PROCLAMATION

Enlarging Boundaries under "Thatch and Straw Building Ordinance, 1858."

By THOMAS KELLY, Esquire, Deputy Superintendent of the Province of Taranaki.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of New Plymouth, intituled the "Thatch and Straw Building Ordinance, 1858," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent from time to time by Proclamation in the Government Gazette of the Province, to declare the provisions of the said Ordinance to be in force in any Town, or part of any Town within the said Province; the boundaries whereof respectively shall be defined by such Proclamation: And whereas by Proclamation of George Cutfield, Esquire, Superintendent of the said Province, dated the 9th day of December, 1858, certain boundaries in the Town of New Plymouth were defined, within which the provisions of the said recited Ordinance were proclaimed to be in force: And whereas it is expedient to enlarge such boundaries: Now, therefore, I, Thomas Kelly, Esquire, Deputy Superintendent of the Province of Taranaki, do hereby proclaim and declare the provisions of the said Ordinance to be in force from and after the date hereof within such additional parts of the Town of New Plymouth as are comprised in the Schedules hereunto numbered A, B, and C, respectively, and that on the 15th day of February, 1867, and on the same day in every succeeding year, there shall be levied

in respect of every house, building, shed, stack, or pile, of any description whatever constructed, or composed wholly or in part of raupo, nikau, toetoe, wiwi, kakeho, straw, hay, thatch, or other like inflammable materials situate within the boundaries described in the said Schedules, the sum of £20, and also that if any person shall erect or cause to be erected any building or structure of the descriptions aforesaid, within such boundaries, he shall forfeit and pay for every such offence the sum of £20.

PROCLAMATION

Bringing into operation the "Harbour Trust Ordinance, 1866."

WHEREAS in the Fourteenth Session of the Provincial Council of Taranaki, held in the twenty ninth year of the reign

of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, an Ordinance was passed intituled "An Ordinance to alter the specific purpose for which certain Public Reserves are held in the Town of New Plymouth, and to authorise the Superintendent to borrow money on the same," and whereas the said Ordinance was, on the twentieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, presented to HENRY ROBERT RICHMOND, Esquire, Superintendent of the said Province, for the assent of His Excellency the Governor, and was then reserved by him for the signification of His Excellency's pleasure thereon. And whereas His Excellency has been pleased to assent to the said Ordinance: Now therefore I, THOMAS KELLY, Esquire, Deputy Superintendent of the Province of Taranaki, do hereby proclaim that His Excellency Sir GEORGE GREY, the Governor of New Zealand, has assented to the said Ordinance, and that I received the signification of his Excellency's assent on the fourteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six.

NOTICE is hereby given that a sitting of the Compensation Court will be holden at New Plymouth on the 20th day of September next, for the purpose of hearing and determining the claims of persons to compensation, on account of the taking, under the authority of the "New Zealand Settlements Act, 1863," of the block of land in the Province of Taranaki hereinunder described:—

NGATIWA COAST.

NOTICE is hereby given that a sitting of the Compensation Court will be holden at Wanganui on FRIDAY, the 12th day of October next, for the purpose of hearing and determining the claims of persons to compensation on account of the taking, under the authority of the "New Zealand Settlements Act, 1863," of so much of the Ngatiruanui coast block (hereinunder described) as lies between the Kaipokonui and Wanganui rivers:—

NGATIRUANUI COAST.

Bounded on the north by the river Hangatahua from its mouth to the southern angle of the Oakura district, and thence by a straight line passing between the Pouakai and Patua ranges to the point where a native path passing in the same direction intersects the south-western boundary of the Tapuae (or Omata) block; on the north-east by the said south-west boundary and by the south-east boundary of the said Tapuae block to the river Mangoraka, thence by the said river Mangoraka to its source, thence by a straight line to the summit of Mount Egmont, and thence by a straight line to Parikino and the river Wanganui; on the south-east by the said river Wanganui from Parikino to the sea; and on the south-west by the sea from the mouth of the said river Wanganui to the mouth of the said river Hangatahua.
