NOTICE is hereby given, that in pursuance of the powers in me vested by the above Ordinance, I have appointed the following Pens as the only places at which Cattle are to be exposed previous to their being branded.

TOWN DISTRICT.

The public Pound, in Gill-street.
The Stockyard in Queen-street.

OMATA DISTRICT.

The Stockyard adjoining the Stockade.
“ “ on Mr. C. Kingdon's farm, Upper Omata.
“ “ on Mr. J. Newland's farm, Upper Omata.

BELL DISTRICT.

The Stockyard adjoining the Bell Inn.

MANGOREI DISTRICT.

The Stockyard on Mr. W. Rendall's farm, Upper Mangorei.
The Stockyard on Mr. M. Carrick's farm, Upper Mangorei.
The small enclosed paddock on Mr. W. Allan's farm between the house and the main road, Lower Mangorei.
The Stockyard on Mr. Rossiter's farm between the Mangorei road and the river Waiwakaiho, Lower Mangorei.

PUKETOTARA.

The Stockyard on Mr. Shuttleworth's farm, near the Waiwakaiho.

HURWORTH DISTRICT.

The Stockyard on Captain Atkinson's farm.
