*Altering Poundage Fees chargeable under
Impounding Ordinance, 1854.*

IN exercise of the power vested in the Superintendent by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of Taranaki, intituled "An Ordinance to authorise and regulate the Impounding of Cattle, and to provide for the summary recovery of compensation for damage done by Cattle Trespassing," Sess. 1, No. 8, I, HENRY ROBERT RICHMOND, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Taranaki, do hereby notify that, from the date hereof, Poundage Fees according to the following scale shall be charged on all animals impounded in any of the Pounds hitherto appointed under the provisions of the said Ordinance:—

*Constituting 11th District, and appointing
month for General Meetings of the Electors
for the same, and convening a General
Meeting.*

IN exercise of the powers vested in the Superintendent by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of Taranaki, intituled "The Roads and Bridges Ordinance, 1858," I HENRY ROBERT RICHMOND, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Taranaki, do hereby constitute and appoint the Eleventh District as hereunder described to be a district for the purposes of the said Ordinance. And I hereby further appoint that General Meetings of the Electors for the said District shall be held in the month of December, and that the minimum rate for the said District shall be three pence per acre. And I hereby convene a General Meeting of the Electors for the said District to be held on SATURDAY, the 30th December instant, at 4 p.m., at No. 6 Redoubt, Huirangi, for the purpose of Imposing a Rate and Electing Commissioners and Auditors for the ensuing year.

11th District.—All that block of land known as the Huirangi Block bounded as follows, viz. :—Towards the north by a straight line known as the Matarikoriko line running through

Kairau Redoubt, and parallel to the Devon Line towards the east by the Waitara River; towards the south by the Mataitawa Block, and towards the west by the Tarurutangi Block.

PROCLAMATION

*Appointing a Quarantine Ground under
"The Diseased Cattle Act, 1861."*

IN exercise of the authority delegated to Superintendents of Provinces, under the provisions of an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," I, HENRY ROBERT RICHMOND, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Taranaki, do hereby proclaim that the undermentioned place in the Province of Taranaki shall be a Quarantine Ground for the purposes of the said Act, from and after the fifteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five :—

The piece of land being part of allotment marked R on the plan of the town of New Plymouth, bounded on the north by the sea coast, on the east by another part of the said allotment, on the south by Buller-street, and on the west by town allotment No. 1954.

Given under my hand and issued under the public seal of the Province of Taranaki, at New Plymouth aforesaid, this eighteenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five.

*Regulations for the Province of Taranaki,
issued under "The Diseased Cattle Act,
1861," for landing and driving Cattle
imported from districts where infectious
disease is known to prevail, and for the
management of the Quarantine Ground,
and fixing the Fees and Charges thereof,
&c.*

IN exercise of the powers delegated by His Excellency to Superintendents of Provinces under the provisions of "The Diseased Cattle Act, 1861," I, HENRY ROBERT RICHMOND, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Taranaki, do hereby

proclaim and declare the following Regulations to be in force for landing and driving cattle imported from districts where infectious disease is known to prevail, and for the management of the quarantine ground, and for fixing the fees and charges thereof, and the conditions upon which cattle may, in certain cases, be removed therefrom within the full period of fourteen days from their first entering:—

1. No cattle imported from a district which has been declared infected shall be landed unless a certificate or other sufficient proof shall have been produced to the Inspector that they were clean when shipped.

2. Upon the production of such certificate or other proof the Inspector shall examine the cattle on board, and proceed as directed by clause IV. Sections (c) and (d) of the Act.

3. The fee for the use of the quarantine ground shall be two shillings per head.

4. Cattle shall remain in the quarantine ground for a period of not less than forty-eight hours, nor more than fourteen days, and shall whilst there be fed at the expense of their owners.

5. Any person removing, or causing to be removed, any cattle from the quarantine ground, without permission from the Inspector, shall be subject to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds for every head of cattle so removed.

6. On the recommendation of the Inspector, and on a certificate from him (to be called a Removal Certificate) that any cattle in the quarantine ground are free from all visible symptoms of infectious disease, and that a suitable enclosure, to be therein described, has been provided to receive them, the Superintendent may at any time after the expiration of forty-eight hours from their first entering, allow such cattle to be removed to such enclosure, there to remain for the period of one calendar month from the date of such removal; and if any such cattle shall be found during the said period of one month elsewhere than in the said enclosure, unless permission in writing shall have been given by the Inspector to remove them to some other place, the owner thereof shall be subject to a penalty not exceeding five pounds per head for every head of cattle so found.

