### NOTICE.

Superintendent's Office,  
New Plymouth, 11th August, 1862.

**I**N exercise of the authority given by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of Taranaki, intituled the "Municipal Police Ordinance, 1862," I, Charles Brown, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Taranaki, do hereby give notice and declare that the Footway on the south side of Fulford street between Robe street and Dawson street in the Town of New Plymouth, of the width of eight feet, shall henceforth be deemed and taken to be a Public Footpath within the meaning of an Ordinance of the Lieutenant-Governor of New Zealand and of the Legislative Council thereof, entitled "An Ordinance to provide for the protection of Footpaths in the Colony of New Zealand," and shall be protected accordingly.
