PROCLAMATION.

By His Honor, Charles Brown,
Esquire, Superintendent of
the Province of Taranaki.

WHEREAS by Proclamation dated the 11th day of January, 1865, under the hand of Charles Brown, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Taranaki, the Oakura Block in the said province was declared to be an infected district within the meaning and for the purposes of "The Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," and that from and after the date thereof no cattle on the said Oakura Block should cross the Tapuae river. And whereas it is expedient to revoke such proclamation. Now therefore I, Charles Brown, Esquire, Superintendent of the said Province, in exercise of the powers delegated to me by His Excellency the Governor under the said Act, do hereby revoke the said recited Proclamation of the 11th day of January, 1865.

Given under my hand and issued under the Public Seal of the Province of Taranaki, at New Plymouth, the fifth day of May, 1865.