7. These regulations shall take effect from and after the fifteenth day of December, 1865.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

G. GREY, Governor.

Assent of Natives to certain Reserves under "Native Reserves Act, 1856."

At the Government House, at Wellington, on the nineteenth day of November, 1865.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Native Reserves Amendment Act, 1862," it is amongst other things provided that where, under the provisions of "The Native Reserves Act, 1856," the assent of the aboriginal inhabitants is required to bringing land under the operation of the said "Native Reserves Act, 1856," the Governor may by Order in Council, declare such assent to have been ascertained, and thereupon the title of the aboriginal inhabitants in the land to which the same shall relate shall be deemed to be extinguished, and the land shall, from the date of such Order in Council, vest in her Majesty for the purposes and subject to the provisions of the said "Native Reserves Act, 1856," as altered by the recited Act, and that as effectually as if the same had been ceded and conveyed by such aboriginal inhabitants to her Majesty: Now, therefore, his Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare that the assent of the aboriginal inhabitants to the bringing the pieces of land described in Schedules A and B hereunder written under the operation of "The Native Reserves Act, 1856," has been ascertained.

SCHEDULE A.

All that parcel of land in the Province of Taranaki, Colony of New Zealand, containing by admeasurement one hundred acres, more or less, being part of Native Reserve marked B on the plan of the Waikakaiho District, bounded towards the north by waste land and Native Reserve marked A, two thousand and twenty links; towards the east by waste land, five thousand and seventy links; towards the south by allotment numbered two hundred and four, two thousand and twenty links; and towards the west by the Smart Road, five thousand one hundred links.

SCHEDULE B.

All that parcel of land in the Province of Taranaki, Colony of New Zealand, containing by admeasurement six acres one rood, more or less, being part of the Native Reserve numbered fourteen on the plan of the Fitzroy District, bounded towards the north by the Poti Stream; towards the east by Watson Street, two hundred and five links; towards the south by Lemon Street, one thousand three hundred and eighty-seven links; and towards the west by Hobson Street, five hundred and ten links. And also all that other parcel of land, containing by admeasurement twelve acres, more or less, being part of the same reserve numbered fourteen, bounded towards the north by Lemon Street, one thousand three hundred and eighty-seven links; towards the east by Watson Street, six hundred and thirty links; towards the south by the Uira Stream; and towards the west by Hobson Street, eight hundred and five links.

Warrant abolishing a Principal Polling Place and appointing another in lieu thereof.

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETING :—

WHEREAS by "The Regulation of Elections Act, 1858," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by warrant under his hand, from time to time, to appoint polling places for each electoral district within or without the limits thereof, and to appoint any one of such places to be the principal polling place for the district, and all or any of such polling places at any time to abolish, and to appoint other polling places in lieu thereof.

And whereas by warrant under the hand of the Governor, bearing date the seventeenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, the Court House, in the Town of New Plymouth, was appointed a principal polling place for the Districts of the Town of New Plymouth, Grey and Bell, and Omata, for the election of Superintendent and Members of the Provincial Council of the Province of Taranaki.

And whereas it is expedient to abolish the same :

Now know ye, that I, Sir George Grey, the Governor of the said Colony, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said Act, do hereby abolish the above-named principal polling place for the Districts of the Town of New Plymouth, Grey and Bell, and Omata, for the election of Superintendent and Members of the Provincial Council of the Province of Taranaki, and do appoint in lieu thereof :—

THE following Rules are published for general information :—

The Rules relative to Pay and Allowances to Militia and Volunteers, dated 29th July, 1863, are hereby cancelled, and the following are substituted in lieu thereof :—

"Officers, Non-commissioned Officers, and Privates, of the New Zealand Militia (not on actual service) when called out for enrolment, or for inspection of arms, or for training, and not obliged to leave their homes to be encamped, or when on actual service and in possession of arms, when required to parade periodically for inspection of arms,—will not receive any pay."

The rates of pay when on actual Service in the field or doing garrison duty will be published on a future occasion.
