HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The New Zealand Settlements Acts Amendment Act, 1866," it is provided that all lands taken under the authority of "The New Zealand Settlements Act, 1863," and "The New Zealand Settlements Amendment and Continuance Act, 1865," or either of them, and sold and disposed of under the authority of the said first recited Act, intitled "The New Zealand Settlements Acts Amendment Act, 1866," shall be sold or disposed of under regulations to be made by the Governor in Council, which regulations shall be published in the *New Zealand Gazette*:

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in pursuance of the authority vested in him in that behalf by the said first recited Act, doth hereby, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, make the following regulations for the issue of Land Scrip.

1. If any person shall be desirous of making building, or constructing any road, bridge, or other work of public utility, and of being allowed payment in land in respect of the cost of the same, he shall make application in writing

or authority for that purpose to the Commissioner appointed by the Governor, under the regulations for the sale of land taken for settlement under "The New Zealand Settlements Act, 1863."

2. If the Commissioner shall be satisfied, after due investigation and inquiry, that it is desirable that the proposed road, bridge, or other work of public utility shall be made, built, or constructed, and the plans and specification thereof shall be approved by a competent person to be appointed by the Commissioner, the Commissioner may grant authority for the said work to be completed.

3. When the said work is completed, it shall be examined by a competent person to be appointed by the Commissioner; and if such person shall report that the same is constructed in accordance with the plans and specifications, and with proper materials and workmanship, the Honorable the Colonial Secretary, or any person duly deputed by him, shall grant to the person at whose cost the said work has been made, built, or constructed, Land Scrip to the extent of one-half of the value of the work performed, such value to be fixed by some competent person appointed by the Commissioner in that behalf.

4. The Land Scrip so granted shall be deemed and taken to be money for the amount for which the same shall have been issued, and shall be receivable at any time within three months from the date of its issue as payment or part payment for any allotment of General Rural Land open for sale or selection in the district in which the

work or works in respect of which such scrip has been granted may be situate.

5. No greater sum shall be paid in land to any one person under these regulations than three hundred pounds in any one year, nor shall the total sums so to be paid within one year exceed five thousand pounds, except under the direct authority of the Governor in Council.

6. The particulars of every such work, the amount and the position of the land to be given in payment, and the name and residence of every person to whom such land is to be given shall be published in the *General Government Gazette* at least three months before the issue of any grant of the same.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Confiscated Lands Act, 1867," the Governor is empowered to reserve out of lands taken under the New Zealand Settlements Acts, such lands as to him shall seem fit, and thereout to grant such portion thereof as he shall think fit to such person or persons of the Native race as he shall think deserving and shall appear to him to have acted in the preservation of peace and order, and in suppressing rebellion; and further to reserve out of the said lands so taken as aforesaid such lands as to him shall seem fit, and to grant such por-

tions thereof as he shall think fit to such person or persons of the Native race as shall be proved to his satisfaction to have been in rebellion and to have subsequently submitted to the Queen's authority. And whereas certain persons of the tribes of Ngātiawa, Taranaki, Ngatiruanui, and Ngarauru have so acted in preservation of order, and certain others of the said tribe having been in rebellion have submitted to the Queen's authority:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Grey, K.C.B., in exercise of the above recited powers, do hereby proclaim that five per cent, in the value of every rural and suburban block within the districts of Ngatiawa, Middle Taranaki, and Ngatiruanui, before the same is offered for sale shall be reserved for the benefit of such persons of the said tribes of Ngatiawa, Taranaki, Ngatiruanui, and Ngarauru, as were residing in the said districts on the thirtieth of June last, and as the Governor may from time to time appoint.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, the twenty-sixth day of November, 1867.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The New Zealand Settlements Acts Amendment Act, 1866," it is provided that all land to be sold under the provisions of "The New Zealand Settlements Act, 1863," shall be sold for such consideration as the Governor shall from time to time prescribe, and that all lands sold or otherwise disposed of under the said first recited Act, shall be sold or disposed of under Regulations to be made by the Governor in Council, published in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

And whereas by an Order in Council made on the fourth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, and published in *New Zealand Gazette* on the eleventh day of February, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, certain Regulations were made for the sale and disposal of lands taken under "The

New Zealand Settlements Act" within the Districts of Ngatiawa, Middle Taranaki, and Ngatiruanui, as in the said Order in Council are mentioned.

And whereas it is expedient to make a further Regulation in that behalf.

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in pursuance of all powers and authorities vested in him in that behalf, doth hereby, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, make the following additional Regulation for the sale of land taken under "The New Zealand Settlements Act, 1863," in the Districts of Ngatiawa, Middle Taranaki, and Ngatiruanui. that is to say—

Additional Regulation.

