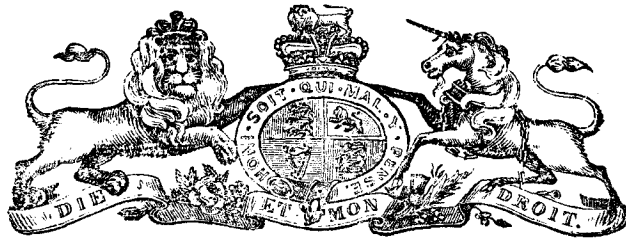

NOTICE.

Harbour Office,

New Plymouth, January 31, 1871.

IN accordance with the provisions of the 39th clause of the third section of the Harbour Regulations of New Zealand, empowering the Harbour Master to take such means as he may deem necessary to prevent accidents, &c., alongside vessels, the following directions are hereby published, and will be strictly enforced:—

On the arrival of any vessel in the Port, no boat shall be permitted to go seaward of the outhaul buoy until the vessel is properly secured by one anchor.

When any vessel arrives while boats are working a first arrival, no boat shall approach such second or third ship, as the case may be, within two hundred yards, until she is properly secured by one anchor and permission given by the master to go alongside.

No person employed in working the boats shall be permitted to go on board any vessel without permission of the master or officer in charge (the master of the boat excepted).

Any boat performing Government duty to be exempt from these rules, so long as the said boat performs Government duty only, and no other.

All boats when laden in fine weather shall have three clear planks above water amidships; in rough weather not less than four clear planks amidships, in which case double fares may be charged.

A ball will be hoisted from the flagstaff half topmast high, when bad weather fares or loads will be required.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The Resident Magistrates Act, 1861," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, at any time to abolish the extended jurisdiction which he is by the said Act authorised to confer upon any Resident Magistrate's Court: And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the twentieth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, the limit of jurisdiction of the Resident Magistrate's Court hereinafter mentioned was extended to one hundred pounds: And whereas it is expedient to abolish the extended jurisdiction given to the said Court by the said Proclamation:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, do hereby, in pursuance of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, proclaim and declare that, on and after the fifteenth day of December next, the extended jurisdiction so given as aforesaid to the Resident Magistrate's Court for

The New Plymouth District, shall be abolished.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by "The District Courts Act, 1858," it is enacted that there shall be within the Colony of New Zealand Courts of Record, possessing Civil and Criminal jurisdiction, to be called District Courts, and the Governor is empowered from time to time, as he shall think fit, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to constitute throughout the Colony, or in any part thereof, districts within which such Courts shall be respectively held, and such districts to

abolish, and the boundaries thereof to define or alter, and also to declare by what local name such Courts shall be designated:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of the said Colony, in pursuance and exercise of the aforesaid power and authority, do hereby constitute and proclaim the district of the said Colony hereinafter described or referred to, to be a district within which a District Court shall be held under the said Act and under "The District Courts Act Amendment Act, 1865."

And in further pursuance and exercise of the authority aforesaid, I do hereby declare that the said Court shall be designated by the name hereunder specified, that is to say—

Designation of Court:

"The District Court of Taranaki."

Description of District:

"The Taranaki District" shall comprise the whole of the Province of Taranaki.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The District Courts Jurisdiction Extension Act, 1866," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Proclamation published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to bring into operation with respect to any District Court, from and after a day to be named in such Proclamation, either the whole of the said Act or such sections thereof as to him may seem fit:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority vested in me for this purpose, do hereby proclaim and declare that on the fifteenth day of

December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, the said "District Courts Jurisdiction Extension Act, 1866," shall come into operation with respect to

"The District Court of Taranaki."

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The District Courts Criminal Jurisdiction Extension Act, 1870," it is enacted that the Governor may, by Proclamation, from time to time declare that any District Court shall have cognizance of all felonies and indictable misdemeanours, as specified in the fourth section of the said Act:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power vested in me by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that

The District Court of Taranaki

shall henceforth have cognizance of all felonies and indictable misdemeanours committed before or after the passing of the said Act within the district over which its jurisdiction extends, saving only the felonies specially excepted in and by the fourth clause of the said Act.

Given under the hand of His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same; and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, at Wellington, this thirtieth day of November, in

the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy.

WHEREAS by "The District Courts Act, 1858," it is provided that there shall be within the Colony Courts of Record, to be called District Courts, and the Governor is empowered, from time to time, by notification in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to fix the times and places within the district at which every such Court shall be held: And whereas by "The District Courts Act Amendment Act, 1865," it is provided that as to the times of the holding of such Courts it shall be sufficient for the Governor, if he shall so think fit, to fix the interval only within which such Courts shall be held at each place; and it shall in such case be lawful for the Judge of such Court to fix the particular times and days for the holding of such Courts in the manner and subject to the provisions therein contained:

Now therefore, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby in pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, fix that Sessions of the District Court of Taranaki for civil and criminal business shall be held in the Resident Magistrate's Court House, at New Plymouth, in the Province of Taranaki, in every year, at intervals of not less than six nor more than seventeen days between the first day of each sitting.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The District Courts Act Amendment Act, 1865," it is enacted that the powers conferred on Judges of District Courts in and by the twenty-fifth, twenty-sixth, and twenty-seventh sections of "The District Courts Act, 1858," shall be exercised only within such districts as shall from time to time be named by the Governor, by Order in Council published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, as districts within which such powers may be exercised :

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the power and authority so vested in him as aforesaid, doth, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, name and appoint the district consisting of the Province of Taranaki as a district within which the Judge of the District Court of Taranaki may exercise the powers conferred by the twenty-fifth, twenty-sixth, and twenty-seventh sections of "The District Courts Act, 1858."

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS power is vested in the Governor of New Zealand by Proclamation to declare any house, building, enclosure, or place to be a Public Gaol :

to be a Public Gaol.
