A PROCLAMATION

Appointing a Circuit Court to be held at Taranaki.

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY, Knight, Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled

“The Supreme Court Act, 1860,” it is provided that “there shall be held Circuit Courts for the despatch of Civil and Criminal business of the Court before one of the Judges thereof, at such places and times as the Governor in Council may from time to time appoint.”

Now, therefore, I, the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and appoint that a Circuit Court shall be held at New Plymouth, in the Province of Taranaki, in the Northern District of the said Colony, upon the thirteenth day of January, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, or so soon after such day as conveniently may be.

Given under my hand at the Government House, at Auckland, and issued under the Seal of the Colony of New Zealand, this seventh day of December, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-one.
