boundary of block VII., again on the S.E. by the road forming the northern boundary of block VII., and again on the W. by the east boundary of the Roslin School District.

WAIKIWI SCHOOL DISTRICT.

Bounded on the N. by part of the northern boundary of block IX., and XIV., of the Invercargill Hundred, on the E. by the western boundary of the Roslin School District, on the S. by the Waihopai river estuary, and on the W. by a line starting at the north-west corner of section No. 17, of block XIV., aforesaid, and running due south to section No. 16, block XV., of said hundred, and by the west boundary of section No. 16 to the Waihopai estuary.

ONE TREE POINT SCHOOL DISTRICT.

Bounded on the N. by the eastern part of the southern boundary of the Mona School District, then on the E. by part of the west boundary of section No. 14, and section No. 30 of block VI., Oteramika Hundred, again on the N. by the south boundary of said section No. 31, again towards the E. by a public road to the south-west corner of section No. 58, and again on the N. by part of the south boundary of said section No. 58, again on the E. by part of the western boundary of sections Nos. 28, 29, 30, and part of 31, block I., Oteramika Hundred, then towards the S.E. by the north-western boundary of section No. 27 and 26, again towards the E. by a public road, then on the S. by the public road forming the south boundary of sections 20 and 23 of said block I., then on the W. by part of the eastern boundary of the Invercargill Hundred, and again on the S. by a line in continuation of the south boundary of the Otarewa School District, and again on the W. by the road and continuation thereof forming the eastern boundary of block VII., Invercargill Hundred.
