APPOINTMENT of Wilson Hursthouse as First Assistant Surveyor. His appointment to date from the first of July, 1864.

Removal of the Prohibition to import Cattle into Wellington from Canterbury, Marlborough, Nelson, Hawke's Bay, and Taranaki.

PROCLAMATION

By His Honor ISSAAC EARL FEATHERSTON, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Wellington, in the Islands of New Zealand.

WHEREAS by section number X of the "Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," it was enacted that if at any time it should be made to appear to the Governor that any infectious or contagious disease has broken out amongst cattle in any district of the Colony, it should be lawful for the Governor by order in Council to declare that such district was infected within the meaning of the Act, and, from time to time to make such regulations for destroying diseased cattle therein, and for prohibiting the removal or transportation of cattle from one part of the Colony to another, and for preventing the further spread of such disease as to him shall seem fit: And it was by the same Act also enacted that the Governor in Council might by warrant under his hand from time to time delegate to the Superintendent of any Province within the Colony all or any of the powers vested in the Governor, or Governor in Council, by the said Act, subject to such regulations as he might think fit, and might from time to time rescind such delegation: And whereas the Governor hath, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, delegated to Isaac Earl Featherston, Esquire, so long as he shall hold the office of Superintendent of the Province of Wellington, the several powers vested in the Governor by the second, fourth, fifth, seventh, ninth, and tenth sections of the said Act, subject to being rescinded, as in the said Act was provided, and subject to the regulations issued by the Governor in Council, on the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, and to any other regulations to be from time to time duly made: And Whereas by Proclamation, issued on or about the seventeenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, certain places were declared infected districts within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Act:—

Now therefore, I, the said Isaac Earl Featherston, by virtue of the powers vested in me in this behalf, do hereby rescind the said Proclamation, in so far as it relates to the Provinces of Canterbury, Marlborough, Nelson, Hawke's Bay, and Taranaki.

A PROCLAMATION

For the Naturalization of certain Persons.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GREY, Knight, Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the "Naturalization Act, 1863," it is enacted that every person who shall be declared to come within the operation of that Act by any Proclamation, to be issued in that behalf by His Excellency the Governor, shall, as from the time in such Proclamation specified, be deemed and taken, until the termination of the next Session of the General Assembly, to be, and to have been from such specified time, a natural-born subject of Her Majesty within the Colony of New Zealand, as fully to all intents and purposes as if his name had been inserted in the Schedule to that Act annexed: Provided always that every such Proclamation shall contain the description, occupation, or calling of every person therein named and his place of residence at the date of such Proclamation:—

Now therefore, I, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the person hereinafter mentioned shall come within the operation of the said Act from the date hereinafter specified, viz:—

HENRY ENDRES,

from the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, native of Bavaria, Publican: residence, New Plymouth, in the Province of Taranaki.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Regulations respecting Delegation of powers to Superintendents under "Diseased Cattle Act, 1861."

G. GREY, Governor.

At the Government House, at Auckland
the fourteenth day of September, 1864.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Warrants under the hand of His Excellency the Governor, bearing date this fourteenth day of September, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, the Governor has, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, delegated to the Superintendents respectively of the Provinces of Auckland, Taranaki, Wellington, Hawke's Bay, Nelson, Marlborough, Canterbury, Otago and Southland, certain powers conferred on him by the "Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," subject to certain Regulations to be made by the Governor in Council under the said recited Act:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, by virtue of the authority given to him by the 14th Section of the above recited Act, doth hereby make and ordain the following Regulations:—

1. The delegation of powers under the said warrants shall continue to be in force for the period of one year from this date, subject to be rescinded according to the provisions of the above recited Act.

2. Each Superintendent shall, immediately after exercising any of the delegated powers, notify the same to the Governor, and he shall transmit to the Governor particulars of all appointments and copies of all Regulations made by him.

3. He shall, so soon as conveniently can be, notify all Regulations made by him to the Colonial Secretary or Chief Secretary of each of the Australian Colonies, and cause the same to be published in England in the *Times* newspaper.

4. In the exercise of powers delegated under the 9th section of the said Act, the Superintendent of any Province, may, either in the first instance, or afterwards, from time to time, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of the Province, except out of any district proclaimed as infected under the said Act, any Port or Place within the limits of such district, and every such excepted Port and Place shall be

deemed not to be within the proclaimed district, and the Superintendent may also from time to time by Proclamation as aforesaid, rescind any Proclamation of an infected district, wholly or as to any part thereof, and also the Proclamation of any such exception as aforesaid.

5. In the exercise of powers delegated under the 10th section of the Act, the Superintendent of any Province may prohibit the importation, either by land or by sea, of cattle into such Province from any other Province, or any particular port or place in any other Province, or across the borders of a Province or any particular part thereof.

6. In all such last-mentioned cases such Superintendent shall cause notice as speedily as possible of such prohibition to be given to the Superintendent of the Province from which the importation shall be prohibited, and also to the Governor.

7. The Superintendent of any Province may in his discretion suspend or forbear to exercise all or any of the powers delegated to him under the said Act.

8. The Superintendent of each Province shall, as soon as can be after the commencement of each sitting of the Provincial Council of such Province, lay before such Council copies and particulars of all the Appointments, Regulations, Acts, and Proceedings whatever, issued, made, or done by him under the delegated powers of the said Act.

9. If the Provincial Council of any Province shall by resolution declare their dissent from all or any of such Appointments, Regulations, Acts, and proceedings, such Resolution shall be forthwith transmitted by the Speaker to the Governor for his consideration.

HIS Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, has been pleased to delegate, under the "Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," to the Superintendents respectively of the Provinces of—

the several powers vested in the Governor by the 2nd, 4th, 5th, 7th, 9th, and 10th sections of the said Act subject to be rescinded as in the said Act provided, and subject to the Regulations contained in the Order in Council of even date herewith.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Savings' Bank Act, 1858," it is enacted that the management of the affairs of every such Bank shall be vested in not less than five, or more

than thirty-six Trustees, who shall be nominated by the Governor, and that such Trustees may from time to time be removed from office and be re-appointed, or others may be appointed in their place. And whereas, in consequence of the absence from the Province of several of the persons who have been appointed Trustees of the Sayings' Bank established at New Plymouth, it is expedient that all the present Trustees should be removed from office, and that those who are resident in the Province and willing to act should re-appoint.

Now therefore, in exercise of the powers in me vested by the said recited Act, I, Sir George Grey, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby remove from the office of Trustee of the Saving's Bank established at New Plymouth, every person who has been appointed Trustee, and who now holds the said office. And I do hereby nominate and re-appoint each of the persons hereinafter named, to be a Trustee of the said Bank, namely:—