At any sale by auction or otherwise of any land within the Province of Taranaki, whether described as rural, suburban, town, or otherwise, to which the Regulations made by Order in Council of the fourth of February, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, apply, unexercised original, rural, or suburban Land Orders, issued by the Plymouth Company of New Zealand, or by the New Zealand Company, and conferring, or purporting to confer on the owner or holder thereof the right to select, according to a fixed and definite order of choice, fifty acres of rural or suburban land respectively, within the Settlement of New Plymouth, shall be considered as equivalent, in the purchase of any such lands as aforesaid, to the amounts following, that is to say—

Now therefore, I, Sir George Grey, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority in me vested, do hereby proclaim and appoint the districts comprised within the boundaries of the Provinces of Taranaki, Otago, and Southland respectively, to be Curators' districts for the purposes of the above-mentioned Acts, and to be respectively called

THE TARANAKI DISTRICT,
THE OTAGO DISTRICT, and
THE SOUTHLAND DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Resident Magistrates' Act, 1867," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, or at any time, by proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to declare that the limit of jurisdiction of the Resident Magistrate's Court of any district shall be extended to fifty pounds, or to one hundred pounds, as he may think proper, and thereupon such Court shall have power to hear and determine any case in which the amount of the debt or damage claimed shall not exceed the limit fixed by such proclamation, and which might have been lawfully tried in such Court, in case the amount of the debt or damage claimed therein had not exceeded twenty pounds.

And whereas the district specified in the first and second Schedule hereto were by proclamation dated twenty-ninth day of November last, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the twenty-first day of December last, constituted Resident Magistrates' Districts with such boundaries as in the said proclamation are defined. And whereas it is expedient that the jurisdiction of the Resident Magistrates' Court within the districts mentioned in the first Schedule hereto should be extended to the limit of one hundred pounds, and the jurisdiction of the Resident Magistrates' Courts within the district mentioned in the second Schedule hereto should be extended to fifty pounds:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Grey, K.C.B., the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority in me vested in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the limit of jurisdiction of the Resident Magistrates' Court of such of the said districts so constituted as aforesaid as are specified in the Schedule hereto shall from and after the twenty-second day of January instant be extended to one hundred pounds; and I do further proclaim and declare that the limit of jurisdiction of the Resident Magistrates' Courts of such of the said districts so constituted as aforesaid as are specified in the second Schedule hereto, shall from and after the same date, be extended to fifty pounds.

THE PRESIDENT AND MEMBERS OF THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Marine Act, 1867," it is enacted that the Governor may by Order in Council, from time to time, delegate all or any of the powers and authorities vested in him by the said Act, unto any person or persons, for any period, and subject to any regulations, restrictions, or stipulations which may be specified in such Order, and every such delegation may from time to time alter or revoke, and also that any such delegation may be so made to any person holding office in or under the General Government of New Zealand, or in or under any Provincial Government thereof, by the title of his office, and may be therein expressed to be made to such officer, and his successors in such office, and when so expressed to be made, the powers and authorities thereby delegated shall from time to time, until revocation thereof, be held and exercised, only by the person for the time being holding such office and no other person :

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony, doth hereby delegate unto each of the Collectors of Customs at the Ports of Auckland, New Plymouth, Wellington, Napier, Nelson, Blenheim, Lyttleton, Dunedin, and Invercargill, and his successors in office, the powers conferred on the Governor by section eighteen of the said Act to exempt from pilotage such colonial trading vessels as to such Collector for the time being shall seem proper to be so exempted in all cases in which such vessels require to be exempted for the ports of the Province only in which such Collector for the time being is stationed : the fees received for any pilotage exemptions to be accounted for and treated as pilotage dues.

And whereas by an Act intituled "The New Zealand Settlements Act Amendment Act, 1866," it is provided that all lands sold or otherwise disposed of under the above-mentioned Acts shall be sold or disposed of under regulations to be made by the Governor in Council, which regulations shall be published in the *New Zealand Gazette*. And whereas by an Order in Council made on the fourth day of February, 1867, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the eleventh day of February, 1867, certain regulations were made for the sale and disposal of lands taken under "The New Zealand Settlements Act, 1863," within the districts of Ngatiawa and Middle Taranaki, as in the said Order in Council are mentioned. And whereas it is expedient that the first regulation in the schedule to the said Order in Council, by which certain town allotments within the Township of Raleigh, are appropriated in part fulfilment of certain agreements therein mentioned should be cancelled, and that other regulations should be made in lieu thereof :

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in pursuance of all powers and authorities vested in him in this behalf, doth hereby, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, cancel the first regulation as aforesaid, and doth make the following regulation to be construed and read with and form part of the said regulations published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the eleventh day of February last:
