## ROADS AND BRIDGES.

### NOTICE

*Constituting No. 19 District under the  
"Roads and Bridges Ordinance, 1858."*

Superintendent's Office,  
New Plymouth, Feb. 5, 1867.

**W**HEREAS by the 2nd clause of the "Roads and Bridges Ordinance, 1858," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent, amongst other things, to constitute Districts within which the provisions of the said Ordinance shall be in force. Provided that no such notice shall at any time be published without the previous approval of the Provincial Council. Now therefore I, HENRY ROBERT RICHMOND, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Taranaki, in exercise of the before recited authority, do hereby, with the approval of the Provincial Council, constitute the undermentioned block of land, known as the Urenui District, to be District No. 19, under the provisions of the said recited Ordinance.

DISTRICT No. 19.

The block of land bounded by the sea beach from the mouth of the Onaero River, to the mouth of the Urenui River; thence by the last named river to the southern boundary line of Rural Section

No. 67; thence by a straight line to the north-east angle of Rural Section No. 74; thence by the eastern boundaries of Rural Sections Nos. 74 and 76 and by the southern boundary of the last mentioned section; thence by a straight line to the north-east angle of Rural Section No. 17; thence by the south-eastern boundary of the last mentioned section; thence by a roadway to the Mangapou stream; thence by the said stream and the Onaero River to the sea beach.

*Appointing a minimum Rate for No. 19

**W**HEREAS by the 13th clause of the "Roads and Bridges Ordinance, 1858," it is provided that the minimum rate to be imposed in any Rural District, shall not be less than 6d. per acre. And whereas by the 49th clause of the said Ordinance, power is given to the Superintendent, with the approval of the Provincial Council, by notice to be published

in the *Government Gazette*, to alter the minimum rate or rates to be imposed in one or more districts. Now therefore I, HENRY ROBERT RICHMOND, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Taranaki, do hereby, with the approval of the Provincial Council, alter the minimum rate of Sixpence to Twopence for the 19th Road District.

## NOTICE

*Revoking previous Regulations, &c., and re-issuing the same with alterations.*

Superintendent's Office,  
New Plymouth, February 4, 1867.

**W**HEREAS by the third section of an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of New Plymouth intituled "An Ordinance to establish and regulate Ferries," passed in the second session of the said Council, it is, amongst other things, provided that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette* of the Province, to fix, alter, or repeal the dues to be taken at any Ferry within the said Province, and to make Regulations for and concerning the management of Ferries in general throughout the said Province, or of particular Ferries. And whereas by the sixth section of the said recited Ordinance it is provided that no such notice shall be published during a session of the Provincial Council without the previous consent of the Provincial Council expressed by a resolution thereof:

Now therefore I, HENRY ROBERT RICHMOND, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Taranaki (formerly New Plymouth) do hereby repeal all previous notices which have been issued for the regulation of Ferries in the said Province and for fixing the dues chargeable thereat, for the purpose of altering the regulations previously published and extending the operation thereof to the Waitara and Urenui Ferries, and also of altering the

dues chargeable at the said Ferries respectively, such extension and alterations having been approved by resolutions of the Provincial Council.

And I hereby declare that the following Regulations shall henceforward extend and apply to the Ferries over the Waiwakaiho, Waitara, and Urenui Rivers on the North road, and that the scales of dues below specified shall be charged at the said Ferries respectively.

*Regulations for the management of the Waiwakaiho, Waitara, and Urenui Ferries.*

*Ferry Keeper.*

The Ferry-keeper or his substitute shall be in constant attendance for the conveyance across the river of passengers, but shall not be required to convey either goods or sheep between dark in the evening and daylight in the morning.

*Ferry Boat.*

The Ferry-boat shall be properly secured by the Ferry-keeper, and kept in a clean and efficient state for use.

*Definition of the words "daylight" and "dark."*

The words daylight and dark where they occur in these regulations and in the following scales of dues shall be taken to mean the hours of 6 a.m. and 7 p.m. respectively during the summer half-year commencing on the 1st October in each year, and 7 a.m. and 6 p.m. respectively during the winter half-year commencing on the 1st April in each year.

*Penalties.*

A penalty not exceeding Forty Shillings will be imposed for each of the following offences:—

For the breach of any of the foregoing Regulations by the Ferry-keeper or his substitute.

For interfering with or injuring the Ferry-boat, or the tackle, or other property belonging thereto.

For making use of the Ferry-boat without the cognisance of the Ferry-keeper (unless the absence of the Ferry-keeper, or his substitute, be satisfactorily proved.)

Provided that in case the damage to the Ferry-boat, or property thereof, exceed the sum of Forty Shillings, the same shall be recoverable at common law instead of under the Ferries Ordinance, Session 2, No. 6.

*Ferry Dues.*

The following charges are authorised to be made for the use of the Waiwakaiho, Waitara, and Urenui Ferries respectively,

and are demandable by the Ferry-keeper or his substitute previously to the service being performed.

*Dues chargeable at the Waiwakaiho Ferry between daylight and dark.*

For each passenger..... Os. 2d.  
 „ every hundred weight of goods Os. 2d.  
 „ any number of sheep not exceeding four..... Os. 4d.  
 „ do. exceeding four, per head... Os. 1d.

*After dark and until 10 p.m.*

For each passenger..... Os. 6d.

*From 10 p.m. until daylight.*

For each passenger..... 1s. 0d.

*Dues chargeable at the Waitara and Urenui Ferries.*

*Between daylight and 10 p.m.*

For each passenger..... Os. 6d.

„ horses or neat cattle (towed), each..... Os. 6d.

„ Calves (carried), each..... Os. 6d.

„ Sheep—

„ not exceeding four, for the whole..... Os. 4d.

„ over four and not exceeding 100 each..... Os. 1d.

„ each sheep above 100..... ½d.

*From 10 p.m. until daylight.*

For each passenger..... 1s. 0d.

*Exemptions from Ferry Dues.*

No charges for the use of the Ferry-boat shall be made at any of the above-named Ferries to

Mailmen,  
 Police on duty,  
 Military on duty.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, the tenth day of January, 1867.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by “The Marine Act, 1866,” it is enacted that the Gover-

nor may, by Order in Council, from time to time, delegate all or any of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Act unto any person or persons, for any period, and subject to any regulations, restrictions, or stipulations which may be specified in such Order, and every such delegation may from time to time alter or revoke:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Grey, Knight Commander of the Bath, the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, do, by this Order, delegate unto

HENRY ROBERT RICHMOND, Esq.,

Superintendent of the Province of Taranaki, such of the powers vested in me as Governor by section seven of the said Act as enable me to erect, superintend, and maintain harbour-marks, lights, and beacons, now or hereafter to be placed within the limits of any port in the Province of Taranaki, or the approaches thereto, subject however to such directions as may from time to time be issued by the Colonial Marine Engineer, as to the size, position, and colour of such harbour-marks, lights, and beacons; and to appoint and suspend or remove Port or Harbour Masters, and other officers of ports or harbours within the Province of Taranaki; and to define and regulate the conduct and duties of Port or Harbour Masters, and other persons employed in carrying out the objects of “The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854,” and of “The Marine Act, 1866,” within the said Province; and also, within the said Province, the powers vested in me by clauses ten, eleven, fifteen, and thirty-seven of the said last-mentioned Act, and the power vested in me by clause sixteen of the said last-mentioned Act, to exempt from pilotage, within all or any of the ports of the Province of Taranaki, such colonial trading vessels trading to the ports of such Province only as to him shall seem proper to be so exempted; to have and exercise the said powers hereby delegated to the said Henry Robert Richmond, Esquire, so long as he shall continue and remain Superintendent of the said Province, and no longer, subject nevertheless to such regulations as may from time to time be made by the Governor in Council under authority of clause fifty-one of the said last-mentioned Act.
