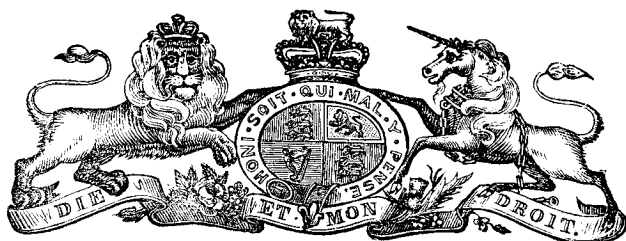

ROADS AND BRIDGES.

Notice fixing the Minimum Rates and altering the month for General Meetings, and appointing General Meetings of the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th, 7th, 8th, 9th, 10th, 11th, 12th, 13th, 14th, 15th, 16th, 17th, 19th, 20th, 21st, and 22nd Districts.

WHEREAS by the 49th Clause of the "Roads and Bridges Ordinance, 1858," power is given to the Superintendent, with the approval of the Provincial Council, by notice to be published in the Government Gazette, to alter the minimum Rate to be imposed in any District. Now therefore I, GEORGE CUTFIELD, Esquire, Deputy Superintendent of the Province of Taranaki, do hereby, with the approval of the Provincial Council, appoint that the minimum rate to be imposed in all the Districts hitherto constituted under the above recited Ordinance shall be Twopence per acre, excepting in Districts 10, 14, 16, and 18, in which the minimum Rate shall be one penny per acre. And I hereby further appoint that General Meetings of Ratepayers in the said districts shall be held in the month of August next ensuing, as follows:—

Altering Boundaries of the 11th (Huirangi), 14th (Tikorangi), 15th (Oakura), 16th (Okato), 18th (Pukeruahe), 19th (Urenui), 21st (Mataitawa) Road Districts.

WHEREAS by the second clause of the "Roads and Bridges Ordinance, 1858," power is given to the Superintendent, by notice to be published in the *Government Gazette* of the Province, with the approval of the Provincial Council, to alter the boundaries of any road district constituted under the said recited Ordinance. Now therefore I, GEORGE CUTFIELD, Esquire, Deputy Superintendent of the Province of Taranaki, do hereby, with the approval of the Provincial Council, make the following alterations in the boundaries of the 11th, 14th, 15th, 16th, 18th, 19th, and 21st Road Districts, namely, that the several townships hereinafter more particularly described, and hitherto included in the said Rural Districts, shall no longer form part of the above recited Road Districts.

21ST DISTRICT :

The Townships of Mataitawa and Manganui.
